Tour of Constellations 36 Going on with the constel-lations, the next one we will look at is Cetus. Cetus, the Whale, swims

Srd, stays bright (visible to the unnided eye) for about four months, and then dims. Look for this wonderful star 7° southeast of Alpha (ci) Pisces points almost right to Mira. A small telescope will allow you to follow this variable through its period of minimum light. minimum light.

variable through its period of minimum light. Mira is a giant star nearing the end of its life. If it were substituted for the Sun, Mars would orbit well inside this star's atmosphere. It has low surface temperature, which gives it a distinct reddish color - but its temperature isn't constant. As Mira's in-ternal pressure and tempera-ture change, the star pulsates and is light output varies. When it beats up, it expands and brightens; as it cool it contracts and grows dimmer. The part of the sky where Cetus is located was as-sociated with sea monsters long before the time of the sociated with sea monsters long before the time of the Greeks. In Babylonian my-thology these stars were the sea-monster Tiamat who rep-resented chaos and was slain by the God Marduk. Draco is sometimes linked to this story.



was not in attendance due to a work obligation in Wisconsin.)

Following the poll, Magistrate Phipps further discussed the reasons for his vote.

"I don't have a problem with any of these people," Phipps said. "But I think these board appointments should be posted in the paper so everybody who might be interested in them can apply for them. That's my reason ... I've got nothing against none these people ... Water board and everything else. But I won't vote for any of them."

'Thank you for your opinion," Judge Gazay said.

"That's my opinion," Phipps confirmed before Judge Gazay administered the oath of office to Tracey Hatton.

For readers' clarification, the appointment process for board vacancies is as follows, as per Kentucky Revised Statute 67.170 (9), which details the powers and duties of the county judge executive:

"(9) When directed by statute or an ordinance of that county to make an appointment and fill a vacancy, nominate a person to fill the vacancy within sixty (60) days of the date of the vacancy. The fiscal court shall approve or disapprove the nomination within forty-five (45) days of the receipt of the nomination. If the county judge/ executive fails to nominate a person within sixty (60) days of the date of the vacancy, the fiscal court may fill the vacancy. If the fiscal court fails to approve or disapprove a nomination within forty-five (45) days of the nomination, the county

judge/executive's nominee is deemed to have been approved. If the fiscal court disapproves a nomination, the county judge/ executive shall nominate another person to fill the vacancy within forty-five (45) days of the disapproval. If the county/judge executive fails to nominate another person within forty-five (45) days, a majority of the fiscal court may fill the vacancy." •••


• Judge's Report - Judge Gazay told the court he had begun chemotherapy following his cancer diagnosis, which he shared with the public last month. to those of some current county employees.

• FEMA BRIC Grant -Judge Gazay presented a resolution regarding application for a FEMA Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) grant noting that if approved, funds would be used to purchase generators for the county's fire departments. The court approved the resolution, with Magistrate Phipps voting no.

• Hog Branch – The court voted unanimously to take the right fork of Hog Branch back into the county road system ahead of the monthly ratification of paid vendor claims and approval of unpaid vendor claims.

The meeting adjourned after a lengthy discussion regarding a property dispute on Leisure Branch Road, which can be found in a separate report.

to see you!


