- Q-2. Refer to the hearing testimony of Mr. Michael Seabourn on May 14, 2025. Provide the presentation(s) regarding PLEXOS and PROSYM prepared to compare actual information to the forecasted information as well as all workpapers used to compile the information in the presentations for the years 2022, 2023, and 2024.
- A-2. The Companies review PROSYM results, including comparisons of prospective forecasts to historical data, as part of their annual business planning process. These comparisons demonstrate the reasonableness of the Companies' forecasts. The Companies do not compare actual metrics to PROSYM forecasts for concurrent years because the variances between assumed and actual inputs make such a comparison less useful. The Companies have not included PLEXOS in these comparisons because they do not use it to prepare their business plans. Relevant slides from the Companies' annual business plan presentations and the supporting workpapers are attached. See the attachment being provided in a separate file. ### **Question No. 3**

Responding Witness: David L. Tummonds

- Q-3. Refer to IRP Volume I, Table 8-4 at 8-14 and 6-6, FN 38, in which LG&E/KU reference Mercer and Marion County solar projects moving forward. Also refer to Joint Application in Case No. 2022-00402 CPCN in which LG&E/KU, on page3, state: "the Mercer County Solar Facility is to be built and on-line in 2026," "the Brown BESS is to be built and on-line in 2026," and "the Marion County Solar Facility is to be built by BrightNight, LLC and purchased and on-line in 2027." The Companies' 2024-00326 IRP pointed to these renewables projects as moving forward despite the status of the solar PPAs. Provide an update to those projects including whether construction has begun, the current progress of construction, applicable, and whether the facilities will still be online in 2027.
- A-3. The Companies started construction of the Mercer County solar project in late April as noted in the communication on March 25, 2025. As noted in that communication, the Companies communicated emergency response information specific to this initial construction activity to local officials and notified residents and businesses within 2000' of the initial construction plan. Both communications noted that updates would be provided in advance of the Engineering, Procurement, and Construction ("EPC") activities on site. As previously noted, the Companies expect to execute that EPC agreement in June 2025 and expect the facility to be online in 2027.

Construction has not commenced on the Marion County solar project. The Companies expect the Marion facility to be online in 2027.
