





Several top acts skipped Heritage Bank Center

What do Blink-182, Elton John and rapper Machine Gun Kelly have in common?

They skipped Cincinnati in 2022 and 2023 in favor of nearby cities with bigger and better arenas, according to a study led by the Cincinnati USA Chamber showing the costs and benefits of a new arena.

Business leaders who have pushed for a new arena have claimed top acts pass over Cincinnati in favor of cities with better and bigger arenas.

The 49-year-old Heritage Bank Center along the Ohio River Downtown doesn't meet the needs of many touring acts, proponents of a new arena have said.

The chamber study listed acts that sold at least 13,000 tickets and performed in at least two regional peer cities but not at Heritage Bank Center.

Some on the list, however, did perform in other venues in Cincinnati in the recent past, including singer Pink, who played Great American Ball Park in July 2023. Rapper Machine Gun Kelly also performed in Cincinnati at the Andrew J. Brady Music Center in September 2021.

In its report, the chamber listed:

- Blink-182, who played Pittsburgh and Cleveland in May 2023.
- Cody Johnson, who played Louisville in February 2023 and Pittsburgh in October 2023.
- Elton John, who played Indianapolis, Columbus, Lexington and Louisville in April 2022.
 - Jack Harlow, who played Louisville in December

Why isn't Heritage Bank Center a viable option?

At 4.17 acres, experts found this site is too compact. The surrounding boundaries of the Taylor Southgate Bridge and Great American Ball Park are not negotiable, and a new or renovated arena would require building over Mehring Way and Pete Rose Way, which is expensive and creates a tunnel-like feel over the streets. Like the existing arena, the floodplain would force the public space to be elevated and inaccessible from the street.

Estimated site premium: \$70 million for a replacement arena.

Here's what else you need to know

The study does not cite a timeline for construction or plans for the design. Last year, a preliminary report from Visit Cincy, the region's tourism bureau, detailed a list of eight possible locations for the project, as well as a tentative plan for completing the arena by mid-2028.

Additionally, the study acknowledges that Heritage Bank Center, the Cincinnati Cyclones, and the organization that owns them, Nederlander Entertainment, have been positive assets to Cincinnati and The Banks riverfront development. If a new arena were built somewhere else, a plan must be in place to address the existing one.

"What we did hear from stakeholders was that if the arena were not there, there are other uses for that site that would still be additive to what's happening in Downtown," Cull said.

The study also notes Nederlander has shown interest in partnering on a new arena, which means the Cyclones could still serve as a major tenant.

Major players in Cincinnati's regional growth and development shared feedback on the study including Cincinnati Center City Development Corp., Hamilton County, Warren County, the Cincinnati Business Committee, the African American Chamber, the Cincinnati Bengals, FC Cincinnati, Live Nation, the University of Cincinnati, Duke Energy and the Cincinnati Arts Association, among others.

distribute all the instruments in the spring after the victims' most pressing needs, such as access to food, water and health care are met.

Johnathon got the idea for an instrument drive in 2021 after deadly tornadoes tore through western Kentucky. Musicians and students in the region lost their instruments. The result was WoodSongs' first instrument drive.

That drive led to approximately 1,000 instrument donations. Once the instruments were collected, they were loaded onto trucks and driven to the affected areas, where they were then distributed to locals free of charge. Jonathan said the response from communities was overwhelming.

"It was amazing," he said. "I mean, hundreds of people lined up, you know, looking for banjos and guitars and flutes and trumpets."

A year later, floods devastated several communities in southeastern Kentucky. Once again, Johnathon and WoodSongs were there to help with another instrument drive. That drive, too, garnered around 1,000 donations.

"The floods hit Appalachia about a year and a half later, and we did the same thing to restore the music of the front porches of the Appalachian Mountains and the musicians of the region," Johnathon said.

After Hurricane Helene, Johnathon and WoodSongs were asked if they could help. He was happy to oblige.

Paul Finke, president of Willis Music, said he was happy to use the company's facilities to help. "It was easy for us to help," Finke said. "It's just, you know, musicians helping musicians."

Like Johnathon, Finke said music can convey positivity and togetherness in times of sorrow. Reconnecting musicians with lost instruments is a unique way to demonstrate the power of music.

"For some, it could bring comfort," Finke said. "For some, it brings true happiness – and that's playing alone. Then you've got two or three people sitting on the front porch playing together. Then you can generate all kinds of great, great emotions. It helps you forget the disaster for a little bit. It helps you escape from it."
