MOTION FOR CONFIDENTIAL TREATMENT

1. Navitas KY NG, LLC (“Navitas”), by counsel, hereby moves the Kentucky Public Service Commission (the “Commission”), pursuant to KRS 61.878 and 807 KAR 5:001 Section 13, to grant confidential protection to certain documents provided in connection with its response to Commission Staff’s Second Request for Information in the above-styled matter. The information for which Navitas seeks confidential protection consists of requested pricing information for natural gas charged by third-party suppliers (collectively, the “Confidential Information”), and it reflects business transactions of private parties in a competitive marketplace. In light of these facts, Navitas requests that the Confidential Information remain unavailable to the general public, as contemplated by 807 KAR 5:001 Section 13(2)(a)(3)b.

2. Copies of the Confidential Information, marked “CONFIDENTIAL”, are submitted concurrently with this motion by email to PSCED@ky.gov with a read receipt. Also concurrently with this motion, Navitas is filing in the public docket a copy of its data request responses with the Confidential Information redacted.

3. If and to the extent a Confidential Information becomes publicly available because it is no longer competitively sensitive, Navitas will inform the Commission in writing and have its confidential status removed. 807 KAR 5:001 Section 13(10)(b).

I. Discussion

4. The Confidential Information is entitled to confidential treatment pursuant to KRS 61.878(1)(c)(1), which protects “records confidentially disclosed to an agency or required by an agency to be disclosed to it, generally recognized as confidential or proprietary, which if openly disclosed would permit an unfair commercial advantage to competitors of the entity that disclosed the records.” 807 KAR 5:001 Section 13(2)(a)(1).

5. As noted above, the Confidential Information includes sensitive pricing information shared between private parties, and it is retained by Navitas as confidential business information. If potential competitors or other suppliers enjoyed ongoing, unrestricted access to the Confidential Information, Navitas’s ability to fairly negotiate terms with counterparties in the marketplace would be negatively impacted. Indeed, the public disclosure of the Confidential Information will inevitably inure to the benefit of Navitas’s potential counterparties and competitors, which would gain valuable, non-public information about Navitas’s business. Information such as this is generally recognized as confidential or proprietary.¹

6. The Confidential Information is not publicly available, is not disseminated within Navitas except to those employees and professionals with a legitimate business need to know and

act upon the information, and is not disseminated to others without a legitimate need to know and act upon the information.

II. Time Period

7. Navitas requests that the Confidential Information remain confidential for a period of five (5) years, as the public disclosure of the proprietary and confidential information contained in the Confidential Information could be used to the Navitas' competitive disadvantage through that time. After the expiration of this period, it appears likely the information in the pertinent Confidential Information will be sufficiently dated as to no longer present risk to Navitas.

III. Conclusion

8. Based on the foregoing, the Confidential Information is entitled to confidential protection. If the Commission disagrees, then the Commission should hold an evidentiary hearing to protect Navitas's due process rights and to supply the Commission with a complete record to enable it to reach a decision with regard to this matter. *See Utility Regulatory Com'n v. Kentucky Water Service Co., Inc.*, 642 S.W.2d 591 (Ky. App. 1982).

WHEREFORE, Navitas respectfully requests that the Commission classify and protect as confidential the Confidential Information.
