Kentucky Power Company’s Motion to Recess Hearing After Public Comment and to Amend Witness List in Consideration of Tendered Settlement Agreement

Kentucky Power Company (“Kentucky Power” or “Company”) respectfully moves the Public Service Commission of Kentucky (“Commission”) to recess the evidentiary hearing beginning on January 13, 2026, for one day, after public comments are taken at the beginning of the hearing on January 13, 2026. The purpose of the recess is to give the Commission additional time to review the Settlement Agreement and accompanying Kentucky Power witness testimony filed on January 9, 2026. The Company also respectfully requests that the Commission grant Kentucky Power leave to amend its Witness List previously filed on December 30, 2025, to allow an additional witness, Katharine I. Walsh,¹ to testify in support of the Company’s Settlement Agreement, and to update the order of witnesses previously indicated in the December 30, 2025 Witness List.

In support of this motion, Kentucky Power states as follows:

Kentucky Power, the other parties to this case, and Commission Staff began participating in settlement discussions in December 2025. Since that time, the Signatory Parties worked diligently to come to an agreement, and to memorialize that agreement, and Kentucky Power also

worked diligently to prepare four pieces of testimony in support of the Settlement Agreement. As a result of those efforts, the Signatory Parties filed the Settlement Agreement with the Commission as soon as possible, on January 9, 2026. The Settlement Agreement provides unique solutions and meaningful customer rate relief that should be carefully considered prior to the start of the hearing, where witnesses may be cross-examined concerning the agreement. Kentucky Power wants to ensure the Commission has sufficient opportunity to meaningfully review the Settlement Agreement, given that the hearing is currently set to begin January 13, 2026.

As such, Kentucky Power respectfully requests that the Commission begin the hearing, as scheduled by the Commission's November 17, 2025 Order and noticed by Kentucky Power, in order to accept public comment, and then continue or recess the hearing for one day, until January 14, 2026. Such a procedure is consistent with the Commission's November 17, 2025 Order and compliant with the notice requirements in 807 KAR 5:001, Section 9, and will not require the Company to publish any additional customer notice.

In addition, Kentucky Power further respectfully moves the Commission to grant the Company leave to amend its December 30, 2025 Witness List to include Company Witness Katharine I. Walsh, who submitted testimony in support of the Settlement Agreement, and to update the order of witnesses previously indicated. Company Witness Walsh was not previously a witness in this case and therefore was not originally included in December 30, 2025 Witness List. Company Witness Walsh's Settlement Testimony supports the revenue requirement and bill impacts resulting from the settlement, thus making her appearance at the hearing necessary.

The Company requests to modify its December 30, 2025 Witness List as follows, and will call the following witnesses at the hearing currently scheduled to begin on January 13, 2026:

The Company will also call the following Company witnesses to testify on the following dates.² These witnesses have limited availability and the Company respectfully requests that the Commission allow the flexibility to call these witnesses when available, which may affect the above order of witnesses:

- a. Michael M. Spaeth – available to testify on January 13-15, 2026;³

² Despite the limited availability of these witnesses, each of the Company's witnesses will still be available on the indicated dates, and will testify, irrespective of whether the hearing is recessed for one day, until January 14, 2026, after public comment is given.

³ In the Company's December 30, 2025 Witness List, it had not previously indicated that Company Witness Spaeth would have limited availability. Circumstances have since changed that have caused the Company to now request that the Commission allow the flexibility to call Company Witness Spaeth on one of the days during which he is available.

Wherefore, Kentucky Power Company respectfully requests the Commission grant its motion to recess the evidentiary hearing beginning on January 13, 2026, for one day, after public comments are taken at the beginning of the hearing on January 13, 2026, and for leave to modify its December 30, 2025 Witness List as described herein.
