AG 1_5 See Kahn Direct Testimony at 11 where she responds in the affirmative that the Company has conducted a cost-benefit analysis regarding its PJM participation. Specifically, she states in part:

Q. HAS THE COMPANY CONDUCTED ANY COST-BENEFIT ANALYSES REGARDING ITS PARTICIPATION IN PJM?

A. Yes. The Brattle Group was engaged to provide a review of various potential cost allocation methodologies in response to concerns raised over apportionment of AEP's transmission costs to Kentucky Power in 2023.

Confirm that the referenced Brattle Group Report did not contain a cost-benefit analysis regarding Kentucky Power's participation in PJM generally but instead provided an analysis of how Kentucky benefits or does not benefit from the cost allocation methodologies employed under the AEP East Transmission Agreement relative to other AEP East Companies.

Not confirmed. The Brattle Group Report speaks for itself.


