1. Please refer to Direct Testimony Exhibit AEB-9 (p.1):
 - a. Are the common equity ratios shown for Atmos Energy Corporation in Exh. AEB-9 (p.1) unreasonably high? If the answer is other than an unqualified “yes” as to each of the years 2022-2024 and the 3-year average, for each ratio KAWC (or the witness) contends is not unreasonably high, please state the basis for that contention.
 - b. Provide the median common equity ratio for the Proxy Group for each of the years shown and for the 3-year average.

Response:

- a. The question is unclear as “unreasonably high” is not defined. Ms. Bulkley notes however that on a 3-year average basis ONE Gas, Inc. has an equity ratio that is within 100 basis points of Atmos Energy.
- b. Ms. Bulkley did not perform the requested calculation as part of developing her testimony. Should GMWSS wish to perform this calculation, please see KAW_R_PSCDR2_NUM056_062626 Attachment 1 for the electronic copy of Ms. Bulkley’s exhibits.

2. Please refer to the William A. Lewis testimony about the now-approved KAWC acquisition of the Black Mountain Utility District (see PSC Case No. 2026-00097, 7/10/26 Final Order):
- a. Are costs associated with the Black Mountain Utility District included in the rates for Sales for Resale proposed in this case?
 - b. If so, why should costs associated with such a to-be-acquired, non-contiguous system be recovered from Sales for Resale customers?
 - c. Are the Black Mountain Utility District assets to be acquired by KAWC included in the KAWC rate base projected in this case? If so, please state the valuation and provide support for that valuation.

Response:

- a. No. Costs associated with Black Mountain Utility District ("BMUD") are included in the Company's revenue requirement; however, BMUD costs are allocated consistently with how all Company costs are allocated within the Company's class cost of service study. Costs associated with the Sales for Resale class are allocated based on the methodology described within Company witness Rea's Direct Testimony. Sales for Resale rates are designed to generally recover the costs associated with that rate class.
- b. Please see the Company's response to subpart a above.
- c. Yes. The Black Mountain Utility District assets to be acquired by KAWC are included in the projected rate base in this case. KAWC intends to acquire Black Mountain Utility District at fair market value. For purposes of this case, the purchase price was allocated among the assets.

 - a. How do the benefits of fire protection within any single local government's area "extend to the entire communities that we serve"? Describe how public fire protection in a single locality "enhances public safety, supports economic development, and reduces the risk for all customers within the Company's service territory." Be specific and concrete about the benefits you claim extend, *e.g.*, to KAWC customers in Lexington-Fayette County from public fire service in the locale of Clinton, Warsaw, or Middlesboro, Kentucky (or vice-versa). Provide the justification for socializing one local government's choices about number, placement, and use of fire hydrants to all other KAWC customers.
 - b. Explain the contention that the hydrant fees in KAWC's current tariff pose a barrier to (or discourage) regionalization and investment in infrastructure and describe how the current fees have that negative effect.
 - c. Provide the respective statement(s) supporting the assertion, "Regionalization is a stated goal of the Kentucky legislature, the KYPSC and the KYDOW."

Response:

- a. Public fire protection enhances public safety by supporting emergency response, reducing the risk of loss of life and property damage, and helping maintain the availability of necessary public services. The benefits of public fire protection are not limited solely to the specific local government in which a hydrant is located for the following reasons:
 - Fires can spread beyond municipal boundaries or affect regional transportation corridors, public infrastructure, businesses, schools, places of worship, nonprofit facilities, and other community assets used by or benefiting customers outside the immediate locality.
 - Public fire protection supports economic development by helping communities maintain appropriate fire protection capability, which can affect insurance considerations, business continuity, and the ability of communities to attract and retain residents, employers, and public institutions.

The Company's rate design approach recognizes that the current method of recovering hydrant fees from individual municipalities may not align cost recovery with all beneficiaries of public fire protection, because some entities benefiting from hydrant availability may not directly contribute to municipal tax funding used to pay hydrant charges. Allocating the cost across benefiting customer classes therefore better aligns

- cost responsibility with the broad public safety and system benefits provided by public fire protection.
- b. Please refer to Mr. Lewis' direct testimony on Pages 36-38. To the extent that municipal water providers are concerned about having to pay hydrant fees upon a KAWC acquisition of their systems, a reduction of those fees will encourage acquisitions, which, in turn, accomplishes regionalization and consolidation. See part c below.
 - c. The General Assembly's stated goal of encouraging regionalization and consolidation of water systems is set forth at KRS 224A.310¹ referencing both the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority and the Kentucky Division of Water. Also see KRS 224A.300² for the same stated goal as well as KRS 74.361.³ For Commission precedent on this issue, in approving KAWC's acquisition of the Eastern Rockcastle Water Association several years ago, the Commission noted it was following the General Assembly's guidance, which encourages the regionalization and consolidation of water and wastewater systems.⁴ The Commission itself has encouraged KAWC to become a regional water provider.⁵ Finally, in approving KAWC's acquisition of the Livingston earlier this year, the Commission stated, "Finally, in accordance with KRS 224.A300(1) and KRS 74.361(1), the public policy of Kentucky is to encourage regionalization, consolidation, and merger of water utilities. The proposed transaction carries out that public policy."⁶

WHEREAS, Customer desires to purchase a supply of potable water from Company, and

WHEREAS, Company can meet the specific request of Customer,

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto do hereby agree as follows:

1. From and after the 20th day of September, 2000, Customer shall have the right to purchase from Company, and Company shall be obligated to sell to Customer, an amount of potable water not to exceed 150,000 gallons in any twenty-four hour period and at a rate not in excess of 150 gallons per minutes. Customer hereby acknowledges that this quantity and flow is adequate for its present and future needs within the term of this contract, as determined and recommended by its consulting engineer.

2. Delivery of the water purchased by Customer and sold by Company shall be at point or points to be determined under the existing rules and regulations of Company as approved by the Public Service Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and as the same may be changed from time to time. The total quantity of water purchased by Customer from all points shall not exceed the limitations of quantity and flow as set forth in the preceding paragraph. Company shall not be responsible for the quality of

water purchased by Customer past the point or points of actual delivery as determined herein.

3. Customer acknowledges that Company will make an investment for the metering equipment, vault and the approximately 2500 feet of line to connect from metering equipment to Customer's system, and that investment is based upon the estimated water purchases by Customer. This investment, as of the date of this agreement, is estimated to be approximately \$120,000. Customer agrees that it will purchase water at Company's rates in sufficient quantities over the first three (3) years of the term of this contract to equal the Company's actual investment. At the end of each of the first six, six-month periods of this agreement, starting at the beginning of the agreement, Customer agrees to pay to Company an amount equal to the difference between one-sixth of the amount of the Company's investment and the total of the six months' actual water purchases for that period, but only in the event the six months' actual water purchases for that period are less than one-sixth of the Company Investment. Water purchases shall be calculated at the published tariffs of Company as approved by the Public Service Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

4. Customer shall pay for the quantity of water purchased by it and sold by Company at the approved and published tariffs of Company as the same may change from time to time and as approved by the Public Service Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

5. Customer must build, maintain and control such storage and transmission facilities as are necessary for it to meet any demands in excess of the quantities of water or rates of delivery herein agreed to be sold by Company. Company reserves the right to install such quantity and flow restrictive devices as will

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physically limit customer to the quantities and flows specified herein.

6. Customer will install, at its sole expense, appropriately approved backflow devices which Customer must certify to Company as approved and which must be inspected by a certified plumber annually and certified in writing to Company as then currently approved and properly working, all at the cost of Customer.

7. In the event any type of water curtailment practice, procedure, regulation or law is utilized by Company or is imposed upon Company, Customer agrees to abide by all recommendations of Company and to institute such regulations, requirements, policies or laws as will restrict its customers in a fashion similar to all customers of the Company.

8. Company shall endeavor to maintain a minimum normal system hydraulic gradient of 1,050 feet at the metered connection for the maximum delivery rate specified in paragraph 1; however, Company's obligation to supply water pursuant to this Agreement is solely an obligation that it shall undertake to use reasonable care and diligence in order to prevent and avoid interruptions and fluctuations in the supply of water agreed to herein. Company cannot and does not guarantee, covenant or warrant that interruptions and fluctuations will not occur, or that because of emergencies due to breaks, leaks, defects, construction or necessary repair in its facilities, or caused by fires, strikes, acts of God, or other causes, there may not be periods during which the supply of water may be curtailed or interrupted. In the event of such interruptions or fluctuations, no liability of any nature shall be imposed upon Company.

9. In the event all or any part of the waterworks plant and facilities of Company which are used in meeting its obligations

under this Agreement are acquired by a municipal corporation or any other entity, then and in that event Company shall be relieved of all of its obligations hereunder and, in such event, this Agreement shall be binding upon the municipality or any other entity making such acquisition.

10. It is understood and agreed between Customer and Company that Company does not, by this Agreement, undertake or contract to provide fire protection for those individuals, partnerships and corporations to whom Customer is going to sell water furnished by Company. Customer acknowledges that it is fully aware that if its customers desire fire protection or sufficient quantities of water for fire extinguishment, that it must provide the same by the construction and maintenance of appropriate facilities to render such service and protection.

11. This Agreement shall terminate forty(40) years after the date of execution hereof. Customer shall have the right to extend this Agreement for a term of 30 years beyond the original termination date by notifying Company in writing of its decision to do so prior to six months before the termination date of this Agreement.

12. Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:011(13), Company will file a copy of this executed contract with the Public Service Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

13. Customer may pledge this contract to Farmers Home Administration to further secure a loan made to improve the water distribution system of Customer.

14. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and all prior conversations and writings are merged herein.

15. This Agreement shall be construed according to the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

This contract for the sale and purchase of water is entered into as the 7th day of November, 2005 between:

WITNESSETH

Whereas, the Purchaser is organized and established under the provisions of KRS Chapter 74 of the Code of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, for the purpose of constructing and operating a water supply distribution system and to accomplish this purpose the Purchaser requires an additional supply of treated water, and

Whereas, the Seller owns and operates a water supply distribution system with a capacity currently capable of serving the present customers of the Seller's system and the quantity of water stipulated in the contract to be taken by the Purchaser, and

Whereas, by Resolution No. 2005-003, enacted on the 7th day of November, 2005 by the Seller, the sale of water to the Purchaser in accordance with the provisions of said Resolution was approved, and the execution of this contract carrying out the said water purchase contract by the Mayor, and attested by the City Clerk, was duly authorized by the Millersburg City Council and

Whereas by action of the Board of Directors of the Purchaser, enacted on the 7th day of November, 2005 the purchase of water from the Seller in accordance with the terms set forth in the said water purchase contract was approved, and the execution of this contract by the Harrison County Water Association, and attested by the Secretary was duly authorized:



Now, therefore, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual agreements hereinafter set forth:

A. The Seller agrees:

___ 1. (Quantity and Quality) To furnish the Purchaser at the point of delivery hereinafter specified, during the term of this contract or any renewal or extension thereof, potable water meeting applicable purity standards of the Kentucky Department of Natural Resources – Division of Water in a quantity of averaging 40,000 gallons per day. The Purchaser agrees to a minimum purchase of an average of 20,000 gallons per day only if water is available to meet the Purchaser's operating requirements.

___ 2. (Point of Delivery and Pressure) That water will be furnished at a reasonably constant pressure at a minimum of 50 PSI from an existing 6 inch main supply at a point located on KY 1878 (Ruddles Mills-Millersburg Road). If a greater pressure than that normally available at the point of delivery is required by the Purchaser, the cost of providing such greater pressure shall be borne by the Purchaser. Emergency failures of pressure or supply due to main supply line breaks, power failure, flood, fire and use of water to fight fire, earthquake or other catastrophe shall excuse the Seller from this provision for such reasonable period of time as may be necessary to restore service.

___ 3. (Billing Procedure) The metering equipment shall be read on the last day of the month. An appropriate official of the Purchaser at all reasonable times shall have access to the meter for the purposes of verifying its readings. If any meter fails to register for any period of time, the amount of water furnished during such period shall be deemed to be the amount delivered in the corresponding period immediately prior to the failure, unless Seller and Purchaser shall agree upon a different amount.

The Seller will furnish the Purchaser at the above address not later than the 10th day of each month, with an itemized statement of the amount furnished to the Purchaser during the preceding month.

___ 4. (Successor to the Seller) That in the event of any occurrence rendering the Seller incapable of performing under this contract, any successor of the Seller, whether the results of legal process, assignment, or otherwise, shall succeed to the rights of the Seller hereunder.

B. The Purchaser Agrees:

___ 1. (Rates and Payment Date) To pay the Seller, not later than the 20th day of each month, for water delivered as a rate of \$2.25 per thousand gallons of water purchased.



___ 2. (Metering Equipment) The Purchaser agrees to furnish, install, and maintain at its own expense at the point of delivery, the necessary metering equipment, including a meter house or pit, and required devices of standard type for properly measuring the quantity of water delivered to the Purchaser. Such metering equipment shall be calibrated whenever requested by either party but not more frequently than once every twelve months. A meter registering not more than two percent (2%) above or below the test result shall be deemed to be accurate. The previous readings of any meter disclosed by test to be inaccurate shall be corrected for the six months previous to such test in accordance with the percentage of inaccuracy found by such test.

C. It is further mutually agreed between the Seller and the Purchaser as follows:

___ 1. (Terms of Contract) That this contract shall extend for a term of fifteen (15) years from the delivery date of any water as shown by the first bill submitted by the Seller to the Purchaser and thereafter may be renewed or extended for such term or terms, as may be agreed upon by the Seller and the Purchaser.

___ 2. (Delivery of Water) That thirty (30) days prior to the estimated date of completion of construction of the Purchaser's meter, pumps, and lines involved in this project, the Purchaser will notify the Seller in writing the date for the initial delivery of water.

___ 3. (Water for Testing) When requested by the Purchaser the Seller will make available to the contractor at the point of delivery, or other point reasonably close thereto, water sufficient for testing, flushing and trench filling the system of the Purchaser during construction, irrespective of whether the metering equipment has been installed at the time, at a flat rate charge of \$2.25 per thousand gallons which will be paid by the contractor, or on his failure to pay, the Purchaser.

___ 4. (Failure to Deliver) That the Seller will, at all times, operate and maintain its system in an efficient manner and will take such action as may be necessary to furnish the Purchaser the quantities specified in this contract. Temporary or partial failures to deliver water shall be remedied with all possible dispatch. In the event of an extended shortage of water, or the supply of water available to the Seller is otherwise diminished over an extended period of time, the supply of water to the Purchaser, and therefore to the Purchaser's consumers, shall be reduced or diminished in the same ratio or proportion as the supply to the Seller's consumers is reduced or diminished.

___ 5. (Modification of Contract) That the provisions of this contract pertaining to the scheduled rates to be paid by the Purchaser for water delivered are subject to modification at the end of every three (3) year period. Any increase or decrease in rates shall be based upon a demonstrable increase in the costs of performance hereunder, but such costs shall not include the increased capitalization of the Seller's system. Other provisions of this contract may be modified or altered by mutual agreement.



___ 6. (Regulatory Agencies) That this contract is subject to such rules, regulations, or laws as may be applicable to similar agreements in this State and the Seller and Purchaser will collaborate in obtaining such permits, certificates, or the like, as may be required to comply therewith

___ 7. (Successor to the Purchaser) That in the event of any occurrence rendering the Purchaser incapable of performing under this contract, any successor of the Purchaser, whether the result of legal process, assignment, or otherwise, shall succeed to the rights of the Purchaser hereunder.

Whereas, by action of the Board of Commissioners of the Purchaser, enacted on the 12th day of May, 1999, the purchaser of water from the Seller in accordance with the terms set forth in the said water purchase contract was approved, and the execution of this contract by the Nicholas County Water District, and attested by the Secretary was duly authorized:

Now, therefore, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual agreements hereinafter set forth,

A. The Seller Agrees:

1. (Quality and Quantity) To furnish the Purchaser at the point of delivery hereinafter specified, during the term of this contract or any renewal or extension thereof, potable water meeting applicable purity standards of the Kentucky Department of Natural Resources - Division of Water in as such quality as may be required by the Purchaser not to exceed 1,500,000 gallons per month.

2. (Point of Delivery and Pressure) That water will be furnished at a reasonably constant pressure calculated at minimum of 50 PSI from an existing 6-inch main supply at a point located on US Route 68 at the eastern City Limits of Millersburg _____. If a greater pressure than that normally available at the point of delivery is required by the Purchaser, the cost of providing such greater pressure shall be borne by the Purchaser. Emergency failures of pressure or supply due to main supply line breaks, power failure, flood, fire and use of water to fight fire, earthquake or other catastrophe shall excuse the Seller from this provision for such reasonable period of time as may be necessary to restore service.

3. (Metering Equipment) To furnish, install, operate, and maintain at its own expense at point of delivery, the necessary metering equipment, including a meter house or pit, and required devices of standard type for properly measuring the quantity of water delivered to the Purchaser and to calibrate such metering equipment whenever requested by the Purchaser but not more frequently than once every twelve (12)

months. A meter registering not more than two percent (2%) above or below the test result shall be deemed to be accurate.

SEE PARAGRAPH 4.B.2 BELOW

The previous readings of any meter disclosed by test to be inaccurate shall be corrected for the (6) six months previous to such test in accordance with the percentage of inaccuracy found by such test. If any meter fails to register for any period, the amount of water furnished during such period shall be deemed to be the amount of water delivered in the corresponding period immediately prior to the failure, unless Seller and Purchaser shall agree upon a different amount. The metering equipment shall be read on

Last day of the month. An appropriate official of the Purchaser at all reasonable times shall have access to the matter for the purpose of verifying its readings.

4. (Billing Procedure) To furnish the Purchaser at the above address not later than the 10th day of each month, with an itemized statement of the amount furnished the Purchaser during the preceding month.

B. The Purchaser Agrees:

1. (Rates and Payment Date) To pay the Seller, not later than the 20th day of each month, for water delivered in accordance with the following schedule of rates:

A. \$ NA for the first _____ gallons, which amount shall also be the minimum rate per month.

B. \$ NA cents per 1,000 gallons for water in excess of _____ gallons but less than _____ gallons.

C. \$ _____ cents per 1,000 gallons for water in excess of _____ gallons.

D. \$ 2.25 cents per 1,000 gallons for all water purchased.

2. (Connection fee) to pay as an agreed cost, a connection fee to connect to Seller's system with the system of the purchaser, the sum of -0- dollars which shall cover any and all costs of the Seller for installation of the metering equipment and installation will be provided by the Purchaser (with approval) of the Seller. Upon completion of installation start up, calibration and one year warranty, the facility shall become the property of the Seller.

C. It is further mutually agreed between the Seller and the Purchaser as follows:

1. (Terms of Contract) That this contract shall extend for a term of 40 (forty) years from the date of the delivery of any water as shown by the first bill submitted by the Seller to the Purchaser and thereafter may be renewed or extended for such term or terms, as may be agreed upon by the Seller and Purchaser.

2. (Delivery of Water) That 30 (thirty) days prior to the estimated date of completion of construction of the Purchaser's water supply distribution system, the Purchaser will notify the Seller in writing the date for the initial delivery of water.

3. (Water for Testing) When requested by the Purchaser the Seller will make available to the contractor at the point of delivery, or other point reasonably close thereto, water sufficient for testing, flushing, and trench filling the system of the Purchaser during construction.

Irrespective of whether the metering equipment has been installed at the time, at a flat charge of \$2.25/ 1,000 gallons which will be paid by the contractor or, on his failure to pay, by the Purchaser.

4. (Failure to Deliver) That the Seller will, at all times, operate and maintain its system in an efficient manner and will take such action as may be necessary to furnish the Purchaser with quantities of the water required by the Purchaser. Temporary or partial failures to deliver water shall be remedied with all possible dispatch. In the event of an extended shortage of water, or the supply of water available to the Seller is otherwise diminished over an extended period of time, the supply of water to Purchaser's

consumers shall be reduced or diminished in the same ratio or proportion as the supply to Seller's consumers is reduced or diminished.

5. (Modification of Contract) That the provisions of this contract pertaining to the scheduled of rates to be paid by the Purchaser for water delivered are subject to modification at the end of every 3 (three) year period. Any increase or decrease in rates shall be based on a demonstrable increase in the costs of performance hereunder, but such costs shall not include increased capitalization of the Seller's system. Other provisions of this contract may be modified or altered by mutual agreement.

6. (Regulatory Agencies) That this contract is subject to such rules, regulations, or laws as may be applicable to similar agreements in this State and the Seller and Purchaser will collaborate in obtaining such permits, certificates, or the like, as may be required to comply therewith.

7. (Miscellaneous) That the construction of the water supply distribution system by the Purchaser is being financed by a loan made or insured by, and/or grant from, the United States of America acting through Rural Development of the United States Department of Agriculture, and the provisions hereof pertaining to the undertakings of the Purchaser are conditioned upon the approval, in writing of the State Director of Rural Development.

8. (Successor to the Purchaser) That in the event of any occurrence rendering the Purchaser incapable of performing under this contract, any successor of the Purchaser, whether the result of legal process, assignment, or otherwise, shall succeed to the rights of the Purchaser hereunder.

In witness whereof, the parties hereto, acting under authority of their respective governing bodies, have caused this contract to be duly executed in 3 (three) counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original.

Interruptibility of service is governed by the KAWC tariff¹ filed with the Kentucky Public Service Commission, which provides, in pertinent part:

- (a) The Company reserves the right at any time to shut off the water in the Mains without notice in case of accident or emergency, or for the purpose of making connections, extensions, improvements, alterations, repairs, changes, or for other proper business reasons, and may restrict the use of water to reserve a sufficient supply in its reservoirs for fire protection or other emergencies whenever the public welfare may so require in accordance with Commission Rules. Notwithstanding any other provision in these Rules or any contract or agreement between the Company and any Customer, when, in the judgment of the Company, sufficient supplies of water are not available to the Company, for any reason, to meet all existing and reasonably anticipated demands for service or to preserve and replenish its storage in amounts sufficient to provide fire protection on its system, the Company shall have the right to restrict, limit, curtail or interrupt water service to or water usage by any Customer or Customers.
- (b) The temporary shutting off of water from any Premises for any cause, whether non-payment of bills, leaking pipes, fixtures, etc. shall not cancel a contract for water supply service except at the option of the Company or upon notice from the Customer.

11. Please refer to KAWC's Application Exh. 2 proposing to reduce the rate for Bulk Sales of Water through Loading Stations (P.S.C. KY No. 12, Orig. Sheet No. 43), to \$0.23694 per 50 gallons (equivalent to \$4.47387 per 1000 gallons). State the justification for proposing to:
- a. reduce the rate for Bulk Sales service (while increasing the rates for Sales for Resale and most other customers for Service Classification No. 1); and
 - b. charge \$3.9984 more per 1000 gallons (\$8.7371 - \$4.7387) plus a monthly service charge (*e.g.*, \$1079.40 for a 6" meter; \$1727.10 for an 8" meter) for Sales for Resale service.

Response:

- a. The Company utilized its filed class cost of service study, provided in response to KAW_R_PSCDR1_NUM003, as a guide for establishing proposed rates. Based on the Company's class cost of service study results, Bulk Sales service requires an increase of approximately 3.1%. After accounting for the Company's proposed meter rates, the Bulk Sales service volumetric rate must be reduced to not exceed the Company's target revenue increase for Bulk Sales Service of 3.1%.

Based on the Company's class cost of service study, Sales for Resale service requires an increase of approximately 9.8%. After accounting for the Company's proposed meter rates, the Sales for Resale service class requires an increase in the volumetric rate to reach the target revenue increase for Sales for Resale Service of 4.9%.

12. Please state when KAWC became aware of GMWSS's usage of more than 51 million gallons at the Champion Way service point from 2/19/26 through 3/18/26, and explain how it was unaware of that usage and/or did not bill for such usage for so long and why it invoiced on estimated usage for the service period from 2/4/26 through 5/19/26. Provide any supporting documentation.

Response:

Pursuant to the communication requirements set forth in the Emergency Connection Agreement between GMWSS and KAWC, attached as KAW_R_GMWSSDR1_NUM012_073026_Attachment, GMWSS should have provided notice to KAWC prior to dramatically and aberrantly increasing its water usage in February and March of 2026. KAWC has no record of receiving such notice from GMWSS prior to it using more than 51 million gallons at the Champion Way service point from 2/19/26 through 3/18/26. Because the Company did not have prior notice that GMWSS would be using this connection at significantly higher usage, when the higher than usual usage was detected, an estimated bill was issued. An estimated bill will be issued when higher than usual usage is metered as a customer safeguard. Because Kentucky American was unaware of GMWSS's plans to increase its usage, the billing system issued the estimated bills in an effort to protect GMWSS from a higher than usual bill. Upon information and belief, Kentucky American Water subsequently learned, through GMWSS's filings in this proceeding and related communications, that the unusually high usage was associated with maintenance activities performed on GMWSS's system. Had GMWSS provided the notice contemplated by the Emergency Connection Agreement regarding its planned use of the emergency connection and the resulting increase in demand, the account could have been addressed differently at that time. The Company has analyzed the last 10 years' worth of usage data (see the attachment to the response to AG 2-75 for the historical data from 2021 through May of 2026), and GMWSS has historically not used such a large amount in a typical billing cycle.

EMERGENCY CONNECTION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, by and between the GEORGETOWN MUNICIPAL WATER & SEWER SERVICE, 125 West Clinton Street, Georgetown, Kentucky 40324, ("GMWSS") and KENTUCKY-AMERICAN WATER COMPANY, 2300 Richmond Road, Lexington, Kentucky 40502 ("the Company").

WHEREAS, GMWSS and the Company are providers of potable water and have installed facilities in close proximity to one another; and

WHEREAS, it is in the mutual best interest of both the customers of GMWSS and the Company to connect such facilities in order to supply water to one another in the event of a drought, emergency condition, service interruption or other unexpected condition as determined pursuant the terms of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants herein, GMWSS and the Company hereby agree as follows:

1. Term. This Agreement shall be for a term of ten (10) years from the date that the Agreement is approved by GMWSS. The Agreement shall be automatically renewed for additional consecutive terms of ten (10) years each to commence on the expiration of the original term and each term thereafter. Provided, however, that either party may not renew the Agreement by providing written notice to the other party at least six (6) months prior to the expiration of the then current term.

2. Facilities. Both GMWSS and the Company agree that they will construct and maintain, each at their own respective cost, sufficient fixtures, mains, pipes, vaults, metering equipment, pumps, and other equipment, improvements and facilities for the

delivery to each other of Service under this Agreement at the Point of Delivery when requested by the other party.

3. Service. The Service of water provided under this Agreement shall be the actual delivery of treated, potable water, which meets or exceeds, all applicable drinking water standards in effect at the time of delivery, and at a minimum pressure of forty (40) pounds per square inch (psi), at the Point of Delivery.

4. Point of Delivery. The Point of Delivery shall be the point of connection of GMWSS's and the Company's facilities near the intersection of the Georgetown Bypass and Commercial Drive in the City of Georgetown, Kentucky and as shown on the attached Work Order Sketch which is incorporated herein.

5. Right to Receive Service. Either party shall have a right to receive Service ("Receiving Party") from the other party ("Providing Party") whenever the Receiving Party certifies that an emergency, drought or unexpected condition exists. Upon receipt of such request for Service, and pending water availability at the time of the request for Service, the Providing Party shall immediately provide Service as required under this Agreement.

6. Notice. All notices or other communication required by this Agreement, including requests for Service, under this Agreement, shall be provided in writing (including by facsimile transmission) to:

7. Termination of Service: Service may be terminated by the Receiving Party by such party's written notice to the Providing Party. The Providing Party may terminate Service for reasons set forth in the regulations of the Kentucky Public Service Commission as may be in effect from time to time.

8. Rates. GMWSS agrees to pay the rates for Service from the Company at the Company's rate filed and in effect from time to time with the Kentucky Public Service Commission. The current rate structure is attached hereto and incorporated herein. The Company agrees to pay the rates, in effect from time to time, for Service from GMWSS as set forth in the attached GMWSS rate schedule which is incorporated herein.

9. Metering Arrangements and Payment. Company agrees, in the event Service is requested by either party, to install a temporary service meter at the Point of Delivery for properly measuring the quantity of water being delivered. Both GMWSS and the Company may have access to the meter at all reasonable times for the purpose of reading such meter. The meter shall be read at the end of each calendar month while service is being provided and at the time Service is terminated, with payment to be made no later than 30 calendar days following the receipt of the invoice for the Service.

10. Failures. The parties acknowledge that unexpected supply or treatment problems may occur which are beyond their control. In the event the Providing Party, when called upon, is unable to provide Receiving Party with Service under the terms of this Agreement for reasons beyond the Providing Party's control, the Providing Party shall use its best efforts to restore the Service to the quality, rate of flow and pressure required. Time is of the essence in all situations where such failure and duty of restoration exists. In the event delivery problems limit or prevent the delivery of water to any of the Providing Party's other customers, then the Providing Party agrees that any restrictions, placed by it or upon it by others as to water delivery, shall apply to the Receiving Party in the same manner as applied by the Providing Party to other customers.

11. Additional Notice. In addition to any communications called for in this Agreement, the Receiving Party will timely notify Providing Party of any condition or situation, which would adversely affect the quality, quantity or pressure of the water in Providing Party's system and, likewise, Providing Party will timely notify Receiving Party of any condition or situation, which would adversely affect (or have affected) the quality, quantity or pressure of the water provided at the Point of Delivery.

12. Company's Representation and Warranty. Company is a Kentucky corporation with the authority to enter into this Agreement, subject to regulatory approval, and has the authority to perform under the terms of this Agreement.

13. GMWSS's Representation and Warranty. GMWSS is an entity of the City of Georgetown, Kentucky municipal corporation, with statutory authority to enter into this Agreement and to perform under the terms of this Agreement.

14. Termination. In addition to the provisions of Section 1 above:

Either party may terminate this Agreement upon six (6) months written notice in the event of:

- (a) Repeated failure of a Providing Party to provide the Service set forth in this Agreement.
- (b) Repeated failure of a Receiving Party to pay its invoices for water service on a timely basis.

15. Miscellaneous Provisions.

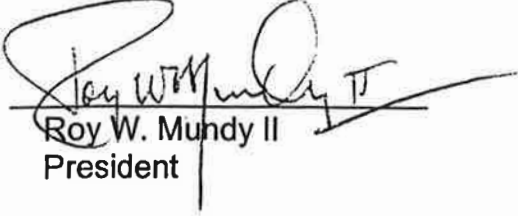
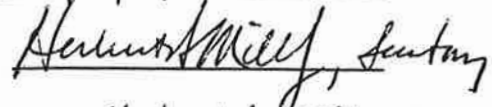
- (a) This Agreement does not constitute a partnership, joint venture, agency or other relationship between Buyer and Seller, and Buyer and Seller expressly state that they owe no fiduciary duties to one another and that the relationship is based upon Contract.
- (b) This Agreement is binding on the successors and assigns of the parties hereto and is subject to the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
- (c) Each party reserves the right to develop and use other water supply sources and may obtain water from resources other than as described in this Agreement.

- (d) The parties agree to operate and maintain their respective facilities in an efficient and economical manner and in accordance with all applicable local, state and federal laws, regulations and performance standards.
- (e) This Agreement may be amended at any time by mutual agreement, in writing, of the parties.
- (f) Both parties agree to use their best efforts to obtain all regulatory and legal approvals which may be required for the accomplishment of the terms of this Agreement.
- (g) The parties acknowledge that the water to be purchased hereunder will be resold in the regular course of business of the Receiving Party and is therefore exempt from Kentucky sales and use tax. To evidence this exemption, the Receiving Party will furnish the Providing Party with a duly executed "Resale Certificate" or such other documentation as the parties deem appropriate.

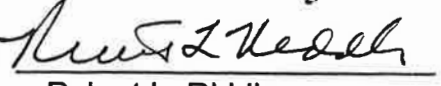

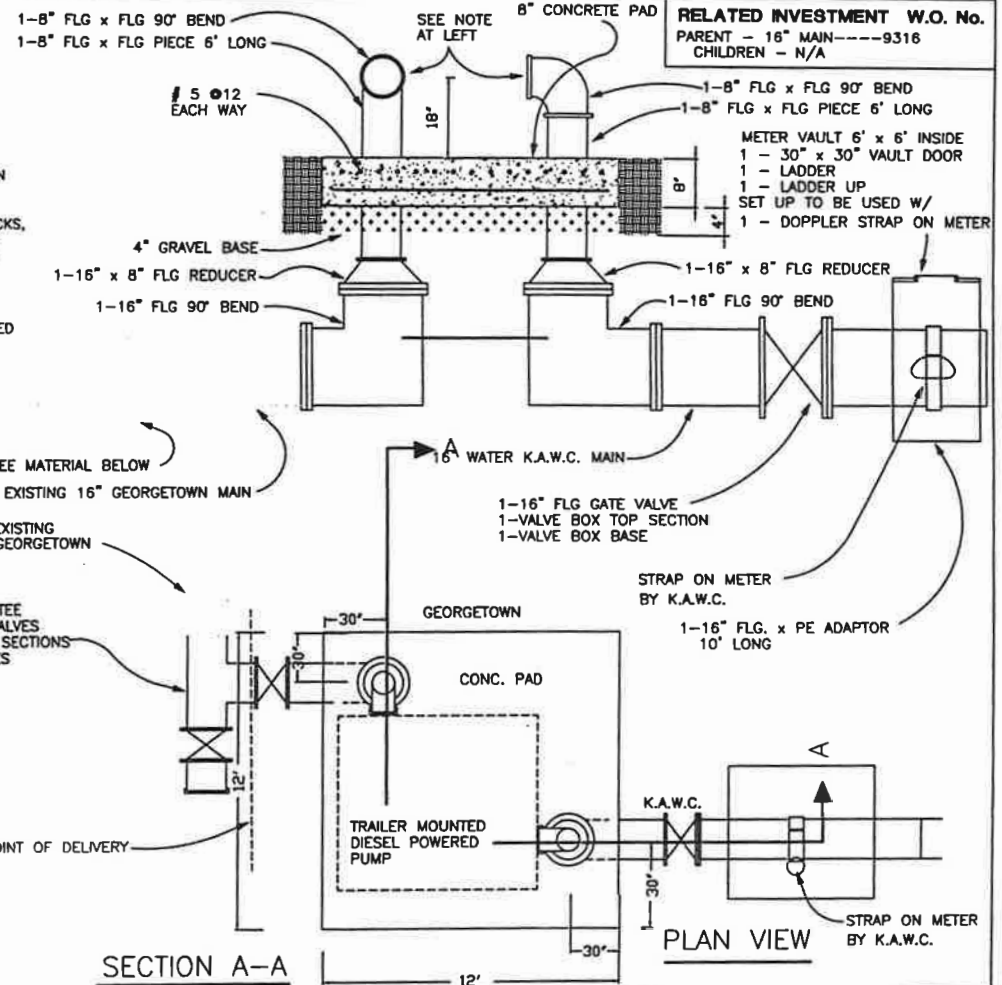
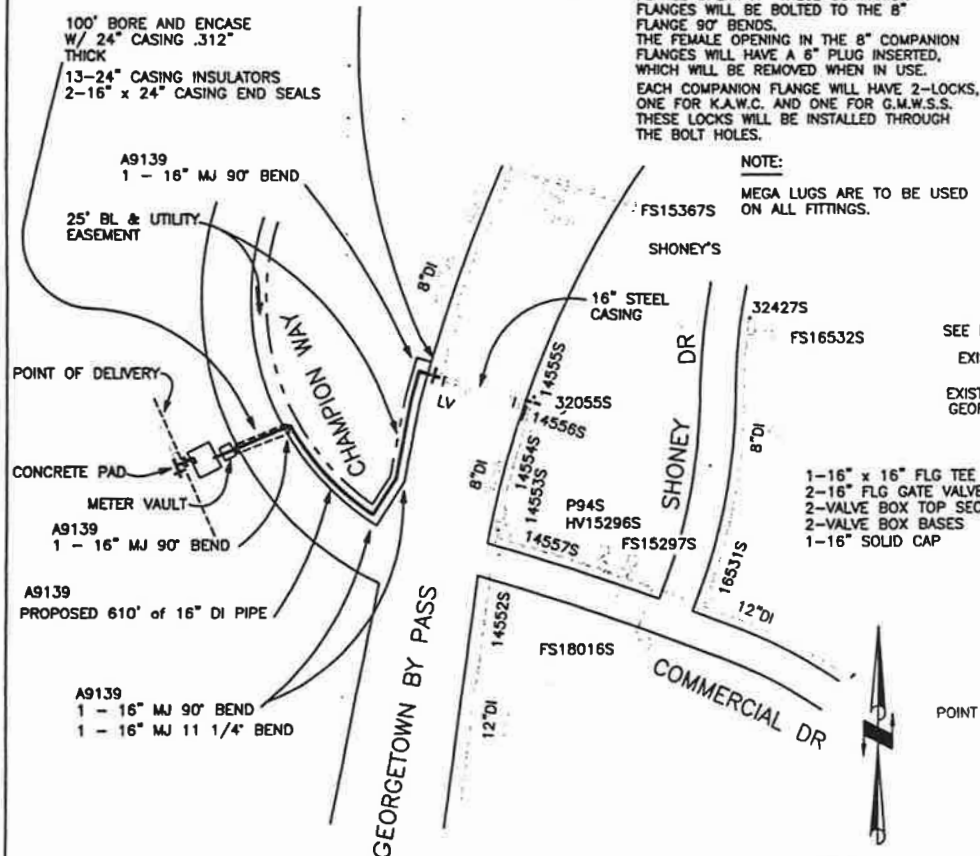

13. With respect to the meter reads for KAWC service to GMWSS at the Champion Way location, please state:
- a. the date of the latest meter read for service GMWSS at Champion Way and whether that read was on-site or digital/remote and, if digital/remote, the date of the latest on-site read of the service meter at that location;
 - b. the date of the first on-site read of the service meter at that location after 3/18/26;
 - c. what the last meter read shows to be the actual usage for GMWSS since the 9/1/25 start of the base period; and
 - d. how much of that actual usage is included in the 9/1/25–2/28/26 actual historical data and in the 9/1/25–8/31/26 base period used in KAWC's 5/15/26 Application.

Response:

- a. The meter was manually read on-site and a digital reading was confirmed on June 12, 2026.
- b. June 12, 2026
- c. The base period includes usage billed between September 2025 and February 2026. See part d below regarding updating estimated months of the base period.
- d. The additional increase in usage that occurred during the period of 2/19/26 through 3/18/26 is not included in the 9/1/25–2/28/26 actual historical data nor in the 9/1/25–8/31/26 base period used in KAWC's Application filed on May 15, 2026. The actual usage will be included in the Company's base period, when it updates the estimated months of its base period, but that will not affect the forecasted test year. Further, the usage at issue is above and beyond GMWSS's normal usage and should be considered an irregular occurrence rather than a regular and recurring usage pattern. Therefore, this usage would be treated as anomalous and removed through normalization so that it would not be reflected in the forecasted test year.

14. Please refer to the Champion Way 2026 invoices attached by KAWC as Confidential Exh.B to its 6/9/26 Response to GMWSS's Motion to Intervene:
- a. Confirm that the KAWC invoices with bill dates 2/20/26, 4/13/26, 4/28/26, and 5/28/26 (covering service period from 2/4/26 through 5/19/26) were based on estimated, rather than actual usage.
 - b. How frequent is it that a customer account (like the GMWSS account at the Champion Way service address) will be estimated for more than four (4) bill dates or service period months in a row? For the 14-month period encompassing calendar year 2025 and January-February 2026 (or the latest such period of at least 14 months for which data are available), provide frequency distribution statistics for estimated usage bills and the frequency distribution of accounts with 3, 4, 5, and ≥ 6 estimated bills in a row. Describe the set of accounts used for the statistics, including the total number of accounts and of bills (or bill dates or bill periods) and whether the accounts set excluded residential service or budget -billing accounts.
 - c. Identify regulations and state or provide KAWC tariff provisions, internal guidelines, and rules that limit reliance on estimated usage in billing customers or affirmatively require actual usage billing.

Response:

- a. Confirmed, please also see KAWC's response to GMWSS 1-12.
- b. The GMWSS Champion Way service address represents an emergency water use agreement, designed to allow both GMWSS and KAWC to purchase water from either utility during emergency situations. This arrangement differs from a standard purchase water sale-for-resale agreement in that it does not include a minimum or maximum usage or a meter charge. This is a unique arrangement with no other similarly situated customers within the KAWC utility system; therefore, there are no comparable statistics. For an explanation of estimated bills for GMWSS, please see KAWC's response to GMWSS 1-12.
- c. The regulations, law, and tariff provisions are publicly available documents as equally accessible to GMWSS as it is to Kentucky American Water. Kentucky American Water would refer GMWSS to those sources available online.
