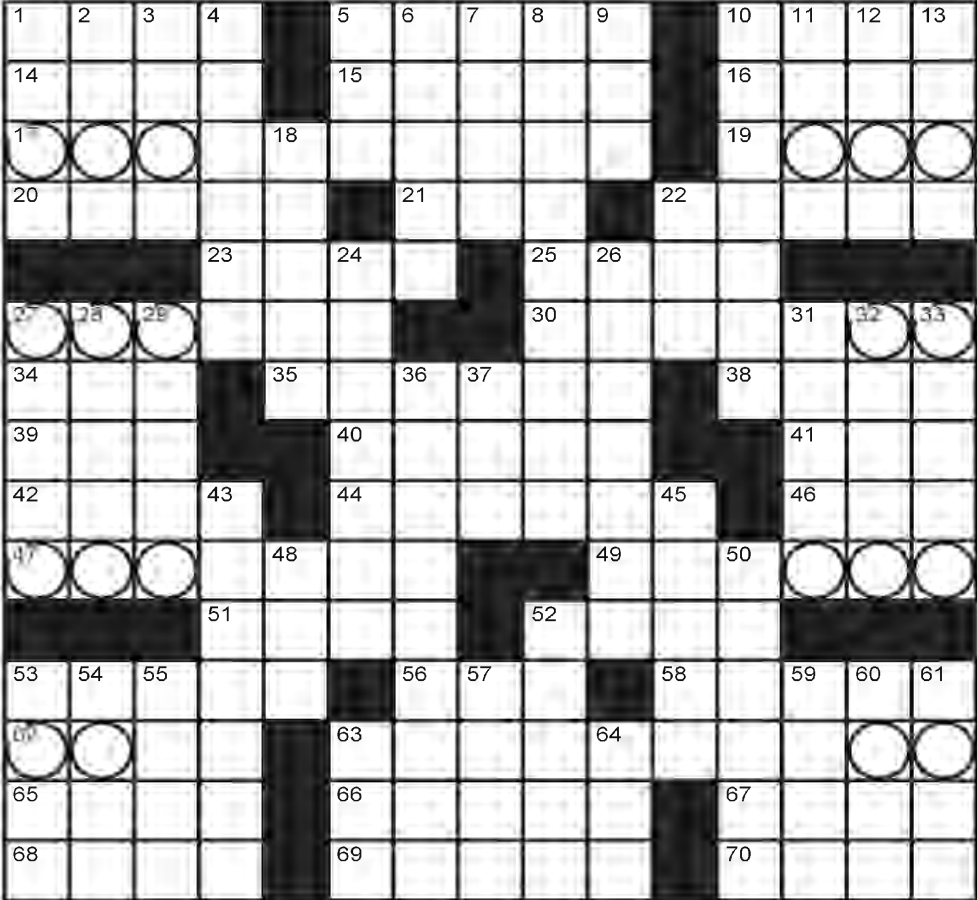

Kelsey rewarded for U of L's season with \$1 million raise

In gratitude to coach Pat Kelsey for leading Louisville out of the college basketball wilderness, back to national relevance in his first season, the U of L Athletic Association awarded Kelsey with a pay raise of \$1 million.

Kelsey's original deal was for five years and \$2.3 million per year. He later earned a one-

year extension for guiding the Cards to the NCAA Tournament.

His salary now is \$3.63 million with a contract that runs through 2030 and increases incentives he would earn for reaching the Sweet Sixteen, Elite Eight and Final Four.

This season Kelsey, 49, earned a \$25,000 bonus by being named the ACC Coach of the Year and a \$50,000

bonus for playing in the NCAA Tournament.

"I think we landed in a really good spot, I really do," athletics director Josh Heird said ULAA's board meeting last Thursday. "... This is not a knee-jerk reaction — like, 'Oh, this is a one-hit wonder.' Pat's won almost every year anywhere that he's been, if you look at his success at Winthrop and his success at the College of Charleston and now his suc-

cess at the University of Louisville. We expect him to continue to win — and win in big ways here."

Prior to Kelsey's arrival from College of Charleston in March, 2024 U of L was 12-52 in two years under Kenny Payne. The Cards' 28 wins were two more than the previous three teams combined (25-71). Kelsey's built-from-scratch team also advanced to

the championship game of the ACC Tournament for the first time since joining the league for the 2014-15 season and ended a drought in the Big Dance dating to 2019.

Expectations are high for Kelsey's second season. Louisville has been ranked in the way-to-early polls for next year by The Athletic, ESPN, FOX Sports, On3 and Sports Illustrated.

Brohm remains an advocate of spring game

Louisville football coach Jeff Brohm is bucking a trend of doing away with spring football games. He doesn't agree with many of his peers on the subject.

As far as he is concerned, the Cardinals' Red-White game is here to stay.

Asked about the future following last Friday's 2025 edition of the game, in which the White offensive team defeated the Red defensive team 32-24, Brohm called spring games an "invaluable" resource for both the coaching staff and the players.

"Anytime you get into a team setting and have to find ways to move the ball, create stops ..., " Brohm said. "For guys to recognize it, find ways to execute in the red zone, long yardage situations, you've got to do it. So to waste a spring game and not do that, to me you're hurting yourself.

"Of course you don't want to get guys injured. And I think some (coaches) are scared that other (coaches) are going to watch and steal their players. In my opinion, people already know who we have, and teams already know who the other teams have."

In Friday's game in L&N Stadium, quarterback Miller Moss and wide receiver Caulin Lacy were the offensive standouts.

Moss, the Southern Cal transfer, completed 18 of 26 passes for 208 yards and a touchdown, while Lacy had 99 receiving yards with a TD. Halfback Duke Watson scored on a 60-yard run.

"I think Miller's had a really good

camp," Brohm said. "He's a good leader, he works really hard, he can throw an accurate ball. He's got good poise, he's been battle-tested, he can handle adversity. He knows who our weapons are."

No defensive stats were kept, but Brohm said he likes his defensive line, where he has to replace stalwarts Ashton Gillotte and Ramon Puryear.

"I think we have possibly three deep at a lot of positions," he said. "Now, some don't have much experience, so that's a concern, but they have talent without question."

U of L will open the season on Aug. 30 against Eastern Kentucky, the first of three straight home games.

COLLINS TO ENTER PORTAL. Guard/center Austin Collins, who has been a solid part of the offensive line the past two seasons, has filed the paperwork necessary to enter the portal as a grad transfer, his representative told On2's Pete Nakos. Collins is the second Cardinal to enter the portal this spring, following edge rusher Demon Clowney.

While the 6-foot-3, 300-pound Collins had to miss all of this spring because of offseason shoulder surgery, he had long since established himself as one of Louisville's best offensive linemen. He played in 12 games last year and allowed no sacks and only eight pressures in 311 pass blocking snaps and 542 snaps overall.

Of Louisville's six main offensive linemen in 2024, Collins had the highest Pro Football Focus pass blocking grade at 85.1, while he gave up the second-fewest total pressures, behind Monroe Mills' seven.

UK football made 'a lot of strides' this spring

Following 15 practices this spring, capped by Kentucky football's Spring Showcase on Saturday at Kroger Field, the Wildcats feel good about their chances for 2025 — but the work isn't done yet.

"It was good to get out there, get in the stadium on a beautiful day," said UK head coach Mark Stoops, whose squad ran through a shortened scrimmage, "and let the fans see a little bit about the upcoming team. Throughout the spring, I was very proud of this group. We definitely got better. We made a lot of strides.

"The downside of coming out here and splitting it up and playing everybody on your roster, you tend to get sloppy from time to time, but we got better throughout the spring."

Even with the spring practice window closing, UK coaches stressed the importance of the next few weeks — highlighting the need to focus on the offseason strength and conditioning program while also working on the roster for when the NCAA transfer portal opens Wednesday. Amid the uncertainty surrounding the NCAA's House settlement regarding scholarships and roster limits, the SEC has opted to leave each team's roster size at 85 players this fall.

Stoops expects a few players to leave through the portal before the 2025 season kicks off, but he doesn't anticipate any major changes from what the Cats fielded during the spring.

"I feel good about the roster. There's a few areas where I'd love to get a couple guys," Stoops noted. "Again, you have to have the depth, you need to be able to function in practice. We're still working through roster limitation and what that number's

going to be next year. There's still some moving pieces, but I think I'd like to keep intact the nucleus we have here.

"There will be some people that go in the portal — there has to be — and depending on that, we'll work through bringing some guys in, too."

Though the Cats had to operate without a few players due to injury, most notably the wide receivers, Stoops pointed to his team's overall depth as a positive.

"I felt like, going into today, we got the work done throughout the previous 14 practices, things we weren't able to do a year ago," he said. "You go back to last spring and even through fall camp, we were short some numbers, and it hurts you with the way you practice, and it carried over into the games last year.

"It really takes away from the whole team, the way you operate, the way you practice, the way

you scrimmage and so on. With that being said, I'm happy with the way things went. Today was a very bland, very vanilla scrimmage, but it's still football. ... It was, overall, a very productive spring."

According to wide receiver Ja'Mori Maclin, the Cats' top returning pass-catcher, a key to a successful summer is to continue the work they've been putting in.

"We just had a lot of the guys getting comfortable with each other in the locker room," he said. "I think that's the biggest thing, and I think that's where it starts. You can't really have a good team on the field if you don't have a good team off the field.

"I think we'll surprise a lot of people. We've just got to work on what we've got to work on and just focus on what we've got to do. A lot of people are probably counting us out. They don't know much about us, but that's what we like — just going out there and working."

Croatian standout commits to play for UK

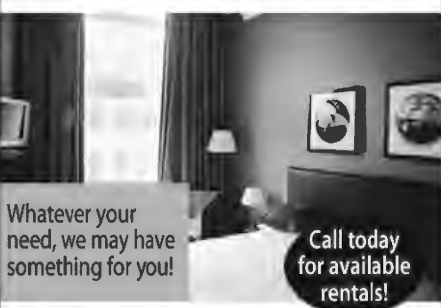

gender equity in athletics and preventing sexual harassment on campuses.

Given the push-pull of how recent presidencies view Title IX, it has created a whiplash effect.

Joe Biden signed an executive order on his first day in office that interpreted sex as “gender identity” under Title IX, a move that protected transgender athletes from being discriminated against if they wanted to participate in a sport that aligned with their gender identity, not their sex assigned at birth.

Yet it took more than three years for Title IX regulations saying that to be finalized. And when they were, they lacked specifics sports and were put on hold by courts.

Trump’s order explicitly states that sex means the “immutable biological classification as either male or female.” ‘Sex’ is not a synonym for and

does not include the concept of “gender identity.” The order adds that “sexes are not changeable and are grounded in fundamental and incontrovertible reality.”

The decision marks a significant shift in the way Title IX is viewed and more explicitly, how it will be enforced.

HOW MANY TRANSGENDER ATHLETES WILL BE AFFECTED?

That number is hard to pin down.

The NCAA, for example, does not track data on transgender athletes among the 544,000 currently competing on 19,000 teams at various levels across the country, though NCAA President Charlie Baker testified in Congress in December that he was aware of fewer than 10 active NCAA athletes who identified as transgender.

A 2019 survey of high school students by the Gay, Lesbian and Straight Education Network (GLSEN) noted

just 5% of respondents said they participated in a sport that aligned with their gender identity. A 2022 report by the Williams Institute estimated about 300,000 high school-age students (ages 13-17) identified as transgender. How many of those young people participate in sports is unknown, but it is likely a tiny fraction.

Baseball honors Robinson on 78th anniversary of breaking color barrier

LOS ANGELES — Jackie Robinson was the first to break baseball's color barrier with the Brooklyn Dodgers 78 years ago Tuesday. His legacy continues to inspire people inside the major leagues — and outside, too.

Players and staff from the Dodgers, including Shohei Ohtani, Mookie Betts and rookie Roki Sasaki, and the Colorado Rockies surrounded Robinson's statue in Centerfield Plaza hours before game time in Los Angeles on Jackie Robinson Day around the major leagues.

They were joined by Basketball Hall of Fame player Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, who turns 78 on Wednesday. He recalled wearing a Brooklyn baseball cap while growing up in the neighboring borough of Manhattan.

"I'd get in fights with people from the Giants, the Yankees, pretty often," he said, "but I kept my cap on and nobody was able to knock it off. I was so tall."

Abdul-Jabbar, then known as Lew Alcindor, followed in Robinson's footsteps as a sports star at UCLA, where he won three national championships under Hall of Fame coach John Wooden.

Robinson has continued to be a lifelong inspiration for Abdul-Jabbar.

"He meant excellence, giving your all, giving your best," Abdul-Jabbar said, "and for all the detractors that are out there, just ignore them and keep on."

Every team playing Monday wore No. 42 jerseys. It's the only number universally retired in the majors.

"It's not just a one-off day," Dodgers manager Dave Roberts said. "We understand what this man did for our world, our country. This is how you go about life. This is something for me, keep-

ing his legacy burning."

Roberts, Ron Washington of the Los Angeles Angels and Will Venable of the Chicago White Sox are only Black managers currently in the majors.

"One of the things Jackie obviously nailed is he realized from an early time that life was going to be hard," Roberts said. "He was special and he was put in this certain position to rise above and know that it's not just about the game of baseball. It's bigger than him."

The Dodgers and Rockies were joined by Sonya Pankey Robinson, the oldest grandchild of Jackie and Rachel Robinson and the only child of Jackie Jr., who was killed in a car accident in 1971 at age 24. Granddaughter Ayo Robinson, whose father is David Robinson, was on hand, too.

"He was so progressive in so many ways," Pankey Robinson said of her grandfather. "When I think about him fondly,

I just think about all of his contributions to society and to us as a family. I feel a real responsibility to uphold his values and I take that job very seriously."

Robinson's 102-year-old widow marked the anniversary at the Jackie Robinson Museum in Brooklyn with Commissioner Rob Manfred.

"She is out looking great and greeting everyone," Pankey Robinson said. "Not only did she instill the values that she knows my grandfather would expect us to uphold, but she had her own values and her own expectations of us early on to set goals for ourselves in life."

Pankey Robinson lives near her grandmother in New York, saying, "We keep it close and tight."

Robinson was in the news last month when a Defense Department page describing his military service was restored after it briefly went missing. The department has

been removing content highlighting contributions by women and minority groups as part of a directive for President Donald Trump's administration to delete material promoting diversity, equity and inclusion.

"Disheartening but not discouraged because I think what he's done is etched in history and it's not anyone else's place to remove that," Pankey Robinson said after the ceremony. "His impact is large and we feel good knowing, that while disappointed, what he did mattered."

The Angels' Washington learned about Robinson when he bought a book about him during a bus stop in Waterloo, Iowa, on a minor league trip in 1972.

"It impacted me tremendously to find out what he had to go through just to play the game of baseball," Washington said, "and then you look back and say, 'Wow, in this period could I have done that?' I want to think I could, but I don't know if I could."

New York Yankees manager Aaron Boone called Robinson "one of the most important figures in American history."

"Obviously, he was part of integrating our sport, but part of further integrating America, and other sports. It's so cool what we get to do today, and everyone wearing 42, bringing attention to it and just honoring what's an amazing legacy."

AP teachers at Apollo, DCHS preparing students to get college credit

During the 2023-24 school year, the number of Apollo High School students in Missy Owens' class who passed the Advanced Placement precalculus test exceeded both the state and national averages.

At Apollo, 88% of Owens' precalculus students passed the AP test, earning college credit. Nationally 75.7% of students earned high enough scores on the test to get college credit. The state average for the year is 75.3%.

Owens, who began teaching the class last year, said the curriculum is demanding, and requires the students to be very involved.

"We only have one semester to get ready for that (test), so there is zero downtime," Owens said. "We have to hit it every day. I love it because the kids are so motivated. I feel we are on the same brainwave. ...They appreciate the math. That's the part I love."

Daviess County Public Schools offers 16 Advanced Placement classes at Apollo, and 20 at Daviess County High School. AP courses count as high school credit, with the opportunity to earn college credit for passing the AP subject matter exam.

Although the district has a dual high school-college credit program of its own, the AP program is different because credits earned by passing the Advanced Placement test are accepted at colleges across the country, Owens said.

AP classes are designed to resemble college courses, said Steve Easley, who teaches AP social studies

classes at DCHS.

Although students who pass the AP test get college credit, the class in not

a test prep course, Easley said.

"I feel a lot of the focus in AP is on the score,"

Easley said. "(But) a kid can take the course and not pass the test, or not take the test, and still

learn from it. If nothing else, that student had an opportunity that was challenging, that allowed them to think, and (made them) more prepared for college," Easley said.

Students are recommended to the AP classes or sign up for them on their own, Easley and Owens said.

Students enrolling in AP classes preferably have some honors classes in their background, Owens said.

AP standards and tests are created by college teachers and experienced AP teachers. The courses and tests are used nationwide.

"If you're going to teach an AP class, you have to go to a training," Owens said.

Easley said he tells students they need to prepare for intensive coursework.

As with college courses, student are expected to show up having read the assigned material and prepared to discuss it, he said.

"We say to our freshman, 'if you're not ready for an AP class as a ninth grader, that's totally OK ... but don't forget about these classes,' " and consider taking them later in high school, Easley said.

A student who scores at least a 3 out of 5, which is the top score, on the AP exam can earn college credit in the subject. The classes help the students prepare to take the test with practice questions and by discussions about how to manage a standardized test.

"The multiple choice is extreme tricky," Owens said of the AP precalculus exam."

But students who pass the class usually have enough to a grasp on the subject matter to pass the test, Owens said.

But the classes aren't teaching a test.

Easley said former students have said the work they did in AP classes helped them succeed later in college.

"As far as getting students ready for a four-year university, AP does a fantastic job of getting them ready for the rigors they are going to see in the universities," Easley said. "I tell the students, when I was in high school, I took AP U.S. history and didn't pass the exam," Easley said. "(But) my freshman year at UK, I took U.S. history 108 and 109, and it was a breeze. It was easier than my AP class."

Easley said, "We push the students and we expect a lot out of them, but what they get in return" is worth the effort.

Schools relying on digital surveillance find security still takes a human touch

Four years ago, a sixth grader in Rigby, Idaho, shot and injured two peers and a custodian at a middle school. The tragedy prompted school officials to reimagine what threat prevention looks like in the district.

Now, student-run Hope Squads uplift peers with homemade cards and assemblies. Volunteer fathers patrol hallways through Dads on Duty. A team of counselors, social workers and probation officers gathers to discuss and support struggling students. Thanks to a new cell phone ban, students are talking to each other more. The positive results of these combined efforts have been measurable.

"We've helped change ... lives," said Brianna Vasquez, a Rigby High senior and Hope Squad member. "I've had friends who have been pulled out of the hole of depression and suicidal thoughts because of (the Hope Squad)."

The Education Reporting Collaborative, a coalition of eight newsrooms, is investigating the unintended consequences of AI-powered surveillance at schools. Members of the Collaborative are AL.com, The Associated Press, The Christian Science Monitor, The Dallas Morning News, The Hechinger Report, Idaho Education News, The Post and Courier in South Carolina, and The Seattle Times.

America's educators are working to prevent harm like Rigby's shooting. Many U.S. districts have turned to technology — especial-

ly digital surveillance — as the antidote. Not everyone is sold on that approach, as there can be issues, including with privacy and security. Without broad agreement on which strategies work best, some districts are trying a combination of technology, on-the-ground threat assessment teams and mental health supports.

Jennifer DePaoli, a senior researcher at the Learning Policy Institute who has studied school safety, said a multi-pronged approach is "very sensible."

'People are the solution'

In Rigby, educators lean toward human interaction. Artificial intelligence and digital surveillance systems are perhaps less likely to

identify who's eating alone at lunch or withdrawing from friends.

"It's all about culture," said Chad Martin, superintendent of Jefferson County

School District in Rigby. "It starts with that — just having a friend, having a group of friends, having a

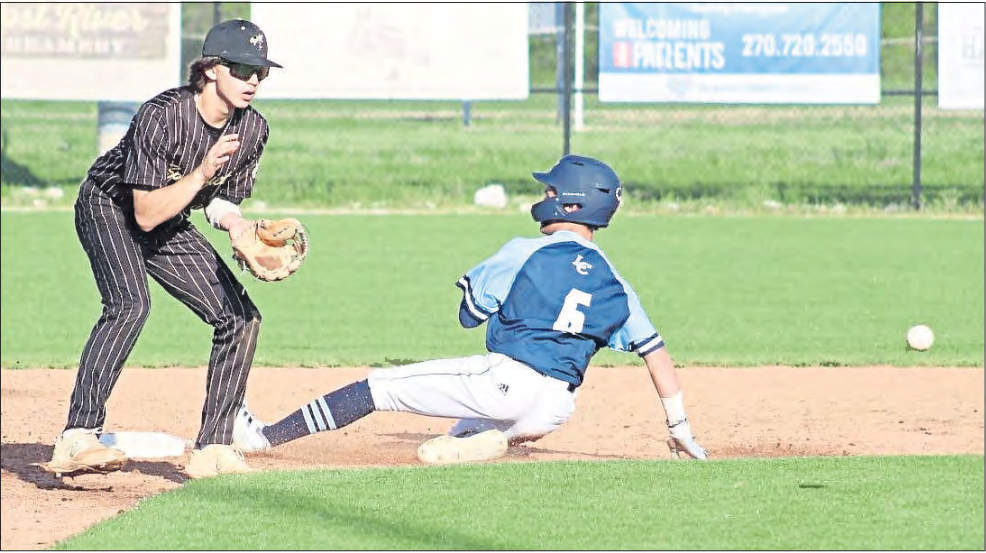

Last Wednesday marked the fifth straight victory for the Logan County Cougars baseball program as they hosted the Springfield Yellow Jackets. A solid all-around performance for the Cougars as they took home the 5-3 victory. 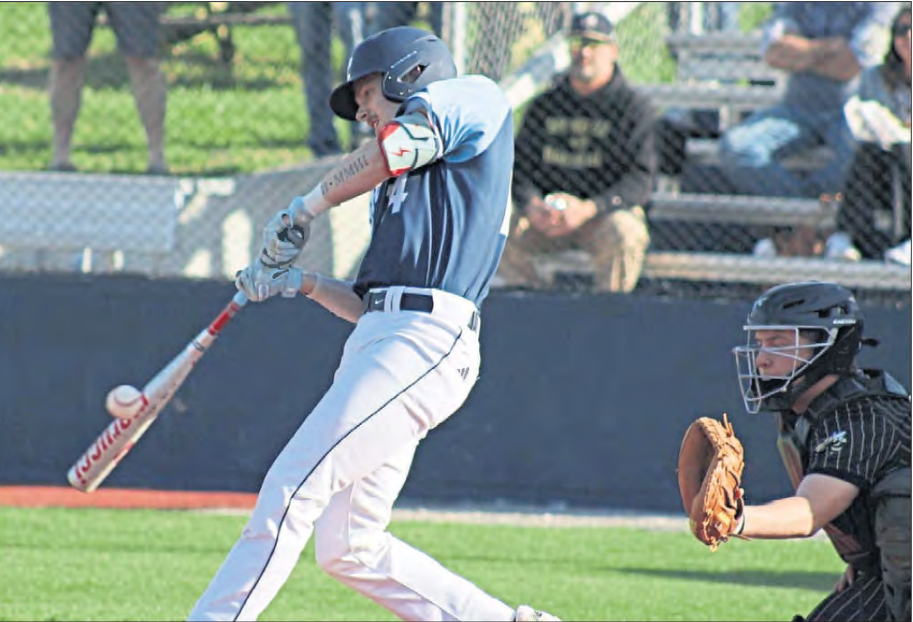

A life-long passion leads to a new position for Powell-Skellie

SHELBYVILLE – Growing up near the corner of 8th and Main, Cyndi Powell-Skellie has always had a love for theatre and the arts.

She was first introduced to Shelby County’s theatre community through a play directed by Bob Shy. Auditioning for “The King and I,” when she was just 10, Powell-Skellie remembers when plays were solely put on in the Shelby County High School auditorium.

The Shelby County Theatre will be opening for its 48th season, with Powell-Skellie as the new executive director.

“Our community has embraced theatre so much throughout the years,” Powell-Skellie explains.

Her passion for theatre first started when her mom introduced her to the creative outlet in the community.

In fact, it is that creative community that encouraged Powell-Skellie to pursue more. Over time, Powell-Skellie has not only been able to learn under mentors but to collaborate with them as well. Miss Jane Martin, for example, was once Powell-Skellie’s theatre teacher and one of her many inspirations. Years later, the two women are directing the

play “Puffs” in the spring. “There is something about the people who create, people who have a positive energy and love what they’re doing. The end product is always so unique and amazing. That’s what I love about theatre,” said Powell-Skellie.

Powell-Skellie is extremely excited about her new position, acknowledging that there are “big shoes to fill.” Cheryl Van Stockum was the executive director prior to Powell-Skellie, leading the theatre program to what it is today. Influenced by Van Stockum’s devotion to the arts, Powell-Skellie hopes to lead with the same passion.

“This is a pivotal time for theatre,” Powell-Skellie beamed, “It’s time to grow.”

While the theatre does not have set expansion plans yet, they working hard to see what is feasible. Collaborating with outside analytic companies, a deep analysis is being done to determine the best course of action. Plans of expansion, building, and providing more entertainment are currently all being discussed. After years

of successful productions, the theatre is working on taking the next step forward—whatever that step may be.

“There are great possibilities,” said Powell-Skellie. Powell-Skellie’s main goal is accessibility. The current theater set-up has been very functional for the shows they’ve put on, but the space can be limiting for community members. Many shows reach full capacity leaving some residents without the the opportunity to watch. Another issue for some residents is that the upstairs theater is not wheelchair accessible. Powell-Skellie hopes to be able to provide more opportunities for both performers and theatre enthusiasts in the coming seasons.

“We want theatre to be for everyone,” Powell-Skellie expressed, adding, “We need theatre in Shelby County.”

As of July 1, Cyndi Powell-Skellie will be retiring from her job as the Public Relations Coordinator for Shelby County Public School to step into the position of executive director of the theatre. Through many roles at SCPS Powell-Skellie has gained 32 years of public

education experience. Combined with her theatre experience, Powell-Skellie is equipped to lead, guide, and support the performers in her new role.

Powell-Skellie and the rest of the devoted men and women in the theatre community will no doubt thrive with the evolution of the Shelby County program.

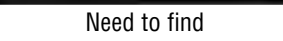

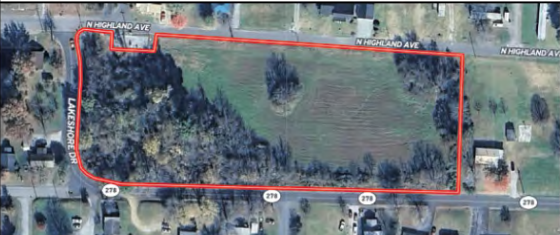

Report on the Financial Statements

Opinions

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the City of Eddyville, Kentucky, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the City's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents. In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the business-type activities of the City of Eddyville, Kentucky, as of June 30, 2024, and the respective changes in financial position, and, where applicable, cash flows thereof for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinions

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the City of Eddyville, Kentucky and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinions.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the City of Eddyville, Kentucky's ability to continue as a going concern for twelve months beyond the financial statement date, including any currently known information that may raise substantial doubt shortly thereafter.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinions. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and *Government Auditing Standards* will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Required Supplementary Information

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis, budgetary comparison information, schedule of proportionate share of the net pension liability, schedule of contributions to the net pension liability, schedule of proportionate share of the net OPEB liability, and schedule of contributions to the net OPEB liability on pages 4-9 and 46-55 be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Supplementary Information

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the City of Eddyville, Kentucky's basic financial statements. The accompanying combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or to the basic financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements are fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.

Other Reporting Required by Government Auditing Standards

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we have also issued a report dated February 7, 2025, on our consideration of the City of Eddyville, Kentucky's internal control over financial reporting and our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, grant agreements, and other matters. The purpose of that report is to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the results of that testing and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the City of Eddyville, Kentucky's internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering the City of Eddyville, Kentucky's internal control over financial reporting and compliance.
