

Scott County Fiscal Court held a meeting on Tuesday, December 23, 2025. Judge Covington called the meeting to order. Present were Magistrates Mr. Hostetler, Mr. Jones, Mr. Wallace, Mr. Corman, Mr. Ellison, Mr. Pratt, and County Attorney, Cam Culbertson.

A motion was made by Mr. Hostetler with second by Mr. Jones to approve the previous meeting minutes. Court voted unanimous.

A motion was made by Mr. Hostetler with second by Mr. Corman to approve the bills as presented. Court voted unanimous.

Mr. Livingston arrived.

Mr. Hostetler introduced several NET Recovery participants that gave brief testimony about their positive experience with the net device. Advocate, Kelly Dycus spoke about treatment and resources, and was available for questions.

EMS Director, Chris Runyon requested to hire Houston Berry full-time at \$18.94 per hour, Jordan Sigmon full-time at \$14.56 per hour, Matthew Miles part-time at \$14.00 per hour, Hannah Short part-time at \$14.00 per hour, and Tanner Hall part-time at \$14.00 per hour. Also, Mr. Runyon requested to promote Noah Howell from EMT to Paramedic full-time at \$20.00 per hour. A motion was made by Mr. Livingston with

second by Mr. Hostetler to approve the new hires and promotion. Court voted unanimous.

Judge Covington spoke about an ambulance repair and supplemental insurance claim of approximately \$10,000.00. Mr. Runyon was available for questions. A motion was made by Mr. Corman with second by Mr. Livingston to approve the cost difference. Court voted unanimous.

Road Department Director, J.R. Brandenburg requested to promote Wes Bryant to Equipment Operator/Safety & CDL Specialist at \$25.38 per hour. A motion was made by Mr. Pratt with second by Mr. Jones to approve the promotion. Court voted unanimous.

Court members discussed a steep rate increase proposed by Bluegrass Water Utility Operating Company that will affect several Scott County citizens. A motion was made by Mr. Ellison with second by Mr. Jones authorizing Judge Covington and Mr. Culbertson to take action with legal counsel. Court voted unanimous.

Mr. Ellison exited.

Jailer, Derran Broyles submitted an updated Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) manual. Judge Covington stated the current administrative code should be inserted on page 328; Jailer Broyles stated he will make that change. A motion was made by Mr. Corman with second by Mr. Hostetler to approve the updated SOP. Court voted unanimous.
