VERIFIED APPLICATION

Comes now Union County Water District ("Union County Water"), by and through the undersigned counsel, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001 Section 19 and other applicable law, and does hereby submit its Application for the Commission to declare that Union County Water does not need a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CPCN") to repair or replace its water tower or its chlorine pump house after suffering damage after a tornado struck Union County, Kentucky. Union County Water also is seeking a declaratory order that it does not need to post an advertisement for bids before receiving estimates for the repairs. Union County Water is respectfully requesting the Commission to issue its decision as quickly as possible due to the time sensitive nature of repairing/replacing the water tank on the water tower and the chlorine pump house. As grounds for this Application, Union County Water respectfully states as follows:

INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

On May 16, 2025 an EF-3 tornado touched down in Union County, Kentucky. The tornado caused widespread damage throughout Union County. Union County Water's Davis Water Tower located on Robinson Road was damaged. The top of the tank has collapsed inward. At this time, the tank is still operational, but will need to be repaired/replaced. In addition to the Davis Water Tower, Union County Water's chlorine pump house was damaged.

REQUEST FOR DECLARATORY ORDER

Union County Water requests the Commission issue a declaratory order confirming that Union County Water does not need a CPCN to repair/replace its Davis Water Tower or its chlorine pump house. Union County Water's insurance company, Tokio Marine, will be covering the costs of the replacement and/or repairs to the damaged property. Union County Water is seeking FEMA assistance for the insurance deductible, or any other costs Union County Water may incur that are not recoverable through insurance. Union County Water received a CPCN to build the Davis Water Tower in Case No. 1999-00160. Union County Water will need to remove and replace the top of the Davis Water Tower as soon as possible to continue to provide safe and reliable water service to its customers. Union County Water will be repairing and/or replacing the Davis Water Tower on the same site as it exists today and will also be repairing and/or replacing the chlorine pump house in the same location as it exists today. Tokio Marine and/or FEMA will be paying for the replacement and/or repair of the Davis Water Tower and the chlorine pump house. Since this is strictly a replacement or repair of existing buildings that are necessary due to a tornado, Union County Water does not believe that it needs to file an application for a CPCN for these projects. In addition, Union County Water normally must advertise for bids prior to receiving estimates on this type of project. Due to the state of emergency that was declared, Union County Water does not believe it needs to advertise for bids prior to receiving estimates on these projects.

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, Union County Water respectfully requests that the Commission enter a declaratory order declaring that Union County Water does not need a CPCN for the
