Springfield Haitians react to news of Trump ending protected status

Springfield residents are bracing for a shift after the Trump administration announced it will end protected status for Haitian immigrants in August.

City leaders in Springfield, a central Ohio city of 60,000, said they've seen an influx of 15,000 to 20,000 Haitian residents in recent years. Many of the Haitian immigrants are in the city with temporary protected status, a federal designation for immigrants from countries with dangerous conditions, such as a natural disaster or armed conflict.

The Biden administration had previously extended the status for Haiti to February 2026 due to concerns about natural disasters and gang violence. The status has been in place for Haitians since the catastrophic earthquake in Haiti in 2010.

Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem said in a statement Thursday that she and Trump "are returning TPS to its original status: temporary."

During the 2024 election, President Donald Trump and Vice President JD Vance targeted Springfield's Haitian population on social media and during a presidential debate, after which the city faced national media attention and dozens of bomb threats.

Vile's Dorsainvil, executive director of the Haitian Community Help and Support Center, said there is a sense of unpredictability.

"From day to day, there is like an increase of fear and anxiety. That's the way it is. So we just have to deal with that. And it's not like just Haitian immigrants, but every immigrant in the USA for now," he said.

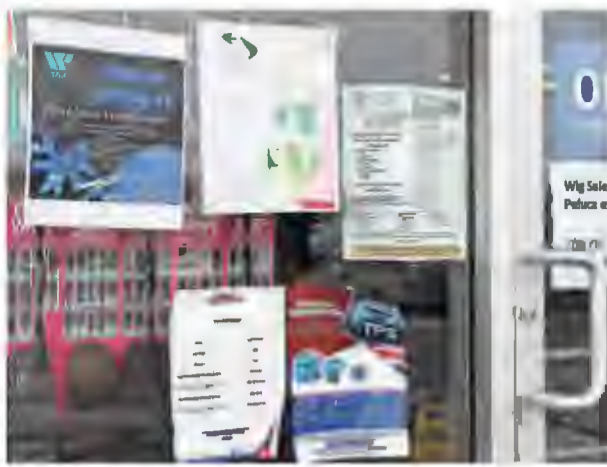
The city has filed a federal lawsuit against a neo-Nazi group called the Blood Tribe, accusing the group of harassing residents who defended Haitian residents in Springfield.

The Dispatch reached out to Ohio Gov. Mike DeWine and Springfield Mayor Rob Rue for comment on the end of TPS but did not receive a response prior to publication.

Dorsainvil said there are two groups of Haitians in Springfield with temporary protected status, those who came to the U.S. through the humanitarian parole program and can still adjust their status and those who came after and cannot.

"All of us are under the TPS status, the only difference is that some of us are still eligible to adjust our status if we want to do asylum or anything," he said. "For those of them who cannot, I can just pray for them."

Dorsainvil said it's possible the decision will be

challenged in court, and in the meantime, he has the same advice that the center has been giving Haitian residents: to have a personal plan in case they are detained and to keep their documents in a secure place.

Dina Paul, who lives in Springfield during the tax season and helps Haitian residents with job applications, said one of her clients came in very stressed after the news broke. He was concerned that he won't be able to find work with the new expiration date of his status. She said she plans to research different companies that might be open to hiring people up until their expiration date.

"It's very unfortunate, and it's sad to see, because, you know, they're trying to create a better life for their family. So some of them came here a year, two years ago, had children here, and now, it's kind of like these kids are established. You know, they love their community," she said.

Paul said in August, she foresees drastic changes to the city, especially in the business community, car industry and with housing.

"I feel like these corporate companies are going to feel the changes within that industry. So a lot of (Haitians) when they come in here I look at their W2s, and a lot of them are working at factory jobs, car parts and glass and stuff like that. So I feel like they will most definitely feel the shift," she said.

Butler County Jail amends an agreement with ICE

The Butler County Sheriff's Office will be able to detain ICE arrestees as early as next week.

On Tuesday, county commissioners approved an amendment to the agreement between the sheriff's office and U.S. Marshals Service authorizing the jail to detain people facing deportation starting March 5. The sheriff's office will be paid \$68 per day and \$36 per hour to transport ICE detainees to the airport, according to the resolution passed by commissioners.

An ICE database says the agreement between the department and sheriff's office was signed Monday, but does not yet show the agreement.

Butler County Sheriff Richard Jones has been preparing for this renewed partnership since the 2024 presidential election. Jones previously told The Enquirer he was keeping 250 to 300 beds – around a third of the jail's total beds – available for people facing deportation.

The Butler County Jail has allowed ICE to use its jail since 2001, but Jones quit the program during former President Joe Biden's term.

The jail, located in Hamilton, Ohio, holds up to 848 maximum and medium-security inmates. Immigrants facing deportation will be detained together in a regular housing unit separate from local inmates.

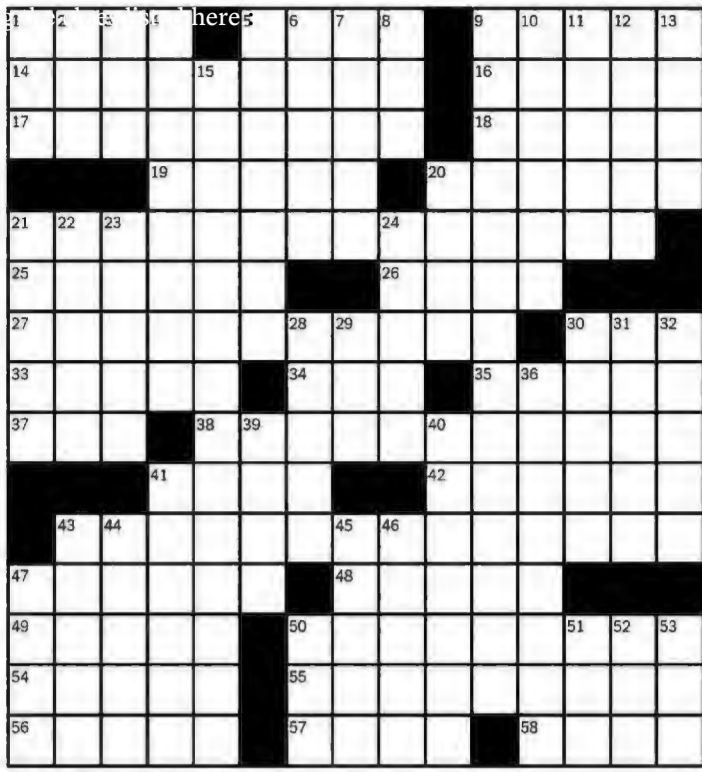

If they get married and I am asked to give a toast, should I mention the event that brought them together?

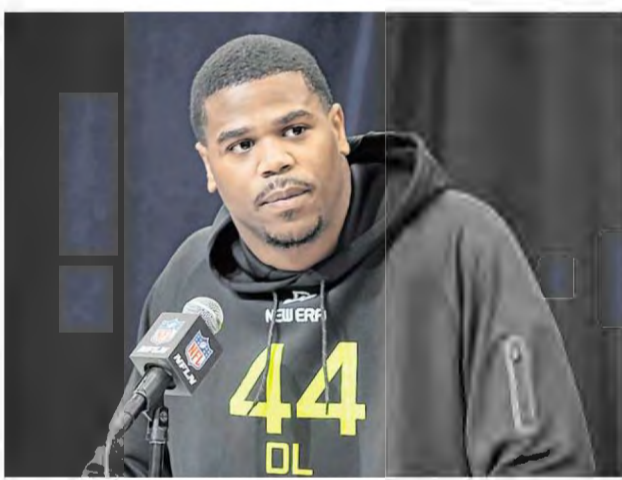

Potential top pick Carter advised against surgery

Doctors have advised potential No. 1 NFL draft pick Abdul Carter against having foot surgery, agent Drew Rosenhaus told ESPN on Thursday.

After tests Wednesday revealed a stress reaction in the former Penn State edge rusher's right foot, Rosenhaus said there were "mixed opinions" about whether he needed a pre-emptive procedure to insert a screw into his foot.

Following further scans on the All-American's foot, however, Rosenhaus said Thursday that the injury is now a "non-factor" in his client's draft status and that Carter will work out at Penn State's pro day on March 28.

"I couldn't be more confident that this will be a non-factor where he's drafted," Rosenhaus told ESPN. "He will put on a show at his pro day."

Carter had not been

expected to work out during this week's NFL Scouting Combine in Indianapolis due to a shoulder injury sustained in the College Football Playoff quarterfinal against Boise State in December.

The news about the foot injury came to light just hours after Carter said he felt it was "very realistic" that he would be the top overall pick of the draft.

"I feel like I'm the best player in the country. The best player should be selected No. 1," he said.

A consensus All-America selection and the 2024 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, Carter had 68 tackles, including 23.5 for loss to lead the FBS, plus 12 sacks and two forced fumbles in 16 games.

Carter, a former line-backer who moved this season to defensive end, had 172 career tackles — 41 for loss — along with 23 sacks and five forced fumbles in 42 games for Penn State the past three seasons.

A Lim Kim leads Hull by one in Singapore

South Korea's A Lim Kim opened the HSBC Women's World Championship with a 4-under-par 68 Thursday to lead England's Charley Hull by one stroke in Singapore. Kim and Hull were the

only players to shoot in the 60s amid the blustery conditions on the Tanjong course at Sentosa Golf Club.

"Today a lot of wind, and that's very hard for me but everybody has the same situation," said Kim, who carded five birdies with one bogey at the

par-5 16th hole.

"Tomorrow, I'm going to work harder. The wind is a lot of swirling and it's not consistent, so it was hard to read. But I have three more rounds to learn."

Kim hit 13 of 14 fairways to build her second first-round lead of 2025. She opened with a 65 and went on to win the Hilton Grand Vacations Tournament of Champions earlier this month in Orlando, Fla. Hull was one of two

players to post a bogey-free round along with South Korea's Amy Yang, who was one of seven tied for seventh at 1-under.

"Not too badly," Hull said when asked how the winds affected her play. "It was good. I quite enjoyed it. It was really fun out there. My boyfriend said to me, try to be inside like the top 5 by the first day to make him happy. I was just trying to like climb that leaderboard all the way around."
