commission gets a crack at crafting a congressional map if Ohio lawmakers can't agree on a plan. Voters overwhelmingly approved this process in 2018, but even GOP Gov. Mike DeWine now says Ohio's redistricting approach is flawed.

"People thought it was going to work. It had bipartisan support, but it just didn't work," DeWine said in January.

Ohio Issue 1 on the ballot this November would replace that process with a 15-member commission of five independents and five members from each of the two major parties, currently Republicans and Democrats. Elected officials, lobbyists, political consultants and political candidates could not apply. (DeWine says there are problems with this approach, too, and is voting no on Issue 1.)

Ohio Senate GOP spokesman John Fortney defended Ohio's congressional map as "the most compact communities of interest in the history of Ohio." Matt Dole, spokesman for the No on Issue 1 campaign Ohio Works, said Issue 1 is "the solution to my problems with Ohio's current redistricting."

"We believe very strongly that the reforms adopted by over 70% of Ohioans - twice - should be given time to work or not," said Dole, referencing 2015 and 2018 votes on state legislative and congressional redistricting. "The answer, if change is needed, is more reform, not a ballot measure funded by out-of-state special interests that blows up the current system by drastically reducing the accountability of mapmakers to voters and enshrining gerrymandering in the Ohio Constitution."

Here are a few examples of what the current congressional map looks like:

Warren County paired with Cincinnati

As Democrats won more elections in Hamilton County, Republican Rep. Steve Chabot need insurance to hold on to the 1st congressional district in Southwest Ohio. Chabot had served the area from 1994 until 2008 when he lost to Democrat Steve Driehaus as President Barack Obama won the state.

Chabot won back the seat in 2010 and the following year, Republicans expanded his Hamilton County district to include Warren County, home to Kings Island. It's a GOP stronghold that picked a Democratic presidential candidate just once since the 1850s.

"Thanks to great state representation, Warren County came into my district," Chabot said in 2018. "The Democrats run the vote up in the city part of the district. We have to run up our votes in the county portion."

Chabot lost in 2022 to Democrat Greg Landsman, then a member of Cincinnati City Council. In a new district that included the entire city of Cincinnati, new redistricting rules approved by voters in 2018 prevented lawmakers from dividing the city into two congressional districts, a maneuver that had benefited Republicans in the past.

But Landsman's district will lump together Cincinnati and Warren

County - despite their different politics (Cincinnati's Hamilton County backed President Joe Biden in 2020 as Warren County voted for former President Donald Trump), median household incomes (\$49,391 in Cincinnati versus \$103,128 in Warren County) and demographics (50.4% white in Cincinnati to 86% white in Warren County).

"You're really talking about two places with very little in common economically, culturally and politically," said David Niven, a University of Cincinnati associate professor, former Democratic legislator and co-author of the League of Women Voters' report. "How is a member of Congress to rationally represent this district that is built on contradictory realities?"

Fortney, the Senate GOP spokesman, said the congressional map would be worse if Issue 1 passed. The measure would "dice and dice districts multiple times" rather than keep Ohio's most populous cities whole.

"The Political Outcomes Over People campaign must be getting desperate if the League of Liberal Disinformation is throwing a tantrum about districts its so-called friends don't like," Fortney said.

A divided Delaware County

Ohio's congressional map splits Delaware County, just north of Columbus. Into two congressional districts. The 12th congressional district represented by Republican Rep. Troy Bakerson extends from eastern Delaware County to Athens County on the West Virginia border. The 4th congressional district represented by Republican Rep. Jim Jordan stretches from western Delaware County nearly to Indiana.

Delaware County ranks among the top of the kinds of lists counties like to be on. It's the wealthiest county in the state with the most college graduates and the highest percentage of residents with health insurance.

In contrast, Athens, Morgan and Perry counties in the 12th congressional district are among the poorest in the state. Holmes County, with a substantial Amish population, has the lowest rate of insured residents.

"Delaware County is a very wealthy place with a very different set of political needs than Holmes County," Niven said. "The reason why they are in the same congressional district is to try to keep the general blue tint of central Ohio from electing any more (Democratic) members of Congress."

But what does the status quo look like? Ohio's current congressional map includes a district that pairs red Warren County with blue Cincinnati. It features a central Ohio district that combines half of the state's richest county with some of its poorest. It divides the village of Gnadenhutten, population 1,200, into two congressional districts, according to a review from the League of Women Voters of Ohio, which has endorsed and donated to Issue 1.

Politically, the growth of Columbus Democratic suburbs has made Delaware County less red than it used to be. About 52% of Delaware County voters backed Trump in 2020 compared to 66% who supported former President George W. Bush in 2000.

Andrea Yagoda, a retired attorney and registered Democrat, said mapmakers split Delaware County to dilute Democratic votes there. Instead, they could have grouped Delaware County with parts of Franklin County.

"We have a lot more in common with Franklin County. A lot of us work in Franklin County. We have family in Franklin County. We do cultural stuff in Franklin County," Yagoda said. "They really grouped us with people that we have no common interests with."

Yagoda lives in the half of Delaware County represented by Jordan. She leaves messages for her congressman but never hears back. Jordan's offices are at least an hour away in Lima and Mansfield.

Democrats don't have a shot in these districts, which can breed apathy

"City of Champions" for the number of professional football and basketball players raised there. The city of more than 32,000 residents is divided between the 6th congressional district, represented by Salem Republican Michael Ruffi, and the 17th congressional district represented by Akron Democrat Emilia Sykes.

The split divides Massillon's Black community, which represents about 71% of the city, said. "You have an African American community in Massillon that has a common identity, a common interest and they were divided into two separate districts."

Ohio's current redistricting rules protect most of the state's largest cities from being divided. But there are no similar protections for places like Massillon or smaller.

"There's no way town is so small it would be absurd to divide it between congressional districts rule, under the current Ohio standards," Niven said.

While the lines have to go somewhere, these illogical divisions can confuse voters, Niven said.

"When you start dividing neighborhoods and streets, we know what happens. People get confused about who their member of Congress is," Niven said. "There's a real cost to be paid in places that got diced up."

Late field goal pushes Bills past Jets in AFC East battle

Tyler Bass kicked a 22-yard field goal with 3:43 left and Aaron Johnson made a game-clinching interception as the Buffalo Bills notched a 23-20 victory over the New York Jets on Monday night at East Rutherford, N.J.

Josh Allen was 19-of-25 passing for 215 yards and two touchdown passes and also tackled on a rushing score for Buffalo (4-2), which halted a two-game losing streak. Ray Davis rushed for 97 yards for the Bills while playing in place of James Cook (toe).

Aaron Rodgers completed 23 of 35 passes for 294 yards, two touchdowns and one interception for New York (2-4). One of Rodgers' touchdowns was a 52-yard "Hail Mary" score to Allen Lazard to end the first half.

The contest was the first for the Jets under interim coach Jeff Ulbrich. New York dismissed Robert Saleh on Tuesday.

Breece Hall totaled a season-high 169 scrimmage yards (113 rushing, 56 receiving) for the Jets. Garrett Wilson had eight and a touchdown and Lazard made six catches for 114 yards.

Buffalo drove 64 yards on 11 plays to set up Bass' tie-breaking field goal. Johnson then intercepted Rodgers' third-down throw at the Bills' 18-yard line with 1:52 to play.

Allen ran for a key first down to help the Bills run out the clock.

New York's Greg Zuerlein twice missed field goals in the second half by hitting the left upright.

Buffalo led 20-10 near the end of the first half when Rodgers dropped back and tossed a long throw toward the end zone. A pack of Bills were nearby, but Lazard was able to make the 52-yard scoring catch with no time remaining.

The Jets later tied the score at 20 on Zuerlein's 22-yard field goal with 6:13 left in the third quarter.

But Zuerlein clanked a 32-yard field goal off the left upright with 55 seconds remaining in the period.

Then he hit the left upright from 43 yards out with 9:44 left in the contest.

Zuerlein started the game's scoring with a 34-yard field goal on New York's initial drive.

Less than five minutes later, Allen scored from the 1 for Buffalo with 6:12 left in the quarter. Rodgers hit Wilson on a 5-yard score four-plus minutes later as the Jets took a 10-7 edge.

Allen threw second-quarter touchdown passes of 8 yards to Mack Hollins and 12 yards to Dawson Knox. Bass was way wide to the left while missing the extra point after the first of those scores.

Both teams were penalized 11 times — New York for 110 yards and the Bills for 94.
