Request 1. Refer to the Application, Exhibit D., Direct Testimony of Jerry Patrick (Patrick Testimony) on page 3, lines 7 and 8,

- a) Provide a copy of the three leases that are about to expire.
- b) Confirm the expiration date of the three leases that are about to expire.

Response 1a. Rowan Water Inc. ("Rowan Water") provided the leases for the three leases referred to in the Application to this matter at Exhibit D, pages 51-62.

Response 1b. The leases held for the trucks at issue contain the contracted amount of miles and specifications of the trucks, which are the issues prompting the request for lease approval including:

- a) Truck 109, lease at Application, Exhibit C, p 57 was at the contracted amount of 80,000 miles and over that amount at the time of this filing;
- b) Truck 103, lease at Application, Exhibit C, p 54, is being traded in for a truck with a dump bed; and
- c) Truck 106, lease at Application, Exhibit C, p 60, is at approximately 60,000 miles, so it is nearing the contracted amount of 80,000 miles in its lease.

replacing these vehicles now if their leasing term is for 60 months.

Response 3.

Refer to the Responses given to Request 1(b). In addition to that information regarding

the mileage nearing its contracted amount for two of the trucks and the fact that a truck

with a dump bed can now be obtained, if Rowan Water trades in the trucks now, it gets a

higher return on the used trucks. With a higher return, the new trucks are much cheaper,

and the newer the vehicles, the less the maintenance costs will be. The over-all effect

will be keeping the fleet well-appointed with vehicles to perform the work needed for the

utility at the best rates for the finances.
