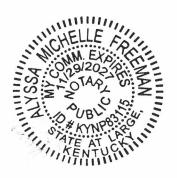

Question No. 4-1

- Q 4-1. Refer to the Application, Exhibit 8, Statement of Adjusted Operations and Revenue Requirement calculation.
 - a. Explain why Miscellaneous Non-Utility Income was included as part of Total Operating and Maintenance Expenses.
 - b. Explain why Unrealized (Gain)/Loss on Investments was included as part of Total Operating and Maintenance Expenses.
 - c. Explain why Rate Case Expense was not included as part of Total Operation and Maintenance Expenses.

A 4-1.

4-1a. On Warren District's monthly financial statements, Miscellaneous Non-Utility Income is included in Other Expenses. Likewise, Warren District's audit report filed with the Commission includes Miscellaneous Non-Utility Income in Non-Operating Expense, and Warren District's annual report filed with the Commission includes Miscellaneous Non-Utility Income in Other Income & Deductions.

In the Application Exhibit 8, Statement of Adjusted Operations ("SAO"), Warren District's rate consultant included Non-Utility Income

of \$(11,001) in the Operation and Maintenance Expense test year which is not consistent with Warren District's monthly financial statements. However, the Non-Utility Income amount of \$(11,001) was adjusted from Operation & Maintenance Expense and added to the Revenue Requirements section in the SAO for same amount.

4-1b. On Warren District's monthly financial statements, Unrealized (Gain)/Loss on Investments is included in Other Expenses. Likewise, Warren District's audit report and annual report filed with the Commission include Unrealized (Gain)/Loss on Investments in Non-Operating Expenses and Other Income & Deductions, respectively.

In the Application Exhibit 8, SAO, Warren District's rate consultant included Unrealized (Gain)/Loss on Investments of \$3,996 in the Operation and Maintenance Expense test year which is not consistent with Warren District's monthly financial statements.

4-1c. In the application Exhibit 8, SAO, Warren District did not include Rate Case Expense as part of Total Operation and Maintenance Expense since no rate case expenses were incurred in the test year. Instead, the estimated legal, engineering, and publication costs of \$64,495 were reported separately in the Revenue Requirements section of the SAO under Reference M. An analysis of rate case costs incurred through

November 27, 2024, was filed with the Commission on November 27, 2024, as Warren District's Third Supplemental Response to Staff's First Request for Information.

A 4-3.

- **4-3a.** Confirmed. The Transpark 2 Tank is now in service.
- **4-3b.** As of December 4, 2024, the Water Division portion of the SCADA Project is **80 percent** complete. Warren District will commence depreciating **\$1,506,153** (Total Cost of \$1,882,691 x 80% = \$1,506,153) as of January 1, 2025. Because the remainder of the Project is very labor intensive, the expected

completion date of the remaining portion of the Project is December 31, 2025.

4-3c. On February 29, 2024, Warren District signed an agreement with Advanced Utility Systems to upgrade its billing system, CIS Infinity, to Version 5. Because of delays on the part of Advanced Utility Systems, the implementation has been delayed and is now scheduled to begin in February 2025 with completion in February 2026. The projected depreciation expense associated with the CIS Infinity upgrade should be removed from Warren District's Revenue Requirement.

- A 4-4. The scholarship fund of \$2,000 was included in the revenue requirement and reported in line-item Contractual Services Other on the Statement of Adjusted Operations by error. Warren District is **not** seeking to recover the amount spent on the scholarship fund in its rates for water service.

The scholarship program has been in place for 10 years and any high school senior whose parent or guardian is a customer of Warren District may apply. Scholarship applications are evaluated each year by the College Heights Foundation at Western Kentucky University (the "Foundation") and the Foundation selects one recipient based on its criteria. The annual amount of the scholarship is \$1,000 and it is renewable for up to four years as long as the student meets the requirements established by the Foundation. The

amount Warren District spends on the scholarship fluctuates as students participating in the program graduate from college and new students apply. In 2023, Warren District spent \$2,000 to fund the scholarship program. Warren District awards this scholarship to demonstrate its commitment to the future of the community in which it operates, but it is **not** seeking to recover the cost in its rates to customers based upon Commission precedent.

- Q 4-6. Refer to Warren District's response to Staff's First Request, Item 1, Attachment 1-1C at 42. Explain what the error was for the lawsuit served on Mr. Cuarta.
- A 4-6. Warren District's February 21, 2023 Board of Commissioners Meeting Minutes contained the following update: "Mr. Moore reported that Mr. Cuarta was served with a lawsuit from the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet for a condemnation action on a right of way easement on Russellville Road. This was an error."

The referenced lawsuit is Warren Circuit Court Case No. 23-CI-00033. In that case, the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Transportation Cabinet, Department of Highways ("Transportation Cabinet") filed a petition to condemn a portion of land situated in Warren County and named as respondents all parties with a possible interest in or to the property to be condemned. Warren District was named as a respondent in the lawsuit, and subsequently served a summons, because Warren District has held an

easement upon the property which the Transportation Cabinet sought to condemn since 1993.

However, Warren District was dismissed from the condemnation action by an Agreed Order entered by the Warren Circuit Court Judge on June 2, 2023, because Warren District determined that its easement was not affected by the Transportation Cabinet's condemnation action, Warren District had no interest in the Transportation Cabinet's proposed condemnation, and Warren District did not seek to receive any part of the compensation to be paid as a result of the condemnation action. As such, the Transportation Cabinet and Warren District agreed to dismiss Warren District from the case.

 - c. State whether Warren District employees working online locates for fiber optics are being paid by Warren District or by Charter Communications through an agreement.
 - d. Provide a list of any expenses that Warren District has incurred related to the installation of fiber optics.

A 4-7.

4-7a. There are **no** contracts or agreements between Warren District and Charter Communication involving fiber installation. It appears there may be a misunderstanding about the relationship between Warren District and Charter Communications, which Warren District will attempt to clarify with this Response.

In 2023, Charter Communications (Spectrum) initiated a large-scale project to install fiber-optic lines throughout Warren, Simpson, and Butler Counties using American Rescue Plan Act funding. This project did not involve installing fiber-optic lines in or on Warren District's water lines. However, during this process, Charter Communications' contractors frequently caused operational challenges for Warren County Water District. Specifically, Charter Communications activities impacted Warren District's ability to manage infrastructure effectively and protect water services for the District's customers. Below is a detailed account of the situation and the actions taken by the District to mitigate potential issues:

Issue Overview

1. Frequent Water Line Damage

Struck Warren District's water lines and mains during fiber installation activities, posing risks of service disruption to water customers.

2. Excessive and Uncoordinated Locate Requests

- Charter Communications' contractors frequently called in excessive locate requests, at times covering up to 20,000 linear feet daily.
- These locate requests included areas where no immediate work was planned, unnecessarily taxing Warren District's staff and resources.

Resolution Actions

Recognizing the need for improved coordination, General Manager,
Jacob Cuarta, reached out to Charter Communications' Regional
Manager to address the situation. A meeting was promptly arranged,
during which the following measures were discussed and implemented:

1. Improved Communication and Coordination

- clear strategy detailing when and where fiber installation activities were scheduled to occur.
- This allowed Warren District's staff to focus on locating infrastructure only in areas where work was imminent, reducing unnecessary duplication of efforts.

2. Efficient Use of Resources

- Locate requests were limited to areas where installation activities were actively planned.
- This prevented scenarios where previously marked areas had to be relocated due to time lapses between requests and actual work commencement.

3. Risk Mitigation

- By aligning locate efforts with actual installation schedules,
 the likelihood of water line strikes was significantly reduced.
- No water lines were damaged following the implementation of this strategy, ensuring uninterrupted service to Warren District's customers.

Key Assurances

Warren District emphasizes the following points regarding its involvement with Charter Communications' fiber installation project:

• No Agreements or Partnerships

The District did not enter into any formal agreements, contracts, or partnerships with Charter Communications or its contractors.

No Financial Implications

 The District incurred <u>no expenses</u> related to the fiber installation project beyond standard operational costs for staff conducting infrastructure locates as required by the Kentucky Underground Facilities Protection Act of 1994.²

Protection of District Infrastructure

- No fiber was installed within or through District infrastructure.
- The adopted coordination measures successfully protected Warren District's infrastructure and customers from potential service interruptions or damages.

Outcome

The collaborative approach between Warren District and Charter Communications significantly minimized operational disruptions while ensuring the safety and integrity of Warren District's water system. This proactive coordination allowed both parties to achieve their respective goals without compromising service quality.

- **4-7b.** See Response to 4-7a above. No fiber-optic lines were installed inside or attached in any way to water lines.
- **4-7c.** See Response to 4-7a above. Warren District employees respond to all line locate requests as required by provisions of the Kentucky Underground Facilities Damage Prevention Act of 1994.³ This is within the scope of employment with Warren District and Warren District, like all operators of underground utilities, bears the expense of performing line locates in response to excavator requests.
- **4-7d.** Warren District has not experienced any costs related to the installation of fiber-optics other than the operational expense of locating its facilities in response to line locate requests and repairing its lines when the lines were damaged in excavation.

Question No. 4-9

Responding Witnesses: Jacob Cuarta

- Q 4-9. Refer to Warren District's response to Staff's First Request, Item 1, Attachment 1-1C at 79, regarding partial reimbursement of damages.
 - a. Explain whether payment by Warren District for this type of damage is supported by its tariff.
 - b. Reconcile this reimbursement with Tariff Sheet PSC Ky. No. 12, Sheet No. 2 (issued September 12, 2013), effective October 17, 2013, that stated any maintenance and repair of facilities beyond Warren District's delivery point is the responsibility of the customer.

A 4-9.

4-9a. This payment did not relate to the rates Warren District charges for its water services, the conditions under which water service is provided, or the reasonableness, adequacy, or efficiency of that service, but rather it related to Warren District's liability for property damage caused by the failure of its facilities and equipment. Warren District's tariff does not include a general "hold harmless" provision in relation to claims for injury or damage to persons or property occasioned by Warren District's facilities and equipment. Therefore, Warren District maintains that paying for a

portion of the repairs for damage caused by the incident, which is recorded in Warren District's Minutes of the April 24, 2024 Board of Commissioners meeting, was proper and not in violation of any tariff provision. Warren District maintains its tariff does not address the occurrences related to this incident at all. In the following paragraphs Warren District provides additional detail concerning this incident at issue.

In January 2024, Warren County Water District experienced an incident involving the failure of an elevated tank's pressure transducer system during an extremely cold night. The pressure transducers, which control the float mechanism responsible for activating the pumps, malfunctioned. This failure caused the tank to overfill, resulting in water overflow that caused significant damage to a nearby homeowner's property, specifically flooding the basement of their home.

Upon learning of the incident, Warren District promptly filed a claim with its insurance provider to cover the cost of repairing the damage incurred by the homeowner. The insurance agency conducted an investigation and ultimately determined that the event was an "act of God," declining to cover the cost of repair under

Warren District's policy. This decision was deeply unsatisfactory to Warren District's management team. Warren District's management believed the homeowner should not bear the financial burden of repairing damage caused by this incident. This is because Warren District's management likened this situation to other situations that could result in Warren District unintentionally causing or contributing to property damage that would result in Warren District's insurance covering the cost of repair. The management team desired the same result for this homeowner. For instance, if Warren District had experienced sudden brake failure on one of its District-owned service vehicles and subsequently collided with another vehicle, building, or item of personal property, Warren District would have expected to be liable for the damage caused by its service vehicle and would have expected its insurance policy to provide coverage for the cost of the repair.

Warren District's management team became concerned that litigation could result between the homeowner and Warren District. Recognizing the gravity of the situation and wanting to avoid the time and expense of possible litigation, General Manager, Jacob Cuarta, presented the matter to the District's Board of

Commissioners at the next regularly scheduled board meeting. Mr. Cuarta recommended that the District cover the cost of repair directly, as it was the ethical course of action. The Board of Commissioners reviewed the circumstances and, after thoughtful consideration, unanimously agreed with the recommendation to pay for the homeowner's repairs.

With the guidance of Warren District's legal counsel, the District engaged in discussions with the homeowner to assess and negotiate a fair and reasonable cost for the repairs. Once an agreement was reached, the District compensated the homeowner \$4,000 directly for the damage caused by the overflow. This decision was made not only to resolve the issue without engaging in potentially costly litigation but also to uphold Warren District's commitment to accountability and community trust. To clarify, this payment was not made during the test year, nor is it expected to be a recurring expense.

While the District disagreed with the insurance adjuster's assessment, the decision to independently pay for the damages demonstrated Warren District's dedication to doing what is right for those Warren District serves. Warren District believes this resolution

appropriately addressed the situation and reflected its commitment to maintaining strong relationships with its community members.

4-9b. Sheet No. 12, of Warren District's tariff on file with the Commission relates to the Application for Service and the tap-on fee. It does not contain any language concerning responsibility for maintenance and repair of facilities beyond the Point of Delivery. Also, Warren District did not pay for the maintenance or repair of facilities past the Point of Delivery. The repairs were to the homeowner's basement, not any water service facilities.

Sheet No. 9 of Warren District's tariff on file with the Commission includes Paragraph 6, Service Investigation Charge. It states that "[a]ny maintenance and repair of facilities beyond the District's delivery point is the responsibility of the customer." No water service facilities beyond Warren District's delivery point at the property in question were repaired as a result of this incident. The repairs were to the homeowner's basement following damage done as a result of water overflowing from a storage tank.

Original Sheet No. 15 of Warren District's tariff for water service includes Paragraph 6, Interruption of Service. This provision states that Warren District "shall not be liable for breach

of contract in the event of, or for loss, injury, or damage to persons or property resulting from interruptions of service, excessive or inadequate water pressure, or otherwise unsatisfactory service." As stated above in the Response to Item 4-9a, Warren District does not view this situation as relating to its provision of water service to the homeowner, rather it was brought on by a failure of Warren District's equipment, which resulted in water flowing outside of Warren District's facilities and resulting in property damage. This equipment malfunction is not an instance of unsatisfactory water service, because it does not relate to the quality of service delivered at all; it relates to water leaving the confines of the District's facilities and causing property damage. Such equipment failures are rare, but they do occur, and Warren District simply desired to avoid imposing the burden of repairing the damage done to the homeowner's property as a result of this malfunction completely on the homeowner.

 - (1) If so, provide the Case Number.
 - (2) If not, explain why a CPCN was not required.
 - b. Provide the total project cost.
 - c. Explain the funding shortfall and what actions have been taken to cure the shortfall.

A 4-10.

4-10a(1). At the Warren County Water District Board meeting held on March 27, 2024, the board discussed the North Warren County Water and Sewer Projects, a critical initiative aimed at addressing the urgent need for expanded water and sewer services in this rapidly growing area. There are two projects, a water project and a sewer project. The total estimated cost for both projects is \$66 million, which has been provided by direct appropriations from the Kentucky General Assembly.

A Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CPCN") was not sought for either the water portion of the project or the sewer portion of the project. However, on June 11, 2024, Warren District filed two notices of intent to file applications for declaratory orders related to the projects. The Commission established Case Nos. 2024-00186 and 2024-00187. The applications for declaratory orders have been drafted but have not yet been filed because Warren District has **not** yet received approval letters from the Kentucky Division of Water ("DOW") for the projects. The applications for declaratory orders will be filed once DOW has approved the plans for the projects.

4-10a(2). Concerning the water project, Warren District maintains that no CPCN is required for two (2) reasons: the project is a waterline extension or improvement project, undertaken by a water district, and therefore it falls within the statutory exception found in KRS 278.020(1)(a)(3); and the project is an ordinary extension of an existing system in the usual course of business. Warren District also maintains that the sewer portion of the project is an ordinary extension of an existing system in the usual course of business.

The water portion of the project, which involves the construction of approximately 60,000 linear feet of 24-inch ductile iron water

transmission main and a duplex booster pump station with a daily pumping capacity of six million gallons of water, is funded through direct appropriations from the Kentucky General Assembly to the Intermodal Transportation Authority ("ITA") in Bowling Green, and no debt is being incurred by the Warren County Water District. Warren District's analysis of why the CPCN requirement does not apply to the water project is set forth below:

KRS 278.020(1)(a)(3) states:

No person, partnership, public or private corporation, or combination thereof shall commence providing utility service to or for the public or begin the construction of any plant, equipment, property, or facility for furnishing to the public any of the services enumerated in KRS 278.010, **except:**

• • •

- 3. A water district created under KRS Chapter 74 or a water association formed under KRS Chapter 273 that undertakes a waterline extension or improvement project if the water district or water association is a Class A or B utility as defined in the uniform system of accounts established by the commission according to KRS 278.220 and:
 - a. The water line extension or improvement project will not cost more than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000); or
 - b. The water district or water association will not, as a result of the water line extension or

improvement project, incur obligations requiring commission approval as required by KRS 278.300.

In either case, the water district or water association shall not, as a result of the water line extension or improvement project, increase rates to its customers

The water project portion of the North Warren County Water and Sewer Project qualifies for the exemption set forth in KRS 278.020(1)(a)(3) and does not require a CPCN because:

(1) The project involves the extension of 60,000 linear feet of 24-inch ductile iron water transmission main from the Bowling Green Municipal Utility's water treatment plant to the Transpark industrial park⁴ and is intended to enhance the available supply of water to the Transpark industrial park, to serve underserved and unserved areas of northeast Warren County, and to improve water pressures in those areas and increase the availability of fire protection service, therefore, **the project is a water main extension and improvement project**.

duplex pumping station, which constituted approximately fourteen percent of the total project cost, was a water main extension and subject to the exemption set forth in KRS 278.020(1)(a)(3)).

Approximately \$2.8 million of the total project amount (or approximately 7.65 percent of total project cost) will be used to construct a duplex booster pump station with a daily pumping capacity of six million gallons of water. While the proposed booster station is not strictly a water main extension, it is an integral and necessary part of the extension and, therefore, qualifies as part of the water main extension. *See, e.g., Breathitt County Water District*, Case No. 2023-00417 (Ky. PSC Mar. 13, 2024) (holding that water main extension project that included the construction of a

- (2) Warren District is a Class A water district. The Commission's Uniform System of Accounts defines a Class A water utility as a utility "having annual water operating revenues of \$750,000 or more." The average of Warren District's annual operating revenues for the last three years for which an annual report has been filed with the Kentucky Public Service Commission is \$15,551,447.
- (3) Warren District will not incur any obligations requiring Commission approval. All funds for the proposed facility are being provided by the Kentucky General Assembly directly to ITA.
- (4) Warren District will not as a result of the Project increase its water service rates to its customers. As noted above, Warren District will not incur any debt to finance the water project. There will be no need to increase rates to address any additional debt service.

Uniform System of Accounts for Class A and B Water Districts and Associations at 14 (2002) (found at http://psc.ky.gov/agencies/psc/forms/usoa/0700ab02.pdf).

Because it satisfies all elements required by KRS 278.020(1)(a)(3), the water project portion of the North Warren County Water and Sewer Project does not require a CPCN.

The water and sewer project portions of the North Warren County Water and Sewer Project are also ordinary extensions of an existing system in the usual course of business, and therefore do not require a CPCN. The projects are located within Warren District's current service area. Warren District's analysis concerning why the water and sewer portions of the North Warren County Water and Sewer Project are ordinary extensions and do not require a CPCN is set forth below:

The legal standard for determining whether a proposed facility is "an ordinary extension in the usual course of business" is set forth in KRS 278.020(1)(a) and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 15(3).⁶

KRS 278.020(1)(a) states:

No person, partnership, public or private corporation, or combination thereof shall commence providing utility service to or for the public or begin the construction of any plant, equipment, property, or facility for furnishing to

the public any of the services enumerated in KRS 278.010, except:

. . .

2. Ordinary extensions of existing systems in the usual course of business;

. . .

until that person has obtained from the Public Service Commission a certificate that public convenience and necessity require the service or construction [emphasis added].

807 KAR 5:001, Section 15(3), provides:

Extensions in the ordinary course of business. No certificate of public convenience and necessity will be required for extensions that do not create wasteful duplication of plant, equipment, property or facilities, or conflict with the existing certificates or service of other utilities operating in the same area and under the jurisdiction of the commission that are in the general area in which the utility renders service or contiguous thereto, and that do not involve sufficient capital outlay to materially affect the existing financial condition of the utility involved, or will not result in increased charges to its customers.

Distilling this statute and this regulation to their essentials, the Commission has declared that a CPCN is not necessary "for facilities that do not result in the wasteful duplication of utility plant, do not compete with the facilities of existing public

utilities, and do not involve a sufficient capital outlay to materially affect the existing financial condition of the utility involved or to require an increase in utility rates."

"Wasteful duplication" is defined as an "excess of capacity over need" and "an excessive investment in relation to productivity or efficiency." A proposed facility does not constitute wasteful duplication unless an "existing facility is reasonably available for the present and future needs of those who will be served by it."

The proposed water distribution and sewer conveyance facilities will not result in wasteful duplication. They are needed to meet an increased demand for water and sewer services in Warren District's service area for many reasons, including the construction of two buildings, which will house the Envision AESC battery plant. Construction on the battery plant buildings began in 2023 and the buildings are projected to be completed in 2026. The District's current facilities are marginal to serve the peak demand for the first battery plant building. The second

battery plant building's demand will exceed the capability of the District's existing facilities. The proposed facilities are also necessary to address and facilitate increased development in northeast Warren County due to population growth and the expected construction of new residential and commercial units to address the existing shortage of such units. Northeast Warren County currently lacks fire protection service. The proposed facilities will permit the District to provide fire protection service to an area lacking such service. The proposed facilities will not compete with the facilities of any other water or sewer utility in the area. Warren District is the only water or sewer utility serving the area.

The Commission has consistently held that a capital outlay does not materially affect a utility's existing financial condition or result in increased charges if the source of the capital does not require the utility to issue securities or evidences of indebtedness or create any other legal obligation on the utility's part to repay or reimburse the source of that capital. In Case No. 2014-00368, 10 a small gas utility proposed to construct a \$200,000

pipeline to serve an industrial customer. Despite the relative size of the capital expenditure involved – the proposed project was equivalent to approximately 55 percent of the utility's total gas plant in service and "represented a significant increase in the monetary value of [the utility's]... system," the project was held to be in the ordinary course because it did not involve sufficient capital to materially affect the utility's financial condition. The critical factor was the industrial customer's assumption of the entire cost of the project and the lack of any financial impact on the rates of the utility's existing customers or the utility's financial condition.

In Case No. 2017-00195,¹³ an electric and gas utility applied for a certificate to relocate and construct a 6,000 foot, 138-kilovolt electric transmission line on a landfill's property.

In this case, a different gas utility's construction of a pipeline intended to serve a single industrial customer and financed entirely by that customer was also deemed in the ordinary course. Interpreting the "capital outlay" in terms of expenditures from the utility's funds and emphasized the ratemaking implications of using non-utility funds, the Commission found that "the proposed project will not materially affect the utility's existing financial condition and will not require an adjustment of its rates." *Id.* at 5.

Louisville Gas and Electric Company, Case No. 2017-00195 (Ky. PSC Aug. 31, 2017).

The landfill's owner had requested the relocation to permit the landfill's expansion. To accommodate the owner, the utility also planned to relocate a gas transmission line but did not request a certificate for the relocation. The landfill owner would fund the total cost of \$3,865,000 of the gas transmission line relocation, with the exception of \$520,000 which the utility would incur to increase the diameter of the relocated line. The Commission found the relocation of the gas transmission pipeline was properly classified as an ordinary extension of an existing system in the usual course of business because the landfill owner was bearing most of the cost of the relocation.¹⁴

In Cases No. 2019-00067¹⁵ and No. 2020-00344,¹⁶ a water district incurred large and significant capital outlays, totaling over \$16 million,¹⁷ to upgrade and improve the water treatment and distribution systems at the Fort Knox Military Installation.

The water district was serving the military installation under a special contract that provided for a surcharge to finance the proposed improvements. No funds other than those already provided by the Federal Government under the special contract were to be used for the capital improvements. The Commission in each case found that the construction did not require a certificate, holding that the proposed construction was consistent with its prior holdings that "extensions necessary to serve a large, sophisticated customer and wholly funded by that customer pursuant to an agreement with that customer do not require a CPCN [certificate of public convenience and necessity], in part, because they will not affect the financial condition of the utility and will not result in an increase in charges to other customers."18

In Case No. 2022-00284, a water district proposed constructing wastewater system improvements, which cost approximately \$1.75 million and represented a 14.6 percent increase in its net utility plant, to meet the increased demands for wastewater collection and treatment services resulting from a

new manufacturing facility. The water district proposed to finance the entire cost of the proposed improvements with grants from the Economic Development Administration and the Appalachian Regional Commission. The Commission found that "the proposed project will not require incurring debt, because the grants will pay for the project at issue herein in full, and therefore, it will have no material effect on the financial condition of the utility."¹⁹

The capital outlay for the proposed facilities will not affect Warren District's financial condition. None of Warren District's funds will finance this capital outlay. Grant funds cover the entire project cost. Warren District will incur no debt or have any obligation to repay the grant monies. Construction of the proposed facilities will not result in increased charges to Warren District's customers. To the contrary, by enabling the AESC manufacturing facility to locate at the Transpark industrial park, the construction of the proposed facilities will result in significantly greater water and sewer sales and greater revenues

for Warren District. It will definitely foster job development and stimulate economic growth in Warren District's territory.

Warren District maintains that the construction of the proposed water and sewer facilities meets the definition of an extension in the ordinary course of business as set forth in 807 KAR 5:001, Section 15(3). It will not result in the wasteful duplication of utility plant, will not result in the construction of facilities competing with the facilities of existing public utilities, and does not involve a sufficient capital outlay to materially affect Warren District's existing financial condition or to require an increase in Warren District's rates. Warren District will file its applications for declaratory orders in this matter as soon as it receives DOW approval of the project plans.

- **4-10b.** The total estimated cost to fund both the water and sewer projects is \$66 million. The cost to construct each portion of the project is roughly half of the total estimated cost.
- **4-10c**. There is no longer a shortfall of funds.

In 2022, the Kentucky General Assembly appropriated \$46 million to the ITA specifically for this project.²⁰ However, due to rising costs and the scale of the required infrastructure, the Guaranteed Maximum Price ("GMP") for the project was determined to be \$66 million. This resulted in a \$20 million funding shortfall. Recognizing the importance of this project to the region, an additional \$20 million was appropriated by the General Assembly during the 2024 session to fully fund the project.²¹

This is because these items are used to repair or restore capital assets, but do not extend the expected useful life of the larger asset nor do they create a new asset. The items in the Tracer Electric invoice are devices used to locate pipe. Because they are used daily, the devices will wear out within a short time and they may not last the NARUC period of 12.5 years for tools and equipment.

- **4-11c.** See Response to Item 4-11b. The items were included as expenses because they did not extend the useful life of the facilities they were used to repair, or they are used daily and are very likely to wear out before the NARUC period of 12.5 years for tools and equipment has elapsed.

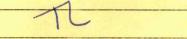

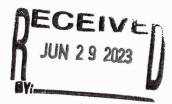

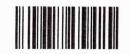

4-12b. All of the invoices in the chart provided by Staff in Item 4-12d are for the services of Neat Brothers boring, LLC ("Neat Brothers"). Warren District utilized the service of Neat Brothers in conducting its "Lead and Copper Service Line Inventory," which is a federal requirement intended to reduce the levels of lead in public drinking water. Like every public water system in the United States, Warren District was required by the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") to prepare and maintain an inventory of service line materials by October 16, This required Warren District to provide the EPA 2024. information on whether it has service lines in its system made of lead or copper and if so, how many. Warren District, and all other public water systems, are also required to notify customers if the service line delivering water to the customer's premises is made of lead or copper.

Warren District was able to use construction records to determine the service line materials in a significant portion of its

system, but there were some areas of the system in which exposing the service line to check for lead or copper piping was necessary. Neat Brothers hand dug at the meter and exposed the service line for inspection by Warren District employees. These expenses could not have been capitalized because the work being done did not add any water lines to Warren District's water distribution system nor did it extend the useful life of any component of the system. Therefore, these expenses do not qualify as capital assets under Generally Accepted Accounting Principles ("GAAP") and must be "expensed" rather than capitalized because these clearly operational are and maintenance expenses. The work was a necessary operational expense to comply with a federal regulation.

4-12c. The cost of performing this work was expensed and not capitalized because the work did not add any water lines to Warren District's water distribution system, nor did it extend the useful life of any component of the system. The work was a necessary operational expense to comply with a federal reporting regulation.

4-12d. As stated above, the cost of this work should not have been capitalized as it was not related to extending the system or in increasing the useful life of any component of the system.

While Warren District views all of the above expenses as legitimate, prudently incurred business expenses, it is not seeking to recover the cost of all of these expenses in its rates. The following are expenses Warren District **is** seeking to recover in rates:

- The January 10, 2023; April 18, 2023; July 12, 2023; and October 12, 2023 payments to the Bowling Green Rotary Club were payment of quarterly dues. Membership in the Rotary Club provides Warren District the opportunity to regularly meet with other community leaders and to stay informed about what is happening in the rapidly growing and changing Bowling Green, Kentucky area. The Rotary Club promotes ethical standards and professional growth. Rotary Clubs are well-established, having begun in 1905, and wide-spread, having 33,000 clubs across 200 nations. Rotary has a proven track-record of being an effective, affordable, and reliable avenue for businesses, such as Warren District, to stay connected to all of the important events and happenings in the community. Rotary membership also enables Warren District to stay abreast of the various challenges facing other businesses, families, and the community at-large. Rotary membership is a valuable tool that Warren District uses to ensure it is informed about new and expanding business and development in the area.
- The January 17, 2023 payment to the Builders' Association of South Central Kentucky for Warren District's annual membership in this important organization provides Warren District a "seat at the

table" with those individuals and firms that are planning and developing the communities in which Warren District provides water service. This is important because Warren County's population is growing rapidly. New businesses are locating in the region and some existing businesses New residential developments are being built to are expanding. accommodate the increased population. With the quick pace that development is occurring, it is very important that Warren District participates in the builders' association. Membership in the builders association enables Warren District to effectively disseminate the information concerning its engineering and construction specifications to those that need it most. Maintaining these relationships also allows Warren District to plan the expansion of its distribution system to meet the needs of those within its service area.

The January 31, 2023 and April 30, 2023 payments to NRECA Career Center, and the May 31, 23 and June 30, 2023 payments to YourMembership Careers were to pay for job posting notices for positions Warren District had available for an engineer and a computerized maintenance management system administrator. Both of these positions are professional in nature and require a high degree of skill and training. Warren District placed the job postings where they

were likely to be seen by individuals who were qualified for the positions.

- The February 28, 2023 payments to the American Red Cross were enrollment fees paid to permit Warren District's employees to complete CPR and First Aid certification as required by Warren District's safety program and Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:006, Section 25.
- The March 31, 2023 payment to Glory Baby Ministries was for professional photography services. Warren District had photographs taken of its management staff for publication on Warren District's website. Warren District had the photographs taken professionally to provide a uniform appearance to its website. Warren District believes a well-developed, properly maintained, and frequently updated website is a valuable tool to communicate with its customers. The opportunity to "introduce" the management team to customers and the community at-large through publication of photos and brief biographical information was something Warren District believed to be beneficial, as it enables customers and prospective customers to educate themselves about the management of Warren District before initiating any personal contact if they desire to do so.

• The June 30, 2023 payment to Acts Now, Inc was made to register employees for a Summit Damage Prevention Utility Conference. The employees received valuable training in line locating at the conference and had the opportunity to discuss the challenges of protecting Warren District's underground infrastructure with knowledgeable, experienced leaders in the utility and excavation industries.

Warren District is **not** seeking to recover certain business expenses in its rates. Each expense below was incurred because Warren District believes it has a responsibility to be seen promoting certain worthwhile community endeavors and doing so benefits Warren District's relationship with the community and its customers. This provides Warren District with the business benefit of good-will with its customers and the community at-large. However, Warren District is aware of Commission precedent that precludes the recovery of these expenses in rates, and is therefore **not seeking** recovery of these expenses:

• The January 11, 2023 payment to the United Way of Southern Kentucky, Inc was made to purchase a table at the Annual United Way Awards Dinner. Warren District was nominated for the "Live United"

Award" in recognition of its employee's strong commitment to United Way. Warren District employees show support for the various charities that serve southern Kentucky under the United Way umbrella by making voluntary monetary contributions during the United Way Campaign and by volunteering their time in a variety of charitable endeavors. Warren District was honored to win this award in 2023 in recognition of its employees' dedication and generosity.

- The January 25, 2023 payment to Bowling Green Parks and Recreation was to secure registration for a team from Warren District to participate in a local basketball league. Although Warren District finds this beneficial in maintaining employee morale and in promoting health activity and community involvement amongst its employees, Warren District accepts that the Commission has not historically allowed recovery of such expenses.
- The May 16, 2023 payment to College Heights Foundation was to fund the 2023 scholarships discussed in greater detail in the response to item 4 above.
- The June 30, 2023 payment to the Builders' Association of Central Kentucky was to pay for Warren District's annual "Cornerstone Membership" in the local builders' association. Having a Cornerstone

Membership provides many advantages to Warren District such as advertisements in the *Parade of Homes* quarterly publication and the *Home Expo* publication, recognition on the signage in the builders' association's lobby, and inclusion in "Cornerstone Appreciation" advertisements in other builders' association publications.

Two of the most valuable aspects of the Cornerstone Membership are that it (1) provides Warren Water with a seat on the Board of Directors of the association, and (2) it enables Warren District to host the October monthly meeting at which Warren District's General Manager delivers a presentation to the association's membership. This platform provides Warren District with a once-a-year opportunity to impart whatever information it believes to be important for the building community to understand about Warren District and its services. Warren District is not aware of any other means of obtaining this level of input and influence with those who are responsible for building the homes and businesses in its service area. Warren District believes this expense has been prudently incurred for a legitimate business purpose but recognizes that Commission precedent suggests the Commission may not agree with Warren District's analysis. Therefore, Warren District is **not seeking** to recover the cost of its Cornerstone

Membership in the Builders' Association of South Central Kentucky in its rates.

• The July 31, 2023 payment to Down's Syndrome of South Central Kentucky was to sponsor "Step Up for Down's Syndrome" an event to celebrate individuals with Down's Syndrome and serve as a fund-raising event for this local worthwhile organization that provides educational classes, support resources, and various services designed to assist those with Down's Syndrome and their families in every phase of life from birth through senior adulthood. Warren District supports meaningful community initiatives such as this one because it promotes good citizenship by setting an example of care and concern for others.
