APPLICATION

Kentucky Utilities Company (“KU”), pursuant to KRS 278.018(6), 807 KAR 5:001 Section 14, and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 22, hereby applies for approval of changes in its certified service territory as agreed to with Salt River Electric Cooperative Corporation (“Salt River Electric”).

1. Applicant KU’s full name and business address are: Kentucky Utilities Company, One Quality Street, Lexington, Kentucky 40507. KU’s mailing address is Kentucky Utilities Company c/o Louisville Gas and Electric Company, 2701 Eastpoint Parkway, Louisville, Kentucky 40223. KU may be reached by electronic mail at the electronic mail addresses of its counsel set forth below.

2. KU was incorporated in Kentucky on August 17, 1912, and in Virginia on November 26, 1991 (and effective as of December 1, 1991), and is in good standing in both Kentucky and Virginia.

3. KU is a public utility, as defined in KRS 278.010(3)(a), engaged in the electric business. KU generates and purchases electricity, and distributes and sells electricity at retail in the following counties in Central, Northern, Southeastern, and Western Kentucky:

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5. Description of Changes in Service Territory:

As explained in this application and in the attached exhibits, KU and Salt River Electric have individually agreed to the requested territorial changes at two locations: five parcels of land (three complete parcels and two partial parcels) off of Kays Lane; and one parcel near Farmaway Drive. The proposed territorial boundary change serves the purposes of KRS 278.016. The change avoids the wasteful duplication of facilities, the unnecessary encumbrance of the landscape, and minimizes disputes between retail electric providers. No existing customer will change electric provider.

New residential homes are being developed on the property described above off Kays Lane in a “split territory,” where the land is situated along the current boundary between KU’s and Salt River Electric’s certified territories. The KU and Salt River Electric engineering staffs together reviewed and studied the planned development layout and surrounding areas. As is normal protocol, in situations where a new development spans across two utilities’ service territories, the companies agreed to redraw the certified service territory boundary line in order to efficiently and fairly align with the property lines (for parcel numbers 4, 7 and 8) and include buildable flat land for parcel numbers 5 and 6. Due to the location and configuration of the current electric utility facilities in the area, the logistics for Salt River Electric to serve these particular sites are challenging and would cause additional costs to the customers for Salt River Electric to extend its facilities. KU can extend its nearby facilities with minimal burden. Therefore, KU and Salt River Electric have agreed that KU should serve each of those new residential homes on Kays Lane.

In exchange for the Kays Lane territory, KU and Salt River Electric identified a tract of land, off Farmaway Drive, that KU agrees to relinquish to Salt River Electric. Salt River Electric currently provides electric service to nearby existing residential homes, and can easily extend its

electric facilities to serve future residential homes in this area.

Therefore, it would be in the best interest of both utilities, and of the proposed customers, to change the current service area boundaries.

WHEREFORE, KU hereby requests, pursuant to KRS 278.018, that the Commission enter an order approving the updates to the Quadrant Map to reflect the current requested service territory changes and the agreement between KU and Salt River Electric.

BOUNDARY CHANGE AGREEMENT

Kentucky Utilities Company (KU) and Salt River Electric Cooperative Corporation (Salt River Electric) hereby agree to two territorial boundary changes. No customers will change providers.

The changes involve five parcels (new residential homes) off of Kays Lane and one parcel off of Farmaway Drive, both in Bardstown, KY. KU and Salt River Electric agree to swap these two territories and to officially show these areas as their respective territories.

These boundary changes avoid the wasteful duplication of facilities and unnecessary encumbering of the landscape as well as minimizes disputes between retail electric providers.
