**KENTUCKY POWER COMPANY’S REQUEST TO SUBMIT MATTER FOR  
DECISION ON THE RECORD**

In accordance with the Public Service Commission of Kentucky’s (the “Commission”) January 23, 2026 Order, Kentucky Power Company (“Kentucky Power” or the “Company”) respectfully requests that this matter be submitted for decision on the record and without a hearing.

The Commission opened this case and issued its procedural schedule by order dated January 23, 2026 (“Procedural Entry”). In the Procedural Entry, the Commission also added Kentucky Broadband and Cable Association (“KBCA”) as a party to the case, noting that KBCA had previously filed objections to Kentucky Power’s tariff filed in response to the Commission’s emergency pole attachment regulation.<sup>1</sup> The Procedural Entry set the last day to intervene in this case as January 30, 2026. No other parties have requested nor been granted leave to intervene.

On February 6, 2026, KBCA filed its “Response to the Commission’s January 23, 2026 Order” in which it stated that “[b]ecause the tariffs (sic) comply with the regulation, KBCA does not have any formal objections at this time.”<sup>2</sup> Additionally, no data requests were propounded on the Company and no intervenor testimony was submitted. The only milestones remaining on the procedural schedule are discovery to intervenors and the Company’s rebuttal testimony.

The procedural schedule provides that Kentucky Power may request a hearing or to submit this matter for a decision on the record by April 17, 2026. Given that the only other party indicated no objections to the Company's proposed tariffs and no intervenor testimony was submitted, the remaining deadlines in the procedural schedule have become moot. Therefore, Kentucky Power respectfully requests that this matter be submitted for decision on the record as of the date of this filing.

However, the Company will defer to the Commission if the Commission or Commission Staff determine that a hearing is needed or would be beneficial to supplement the record of this matter with additional evidence. In that event, the Company would be amenable to being available for any such hearing at the convenience of the Commission. The Company also is willing to attend an informal conference with Commission Staff to discuss any outstanding issues or to discuss any other matters that would aid in the handling and disposition of the case.
