Good morning, Commissioner Hatton & Jeb. It is our understanding that Assurance Wireless, a subsidiary of T-Mobile, has or will be applying to the Kentucky Public Service Commission to receive funding from the Kentucky Universal Service Fund (KUSF) for its Lifeline subscribers.

Assurance is in full compliance with the Kentucky 911 Services Board's remittance requirements, including current surcharges and retroactive fees assigned in accordance with the Board's June 2024 determination to reinstate collection of Lifeline fees and to retroactively collect wireless Lifeline 911 fees to April 2021. Because this provider is in full compliance with KRS 65.7636, as Administrator of the Kentucky 911 Services Board, I support Assurance Wireless's application to access funding from the KUSF for its Lifeline subscribers.
