
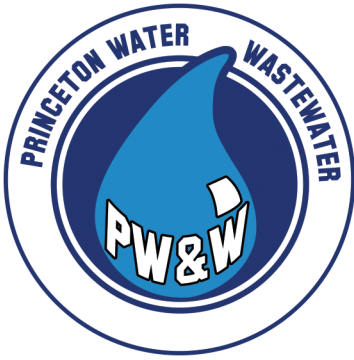

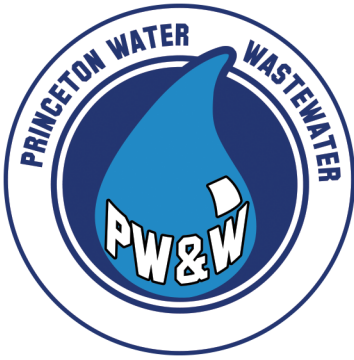
Dear Mrs. Hart,

NOTICE

Princeton Water & Wastewater Commission ("PWWC") plans to file with the Public Service Commission, no later than August 31, 2023, a proposed rate schedule to be implemented over 3 years, with the first phase to be effective January 1, 2024, that will increase the wholesale rate charged to Caldwell County Water District as follows:

Water flowing through the meter(s) before the effective date will be charged at the current rates while water flowing through the meter(s) on and after the effective dates will be charged at the proposed rates.

This filing may be examined at the PWWC's office located at 101 East Market Street in Princeton, Kentucky.

This filing may also be examined at the offices of the Public Service Commission located at 211 Sower Boulevard in Frankfort, Kentucky, Monday – Friday from 8:00 am – 4:30 pm or on the PSC website at <http://psc.ky.gov>.

Comments regarding this filing may be submitted by mail to the Public Service Commission, Post Office Box 615, Frankfort KY 40602; or through its website at <http://psc.ky.gov>.

The rates contained in this notice are the rates proposed by PWWC but the Public Service Commission may order rates that differ from the proposed rates.

Intervention may be requested by submitting a timely written request for intervention by mail to the Public Service Commission, Post Office Box 615, Frankfort, KY 40602. The request for intervention must establish the grounds for the request including the status and interest of the party.

If the Public Service Commission does not receive a written request for intervention within thirty (30) days of the providing this notice, the Public Service Commission may take final action on the filing.

* The current tariff is written as \$2.44 per 100 Cubic Feet this equates to 3.262 per 1000 Gallons. The CCWD prefers to be billed in gallons therefore in an effort to prevent confusion we have written the new tariff as per 1000 gallons. This will also allow for easy comparison of PWWC's wholesale rate to surrounding counties.

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-02-10

**A RESOLUTION OF CALDWELL COUNTY WATER DISTRICT
ADJUSTING ITS WATER RATES TO OFFSET THE CITY OF
PRINCETON AND SOUTH HOPKINS WATER DISTRICTS'
WHOLESALE RATE INCREASE**

WHEREAS, the City of Princeton and South Hopkins Water District supplies potable water to Caldwell County Water District on a wholesale basis'

WHEREAS, on August 16, 2023 the City of Princeton filed with the Public Service Commission a revised tariff to increase its wholesale rate effective January 1, 2026 see tariff filing TFS2023-00375. Also, on August, 28, 2025 South Hopkins Water District received approval from the Public Service Commission in Case No. 2025-00251 to increase its wholesale rate to its purchasers effective August 28, 2026;

WHEREAS, based upon the water purchases from the City of Princeton and South Hopkins Water District during the previous 12 months, the estimated annual increased cost to Caldwell County Water District will be \$ **41,544;**

WHEREAS, prudent financial management dictates that Caldwell County Water District take action to adjust its retail rates; and

WHEREAS, KRS 278.015 and 807 KAR 5:068 provide the legal

mechanism for Caldwell County Water District to increase its water rates to c
with the City of Princeton's and South Hopkins Water District's wholesale rate
increase via a Purchased Water Adjustment ("PWA")

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF
CALDWELL COUNTY WATER DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE
AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. The facts, recitals, and statements contained in the foregoing
preamble of this Resolution are true and correct and are hereby affirmed and
incorporated as a part of this Resolution.

Section 2. The PWA factor is **\$.44** per 1,000 gallons.

Section 3. All tiers of water usage and the wholesale water rate set forth
in Caldwell County Water District's existing tariff shall be increased by **\$.44** per
1,000 gallons, subject to any minor adjustment that may be made by the PSC.

Section 4. The monthly water rates to be charged to and collected from
the customers and users of the water system of Caldwell County Water District
shall be as set forth in **Exhibit A**, which is attached hereto and is incorporated
herein by reference as a part of this Resolution. The rates set forth in **Exhibit A**
are subject to any minor adjustment that may be made by the PSC. These
monthly rates shall be in effect for all water service rendered on and after January
1, 2026 upon PSC approval.

Section 5. The Chairman and the General Manager are hereby authorized and directed to execute and file the PWA Application, Tariff Sheet, and all other documents that may be required by the PSC.

Section 6. The Chairman, General Manager, and all appropriate Caldwell County Water District Staff are hereby further authorized and directed to take any and all other actions and to execute and deliver any and all other documents as may be reasonably necessary to implement the PWA.

Section 7. This Resolution shall take effect upon its adoption.
