Winter storm looms as flood cleanup continues **District 10** counties

JACKSON, Ky. – As cleanup continues from weekend flooding that affected roads in nearly all of the 10 counties in the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) Department of Highways District 10, an approaching winter storm will result in difficult travel conditions.

Drivers are urged to stay off area roads beginning Tuesday night, Feb. 18, maybe longer, as snow moves into the area, followed by bitterly cold temperatures. The effectiveness of salt and other melting agents will be hampered by the low tem-

peratures, and any roads that remain wet from high water, snow melt, or runoff will refreeze after sunset.

Creeks and rivers remain high from the weekend's rain, and a number of roads in Estill County remain flooded by backwater. A driver who skids off icy pavement into one of those streams, or drives into standing floodwaters, is taking an unnecessary risk that puts themselves and emergency responders in danger. Motorists are warned not to drive past "Road Closed" signs in areas where KYTC personnel have placed barricades. When water has receded to the point where a road is safe for travel, the barricades will be removed and drivers can legally use the route.

One road remain closed due to major breaks in pavement that resulted from the weekend's precipitation. KY 1162 in Morgan County is closed at milepoint 1.1. KY 2022 in Perry County was closed at milepoint 4.2,

but that road has been repaired to the point where it is passable for traffic. A number of other roads have suffered breaks that have closed single lanes, including KY 28 near Chavies and KY 80 in the Big Creek area in Perry County.

Crews in each of District 10's counties are staying past their normal hours today to continue doing flood damage repairs and to be prepared for the onset of snow, which is predicted to begin overnight.

General road condition updates are posted on KYTC District 10's Facebook and X (formerly Twitter) pages. Follow these social media outlets for the most recent updates. Road status details are also available at goky. ky.gov.

District 10 includes Breathitt, Estill, Lee, Magoffin, Menifee, Morgan, Owsley, Perry, Powell, and Wolfe counties in east-central and southeastern Kentucky.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE



Keeping up with the state legislature: A how-to guide

When the General Assembly convenes each year for their regular legislative session, it often feels like we move at a break-neck pace. Dozens of bills are filed every day, committees are meeting and debating, and bills and resolutions come before the full House for consideration. To be honest, we work hard to keep focused and I am regularly reminded why we do so much work during the months between sessions.

It can be undeniably

can also use the tabs along the upper righthand side of the page to access the full pages of each chamber in order to see a list of all senators and all representatives.

Alternatively, the third tab in the upper righthand side of the page titled "Who's My Legislator" will take you to a searchable map of Kentucky. Simply enter your street address, click on your home, and scroll back to the top of the page to identify your senator or representative. Click on their name, and vou will be taken to their individual profile. This profile includes a short biography as well as their list of committees and caucuses. On the righthand side you can also find additional tabs to find bills we have sponsored, contact information, and any active legislative surveys. Committees: Going back to the main welcome page and clicking on the "committees" tab on the top bar will take you to the committee welcome page. Here you can find a general explanation of each committee type, the daily legislative calendar, and the 2025 regular session calendar. The daily legislative calendar is the most used feature of this page as it gives the name, time, and location of any committees that are scheduled to meet that day. You can find a list of committees organized by type through any of the tabs on the righthand side of the committee welcome page. For example, by clicking on the House Standing Committee page you can find links to each committee's individual profile. These profiles give a brief overview of the committee's scope, membership, and materials. Bills: By clicking on "bills," you can find the legislative record for each session of the General Assembly. For information concerning this year, click the link titled "2025 Regular Session." From there, you should see a page full of links. It may seem intimidating, but do not fret; it looks more complicated than it actually is.

the page. From here, you can see a full list of numbers that each link to their respective house bill. For House Bill 1, you simply click the number "1" on the page in order to be taken to the bill's individual profile.

However, let's say you do not remember the number of House Bill 1. Instead, all you know is that it somehow would affect the individual income tax rate. No need to worry, as back on the 2025 Regular Session page you can find all the bills organized in a subject index. Under the "Miscellaneous" heading on the righthand side of the page, click on the link titled "Bill and Amendment Index Headings." From here, all the subject headings from "accountants" to "workforce" are arranged alphabetically. Simply scroll to the letter and find the subject heading in question to be taken to a list containing all the bills that concern that subject (in our case, we will look under "T" and click on "taxation"). This list is also arranged alphabetically, so be sure to read carefully in order to find the bill you are looking for. Again, with this example we must scroll nearly to the bottom to find House Bill 1, linked under the heading "Tax rate reduction, individual income tax." I hope that this guide was helpful in navigating our website. I sincerely thank you for your civic engagement, and I hope that you will continue to keep up with the activities of myself and my colleagues throughout the remainder of this regular session. overwhelming from the outside looking in and I wanted to use my legislative update this week to help clear the fog, and present to you a "how-to guide" on keeping up with our day-to-day activities. At the heart of this is our website, legislature.ky.gov.

Operated by the Legislative Research Commission (LRC), our website contains an unmatched wealth of information that is updated daily to reflect all the moving parts of the legislative process. It also contains several important databases that contain current state law, regulations, our state constitution, and other records as well as contact information for each member of the General Assembly.

Getting started: When you go to legislature. ky.gov, you will be greeted with a welcome page. At the top is a bar with seven different tabs to choose from: legislators; committees, bills; Kentucky law; public service; Legislative Research Commission; and visitors and education. Each of these tabs leads to a subsection of the website concerning the subject in question, but the first three contain almost all the information that is commonly sought.

Legislators: Under the legislators tab you will find information on members from both chambers of the state legislature: the Kentucky Senate and Kentucky House of Representatives. On this page, you can go directly to the individual profiles of members of leadership such as the Speaker of the House. You

So I just wanted to take this quick moment to let everyone know I'm thinking about you and I'm praying for you. another competitive sport option. It's about giving our kids a chance to excel in different athletic fields."

The board also reviewed proposed updates to the district's school calendar, transitioning from a variable school calendar to a traditional one.

"We have to focus on what's best for the students," Housekeeper said. "That means increasing instructional days and ensuring our kids get the most out of their time in school. While we understand the transition may be an adjustment for families, our priority is the educational success of our students."

During the financial report, the board discussed tax collections and budgetary projections.

"We're making strides," Finance Officer Dalton Sizemore commented. "Our collection rate has improved from last year, and we are hopeful we will reach our goal by the end of the school year."

District Human Resources Director Carrie Hamlin announced new hires, including instructional assistants and bus monitors. She also noted a resignation, adding, "We still have two staff members on FMLA, but we are working to ensure all positions are adequately filled. We are also looking at additional staffing solutions to prevent any disruptions in our student services."

The board approved a salary adjustment for sporting event workers, raising their hourly wage to \$15. The approval of increased ticket prices for district basketball tournaments was also finalized, with general admission set at \$10 and reserve seating at \$15.

"The costs of running these events keep rising, and we have to adjust accordingly," explained Coach Jerry Herron. "We want to make sure we can continue offering high-quality athletic experiences for our students."

In closing remarks, Housekeeper expressed appreciation for the board's commitment to student success.

"It's about putting students first and making sure they have every opportunity to thrive," she said.

Lawmakers return to Frankfort for part two of session

Lawmakers returned to Frankfort on February 4 to resume the 2025 Regular Session and got right to work filing several bills, meeting with constituents, and attending committee meetings.

The biggest victory of the week was the Senate passage of legislation that will make Kentucky more competitive by lowering the state's individual income tax to 3.5 percent as of January 2026. This measure is the next step in the legislature's efforts to leave more money in the pockets of Kentuckians, empowering them to save, invest, and spend in ways that benefit their own communities. This measure not only helps Kentuckians, but also strengthens Kentucky's economic competitiveness, making it an even more attractive place to work. A lower income tax fosters

growth, creates jobs, and ensures that our state remains on a path toward sustained prosperity. HB 1 continues the House Majority's efforts to eliminate the individual income tax entirely. In 2018, the General Assembly first acted to decrease the individual income tax rate from 6 percent to 5 percent, which resulted in historic economic growth, as well as record job creation and state revenue. Lawmakers passed legislation HB 8 22RS that lays the groundwork to eliminate the individual income tax entirely but includes preset triggers that must be met before the legislature can move to decrease the tax in half a percentage point increments. These triggers essentially hold funding for state programs and agencies harmless. I am pleased to share that the bill was signed into law just a day after the House and Senate sent it

to the Governor's desk. We were, of course, prepared to override another veto if necessary.

As session continues, I look forward to discussing the legislation we are working on, especially how it will help bring about change throughout the Commonwealth. I wanted to take some time to inform you about some of the bills passed out of committee.

Teacher Red Tape Reduction Act: Members of the House Education Committee approved HB 48, which would remove burdensome administrative policies and standards that take a teacher's time away from the students in the classroom. This measure would standardize professional development schedules, reduce the frequency of summative evaluations, and remove unnecessary requirements set by the Kentucky Department of Education to give teachers more time to focus on instruction.

Landon's Law/Choking

Safety in Schools: Another bill passed by committee this week was HB 44, also known as Landon's Law. The measure would require schools to train staff to use antichoking devices if they have purchased the equipment. Qualified staff would also receive instruction on the proper technique of the Heimlich maneuver. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) recommends that schools have anti-choking devices to improve student safety and comply with the American Disabilities Act (ADA). In addition, the anti-choking device manufacturer LifeVac provides schools with a free choking rescue device upon request. This device is registered and regulated by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

Individual Liberty: HB 27 also passed committee this week, which would clarify existing law on planned communities to prohibit all homeowner associations from banning political yard signs. The bill maintains the authority of associations to regulate size and duration of political yard signs, while primarily protecting the first amendment rights of home-

owners. Protecting Elections: House Elections, Constitutional Amendments, and Intergovernmental Affairs approved legislation, HB 45, aimed at bringing consistency in election laws banning foreign nationals from attempting to influence our elections via donations and political advertising. Foreign nationals are already banned from donating to influence candidate elections, and this law would extend that ban to proposed ballot measures, like the constitutional amendments that were on our November ballot.

Celebrating Kentucky's Rich History: Members of the House State Government Committee approved HB 313, which would designate the month of June as "Kentucky History Month."

utive Chris "Roo" Elleman provided an update on the recent flooding that affected various areas in the county, citing Camp Nelson as the most impacted location. Local authorities and emergency management teams have been actively monitoring water levels and coordinating response efforts to ensure the safety of residents and minimize damage.

According to the Garrard County Emergency Management Agency (EMA), water levels at Camp Nelson RV Park and Marina have started to decline, but officials continue to monitor conditions closely. Residents and visitors are advised to steer clear of the area as crews work to assess potential dangers and ensure the stability of roads and property.

Two days ago, Camp Nelson RV Park was fully evacuated by its owners in anticipation of rising river levels, which had reached 35.63 feet with projections of hitting 40 feet by the following afternoon.

Elleman confirmed that while evacuations were necessary at Camp Nelson, the situation was largely under control.

We evacuated them. Had some campers that wasn't drivable on roads, but we did get them onto the hill there," he stated.

Road closures were put in place to prevent further complications, though access to some areas remained limited. As a precautionary measure, Old Lexington Road East was closed at the base of the hill, with access limited strictly to property owners. Authorities have requested that the public avoid the area due to increased hazards from the flooding.

Water levels on the Kentucky River remain a concern, with officials tracking a crest expected on Friday. Initially predicted to reach 40 feet, the latest estimates suggest a peak of 37 to 38 feet.

"They bumped it to Friday because we're getting a lot of this Eastern Kentucky water," Elleman explained, attributing rising levels to upstream releases.

In addition to flooding concerns at the RV park, a major roadway near the Garrard-Lincoln County line remains impassable. Heavy rainfall caused the bridge on Old Danville Road to be submerged, creating hazardous conditions for drivers. Officials have reinforced the message that attempting to cross flooded roadways can be lifethreatening.

The public is reminded of the "Turn Around, Don't Drown" warning, emphasizing that even shallow-looking water can be dangerous, potentially stalling vehicles or sweeping them away.

Paint Lick, another area prone to flooding, fared better than expected. While floodwaters reached the Sportsman's Club property, they did not enter buildings, and the water levels receded quickly. Several roads, including those near Buckeve Creek and Hurt Lane, were temporarily submerged but were cleared by Sunday. Elleman noted that farm areas such as Cathole Bend experienced flooding, but no residents were stranded.

Emergency management agencies in Garrard and Jessamine counties worked together to monitor and track a runaway marina that drifted along the Kentucky River due to recent high water levels. The floating structure, which broke free under unclear circumstances was observed traveling past multiple

Emergency personnel kept a close watch on potential hazards, including debris impacting bridges. The old bridge at Camp Nelson, in particular, raised concerns due to fiber optic lines and structural risks, but no significant damage has been reported.

Garrard County Emergency Management Agency (EMA) shared images of the marina taken by local resident Christy Ellis, who spotted it passing by her farm. The agency expressed gratitude for community members' vigilance and assistance in documenting the event.

Jessamine County Emergency Management (JCEMA) also played a key role in monitoring the drifting marina. According to JCEMA, multiple boats and structures became wedged along the riverbanks in Garrard County near Camp Nelson, while at least one was recovered by its owner. Officials believe that the main portions of the runaway marina have now cleared Jessamine County, though some dislodged debris may remain along the river.

Beyond the flooding, emergency crews responded to multiple fires, including one on Mount Hebron that was quickly contained and another on Kennedy Bridge that resulted in a fatality. The recent extreme weather conditions have also necessitated road maintenance efforts, with crews working to clear culverts and remove debris.

Officials are preparing for additional weather challenges, including potential winter conditions that could bring four to six inches of snow. Road departments have been using salt treatments, but temperatures below 15 degrees Fahrenheit could limit their effectiveness.

Alcaraz posts hard-fought

win at Doha tourney

World No. 3 Carlos Alcaraz found himself trailing in the second set to Croatia's Marin Cilic, but battled back for a 6-4, 6-4 win Monday in the opening round at the Qatar ExxonMobil Open in Doha.

With Cilic - the former World No. 3 - on the verge of taking a 5-3 lead in the second set, Alcaraz rebounded while serving at 0-40 down and notched 14 of the next 19 points to seal the victory. Alcaraz, who saved five of six break points, will face World No. 7 Novak Djokovic of Croatia if both reach the semifinals.

Czech Jiri Lehecka upset No. 7 seed Grigor Dimitrov of Bulgaria 6-4, 6-4, taking 35 of 40 firstserve points (88 percent) and saving both break points he faced. Other first-round winners included No. 8 seed Jack Draper of Great Britain, Fabian Marozsan of Hungary and Australia's Christopher O'Connell.

Rio Open: Taiwanese qualifier Chun-Hsin Tseng stunned third-seeded Alejandro Tabilo of Chile 6-2, 7-5 in the first round at Rio de Janeiro.

Tseng, ranked 125th in the world, finished with a 6-0 edge in aces en route to the 1-hour, 36-minute victory

Another Chilean, sixthseeded Nicolas Jarry, rallied for a 4-6, 6-3, 6-4 win over Argentine qualifier Juan Manuel Cerundolo.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE:

Week in Review: Lawmakers pass and consider legislation during the 2025 Regular Session

This week, legislators remained busy by filing and passing legislation, attending committee meetings, and meeting with constituents.

On Tuesday, the House convened at the Old State Capitol, which was completed in 1830 and used until 1910. The Old State Capitol is the third of four capitol buildings in the state and represents an important chapter in Kentucky's history and the history of its General Assembly. While at the Old State Capitol, the House passed HB 313, which would designate June as "Kentucky History Month" in Kentucky.

The bill will now move to the Senate for consider-

ation.

Several other pieces of legislation also passed the House and will now move to the Senate for consideration including:

House Bill 15: HB 15 would allow a person who is at least 15-years-old to apply for a driver's instruction permit. Currently, Kentucky law allows individuals aged 16 and older to apply for a driver's instruction permit, which this measure aims to lower to 15. Kentucky's neighboring states allow teens to apply for instruction permits at 15 or 15 ¹/₂. Additionally, this measure would require that an individual be 16 and have held an instruction permit for 180 days before obtaining an intermediate license. They must then hold their intermediate license for 180 days before applying for an operator's license. Ultimately, this bill would allow an individual to obtain their operator's license six months earlier, at the age of 16 ¹/₂, instead of 17 as allowed under current law. Additionally, the bill would extend the validity of a driver's instruction permit from three years to four years.

House Bill 44: HB 44, also known as "Landon's Law", would address choking incidents in schools by mandating that if a school acquires an anti-choking device, cafeteria staff and other designated users, such as school nurses, must be trained in its proper use. In addition, it would provide civil immunity to any individual who attempts to administer emergency care using an anti-choking device or performing the Heimlich maneuver. HB 44 applies to both public and private schools across the Commonwealth.

House Bill 45: HB 45 would bring consistency in election laws banning foreign nationals from attempting to influence our elections via donations and political advertising. Foreign nationals are already banned from donating to influence candidate elections, and this law would extend that ban to proposed ballot measures, like the constitutional amendments that were on our November ballot. House Bill 191: HB 191 would expand interment eligibility in Kentucky state veterans' cemeteries to include eligible National Guard and Reserve service members and their families.

House Bill 263: HB 263 would clarify residency requirements for eligible student-teachers through the Student Teacher Stipend Program administered by the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority. During the 2024 Regular Session, the General Assembly successfully passed HB 377, which established the Student Teacher Stipend Program and Teacher Recruitment Student Loan Forgiveness Pilot Program. The General Assembly enacted these programs to support future educators' journey to the classroom. HB 263 clarifies legislation that focuses on the determination of student residency, the distribution of the funds from the stipend program, and criteria for students conducting their student teaching outside of Kentucky.

Additionally, several bills and resolutions passed out of committee this week and moved to the House Floor including:

House Bill 24: HB 24 would add specificity to the definition of "special purpose governmental entity" to include soil and water conservation services. It would also require an audit of accounts of each soil and water conservation district to take place once every four years unless the soil and water conservation district receives or expends \$1 million or more in any year, in which case the soil and water conservation district shall conduct an annual audit.

House Bill 30: HB 30 would exclude from pension spiking provisions any pay increases that are approved or funded by the employer's legislative or administrative body, or required by a collective bargaining agreement approved by the *(SEE TRUETT - PAGE 11)*

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Silence, safety, service, and signage highlight last Thursday's Fiscal Court meeting

A MOMENT OF SILENCE:

Bourbon County Fiscal Court's meeting last Thursday began with a moment of silence in honor of former Judge Executive Donnie Foley who passed away last week. The court also honored him with a proclamation naming February 13 as "Judge Executive Donald Ray "Donnie" Foley Day in Paris and Bourbon County. They also approved funding a portrait of former Judge Foley to hang among other county judges on the walls of the Bourbon County Courthouse.

SAFETY ISSUES:

"The jail is not safe", remarked Jail Administrator Sam Norris of the Bourbon County Detention Center. He appealed to the Fiscal Court for funding for badge readers/security set-up for jail employees. He explained that with a small staff, watching and reading surveillance cameras on both inmates and those coming in and out of the jail is not efficient. He said the doors are opening constantly with attorneys, food service, court appointees, etc. "We really need two people in the tower", he added. But with the badge readers, those entering and leaving will not distract from the cameras on the cells, plus the system would create a log of those coming and going. Magistrate Louis Stubblefield agreed with the badge reader purchase: "It's very important, especially from a safety standpoint." The Fiscal Court authorized advertising for bids to install this system.

The court accepted a bid from Hinkle Contracting for construction of turning lanes into the Park on U.S. 68, Millersburg Road. Approved was for \$292,000 for the project. The new construction will create a safer vehicular entrance and exit to and from the park.

With Phase 2 of the new Bourbon County Park at hand, the court approved advertising for turf material for the park, as well as approved the agreement with CMW for services within the Park for Design and Construction of Phase 2. They also authorized Terracon Consultants, Inc. to provide construction materials testing services which include earthwork and site prep observations and testing...at a cost of \$56,300.00.

120 YEARS OF SERVICE:

• Approved a proclamation for February 16, 2025 that celebrates the Paris-Bourbon County Library's 120 years of service to this community. The library began in 1905, explained Judge Mike Williams from funds set aside for libraries by Andrew Carnegie. In 2014-2015 the library added another building. Judge Williams commended the efforts of library director Mark Adler and his staff and volunteers as well as encouraged folks to patronize the facility.

NEW SIGNAGE:

The Fiscal Court approved a committee to determine the placement of a historical marker on the Courthouse lawn that notates lynchings that happened after the Civil War. The marker, currently with the Kentucky Transportation Department is already paid for and was a request by Tessa Bishop Hoggard, formerly of Paris. The marker reads (there are two sides) as follows:

LYNCHING IN BOURBON COUNTY

In 1866, 1889, & 1901, white mobs hanged 3 local Black men who were denied due process and equal justice under the law. Bertram Thomas, Jim Kelly, & George T. Carter were executed without trial after they were accused of crimes. Prejudice and resistance to social & political changes in Ky. after the Civil War fueled the white mobs' violent actions.

LYNCHING IN BOURBON COUNTY

Thomas, Kelly, and Carter are but three names in a long list of the Black men executed in Ky. after the Civil War. From 1865 to 1940, mobs lynched over 353 people in Ky., 258 (73 percent) of whom were African American. Likely undercounted, the individuals killed in Bourbon Co. and across Ky. illustrate ongoing resistance to Black freedom after 1865.

The Court also discussed the now-working four-way stop at Centerville. Judge Williams commented on the unique turn lanes there and Judge Williams speculated that at some point, it may be a roundabout instead of a four-way stop.

Judge Williams also shared that Fish and Wildlife has place signage in Millersburg in reference to the new Hinkson Creek Boat Ramp. There will be a ribbon cutting at a later date.

IN OTHER BUSINESS THE COURT:

•Formed a committee to work with local schools regarding Park property use. Those on the committee are Tony Sosby, Bart Horne and Scott Wells. With area schools requesting use of the courts, some organization – calendar, costs, obligations expected - needed to be in place. This also would relate to agriculture departments which also utilize the park.

• Approved minutes from the January 26 and the joint meeting on the 28th

• Approved Financials.

•Approved the declaration of two vehicles as surplus property that will be advertised for sale.

• Approved the seeking of bids for HVAC Work at the Judicial Center.

 Approved second reading and adoption of two budget amendments.

• Approved Wednesday, February 26, 3:30 p.m. as a budget workshop.

 Agreed to move the opioid account to an interest-bearing account.

• A check for \$1000 was presented the Fiscal Court from David Rankin VFW Post 257, Millersburg, to support maintenance and cost of fuel for the Eternal Flame at the Vietnam Memorial on the Courthouse lawn.

6. Solid Waste and Recycling Center

"Do not call it a transfer station," warned Judge Williams...it's a lot more than that.

Williams recalled how a situation was changed, moving a 'dump' from a neighborhood which in turn motivated the creation of a new facility. The new facility nears completion... "soon." And what about where the old facility was? ...Well, plans are in the works for its reclamation.

7. High speed Internet

Another project in the works, explained Judge Williams is working with Charter Spectrum for enhancing broadband infrastructure in Bourbon County. The plan is that every household can have access to the service and the goal is to have it done by the end of May...early summer. "You don't have to buy it, but it's there if you want it."

* * *

At the end of the County Judge's talk, Mary Caldwell asked if the public could drive through the new Bourbon County Park to take a look at it. "Yes you can," he responded.

Laura Jackson expressed concern about Bourbon County's ag department which utilizes facilities at the Park. The judge explained that the ag department was using it on a temporary arrangement but "once the park it is developed, it will move to another area."

* * * *

Paris Mayor John Plummer took the podium and acknowledged and thanked all who made the annual event possible...from all forms of city and county government, groups like tourism and first responders as well as citizens of Bourbon County and volunteers.

He also noted the importance of the Rotary Club of Paris who sponsored the event.

"Founded in 1923 the club lists numerous activities and work in the community." Mayor Plummer cited the backpack program, scholarships, Run for The Roses, Veterans' Dinner, Christmas Concert, renovation of a city parking lot, and a pickleball tournament. "I'm proud to serve as mayor...and everybody is working together to improve and develop," making a better place "for our children and grandchildren."

"We have 138 employees who make successes a collective effort" within the city, began City Manager Jamie Miller. She presented a slide show of some of the newer projects within the City of Paris, which began with statistics that show a total population of 10,143, 4,050 households and a median household income of \$46,752. The slide also indicated that there is 3.4% unemployment in the city. **1. Installation of a 10-8 CAD System** for E-911 efficiency. **2. PAYMENTUS** – a better means to access the City and pay utilities... "to make it more simple." grade, \$800,000 distribution system upgrades, sewer line repairs, and US 460 waterline relocation, to list a few.

5. Transfer Station: "Don't call it that anymore!" Putting it in an industrial location was extremely important and she said it should open this spring. What happens next to the old site? Using federal assistance - Brownfield program is doing assessments, historical documentation of how it has been used and from there, then phase two will include soil testing to analyze and based on those results will be a plan of clean up. Then it's our turn to dream and visualize what we want the property to look like, she said.

6. Revenue and Tax Rates: 4,526 tax bills were issued with approximately 71% received early; awarded \$1,978,000 in Grant Funds and applied for \$4 million in grants.

7. Major Policy Initiatives included Cannabis licenses, entertainment destination corridor (which will allow alcohol beverages during certain events downtown), parking regulations, and an overlay district (which provides development standards for neighborhoods like those affected in the Westside area).

8. Electric: Upgraded the electric distribution system, running 44 miles of electric, 2,035 utility poles with seven on the staff.

9. Water, sewer: Treatment of 762,000,000 or more gallons of water and distributing 751,000,000 gallons of water for public consumption, water treatment within standards set by EPA. Reported were 46 water leak calls, 42 sewer calls, and 88 new services established.

10. Public Works: The City has repaved nine streets and maintained 40 miles of others, had 605 code violations in 2024, managed and maintained the City's beautification program by the greenspace in front of City Hall; and the hometown Hero display, snow plowing and maintaining safe and clean road infrastructure.

11. Police: The department saw 27,835 calls for service and provided aid to 115 children during Shop With A Hero, initiated a special response team, drug recognition experts, accident reconstruction, flock cameras, and offers the Citizen Police Academy. "The police department is seeing a real shift in community policing"...and there are 12 Fire/EMS personnel. There were over 3,400 calls for service in Bourbon County, purchased a new fire truck and secured over \$75,000 in grants for received equipment. 60% of the department are paramedics. "We also established a junior firefighter program this year."

12. Future Development – City Manager Miller knows the importance is increasing housing in our community...and shared some of the newer developments in Paris: Magnolia Trace, Bourbon Oaks, Clintonville Trace, Providence Place, and the Baker Property. Commercially, the city is reporting mini storage units, car wash, distillery, Sterling Health Care, new businesses along with expansions and renovations. Miller also shared staff accomplishments which included: promotions, additional paramedic licenses, fire academy graduates, dispatcher certifications, police academy graduates, wastewater collections, and water treatment licenses, Kentucky League of Cities training, stormwater management certification and FEMA training.

'that we are here to do business in an ethical way.'

Each of the event's speakers shared that government leaders are working to secure the best for Bourbon Countians to which Judge Mike Williams advised: "You all want to see high standards in Paris and Bourbon County? ... Well that's our obligation to you as leaders. Be supportive of decisions that elected officials make."



3. Preventive Maintenance...She explained that the city is trying to take a more preventive position than a reactive one.

ORDINANCE NO. 2025-01

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COAL RUN VILLAGE, KENTUCKY RELATING TO A TAX LEVY ON 2025 REAL PROPERTY TAXES, FOR THE GENERAL OPERATING EXPENSE PURPOSES OF THE CITY OF COAL RUN VILLAGE, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Coal Run Village, Kentucky, in order to help ease the financial burden of its citizens brought on by the record inflation, finds it necessary to adopt the following Ordinance:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF COAL RUN VILLAGE, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The County assessment of real property situated in the City of Coal Run Village, will be adopted for the year of 2025.

Section 2. For the purpose of helping to ease the financial burden brought on by the record inflation, including rising prices for gas, grocery, and other essential items, the City of Coal Run Village for the fiscal year July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026 will levy a tax rate of 0.0000 of the assessed property value.

Section 3. This Ordinance is passed pursuant to, in compliance with, and by virtue of the authority of the following constitutional and statutory provisions: Kentucky Constitution Sections 157,170 and 181; Kentucky Revised Statutes 92.160, 92.170, 92.330, 136.280 and 142.020.

Section 4. Any word, phrase section, or subsection of this Ordinance declared by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. All ordinances, or any parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby expressly repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall become effective upon adoption and publication as required by law.

The first reading of this Ordinance was held on January 9, 2025 and a second reading was held at a regular called meeting on February 13, 2025.
