APPLICATION

Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU"), pursuant to KRS 278.018(6), 807 KAR 5:001 Section 14, and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 22, hereby applies for approval of changes in its certified service territory as agreed to with Inter-County Energy Cooperative Corporation ("Inter-County Energy").

- 1. KU's mailing address is Kentucky Utilities Company, Post Office Box 32010, 220 West Main Street, Louisville, Kentucky 40202. KU may be reached by electronic mail at the electronic mail addresses of its counsel set forth below.
- 2. KU was incorporated in Kentucky on August 17, 1912, and in Virginia on November 26, 1991 (and effective as of December 1, 1991), and is in good standing in both Kentucky and Virginia.
- 3. KU is a public utility, as defined in KRS 278.010(3)(a), engaged in the electric business. KU generates and purchases electricity, and distributes and sells electricity at retail in the following counties in Central, Northern, Southeastern, and Western Kentucky:

5. <u>Description of Changes in Service Territory:</u>

As explained in this application and in the attached exhibits, KU and Inter-County Energy have individually agreed to the requested territorial changes for the tracts of land described below (Application Exhibit 1). One tract includes new rick houses located in Lancaster, Kentucky owned by Green Bomber Distillery. A second tract includes existing residential subdivision homes, a mobile home park and a Sonic restaurant located in Stanford, Kentucky. The proposed territorial boundary changes serve the purposes of KRS 278.016. The changes avoid the wasteful duplication of facilities, the unnecessary encumbrance of the landscape, and minimize disputes between retail electric providers. No existing customer will change electric provider.

Lancaster, KY - Green Bomber Distillery

When the two utilities learned of the distillery's plan to add new rickhouse storage buildings, to be constructed at 450 Southern Soul Way in Lancaster, Kentucky (Quadrant Map 30-G-2), the KU and Inter-County Energy engineering staffs together reviewed and studied the planned expansion to determine which utility was best situated to serve the new customer. Since KU currently provides electric service to the distillery and has existing distribution facilities in the immediate area, KU and InterCounty have agreed to redraw the boundary to allow KU to extend its electric service, even though the new buildings will be located in what is currently InterCounty's Territory. As is normal protocol in situations where a new development spans across multiple utilities' service territories, the two utilities agreed to redraw the certified service territory boundary line in order to efficiently and to fairly align with the property lines. The proposed boundary line will allow KU to prudently extend its existing electrical distribution system to reliably serve the rickhouses. See Application Exhibit 2 and Application Exhibit 2a.

Stanford, Kentucky – various properties

Upon review of the maps in this area, KU and Inter-County Energy realized that certain parcels on the Commission's certified Quadrant Map 30-G-3, do not reflect the reality of which utility is currently serving certain lots in two main areas off of U.S. Highway 27 in Stanford, Kentucky. Inter-County Energy has been serving these properties for over 10 years, and has existing distribution facilities in the area, although the Quadrant Map shows the properties in KU's certified territory. KU has historically found that these types of situations (where a utility has been inadvertently serving outside of its service territory) typically occurred prior to the current GPS coordinate system that is in widespread use today. When it discovers such circumstances, KU seeks to correct the territorial boundaries to accurately reflect which utility is providing service. See Application Exhibit 3 and Application Exhibit 3a.

Therefore, in this application, KU and Inter-County Energy seek to rectify and to move (and notate on the Quadrant map) the official boundary line to match the existing property lot lines served by Inter-County Energy. No customers will change providers.

The territorial maps and other attachments provided constitute the entire agreement between KU and Inter-County Energy.

6. <u>Agreement and Maps</u>:

Application Exhibit 1 of this filing includes the summary list identifying KU and Inter-County Energy personnel familiar with the specifics of the facilities available, the reason for the proposed change (purposes served under KRS 278.016), and the agreement signed by both parties for the properties involved. Application Exhibit 2 includes the signed territorial Buckeye 30-G-2 quadrant map. Application Exhibit 2a includes the corresponding signed detailed site map. Application Exhibit 3 includes the signed territorial Stanford 30-G-3 quadrant map. Application

Exhibit 3a includes the corresponding signed detailed site map.

WHEREFORE, KU hereby requests, pursuant to KRS 278.018, that the Commission enter an Order approving the updates to the Quadrant Maps to reflect the current requested service territory changes and the agreements between KU and Inter-County Energy.

BOUNDARY CHANGE AGREEMENT

Kentucky Utilities Company (KU) and Inter-County Energy Cooperative Corporation (Inter-County Energy) hereby agree to two territorial boundary changes. One boundary line includes the expansion of rickhouses in an existing commercial development in Lancaster, KY (located in Garrard County). A second boundary line includes correcting an existing boundary line in Stanford, KY (located in Lincoln County).

The Green Bomber (All Nations Bourbon) Distillery is planning to construct storage rickhouses just north of their existing facility in Lancaster, KY. KU and Inter-County Energy agree that KU has current electric facilities in the immediate area and KU can efficiently extend those facilities to serve the rickhouses.

A group of existing homes and a Sonic restaurant are located in Stanford, Kentucky; currently located in KU service territory yet served by Inter-County Energy. KU and Inter-County Energy agree to redraw the official territorial line to rectify the boundary line confirming that which area Inter-County Energy is serving.

Both boundary changes avoid the wasteful duplication of facilities and unnecessary encumbering of the landscape as well as minimizes disputes between retail electric providers.
