APPLICATION

Kentucky Utilities Company (“KU”), pursuant to KRS 278.018(6), 807 KAR 5:001 Section 14, and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 22, hereby applies for approval of changes in its certified service territory as agreed to with Blue Grass Energy Cooperative Corporation (“Blue Grass Energy”).

1. Applicant KU’s full name and business address are: Kentucky Utilities Company, One Quality Street, Lexington, Kentucky 40507. KU’s mailing address is Kentucky Utilities Company c/o Louisville Gas and Electric Company, 2701 Eastpoint Parkway, Louisville, Kentucky 40223. KU may be reached by electronic mail at the electronic mail addresses of its counsel set forth below.

2. KU was incorporated in Kentucky on August 17, 1912, and in Virginia on November 26, 1991 (and effective as of December 1, 1991), and is in good standing in both Kentucky and Virginia.

3. KU is a public utility, as defined in KRS 278.010(3)(a), engaged in the electric business. KU generates and purchases electricity, and distributes and sells electricity at retail in the following counties in Central, Northern, Southeastern, and Western Kentucky:

5. Description of Changes in Service Territory:

As explained in this application and in the attached exhibits, KU and Blue Grass Energy have individually agreed to the requested territorial changes (six parcels) at the location off South Taylor Lane near Georgetown, KY. The proposed territorial boundary changes serve the purposes of KRS 278.016. The changes avoid the wasteful duplication of facilities, the unnecessary encumbrance of the landscape, and minimizes disputes between retail electric providers. No existing customer will change electric provider.

Parcel #257-00-006.000

The existing homeowner, on parcel #257-00-006.000, has been self-served via a solar powered system since 2025, and is now requesting permanent electric service. The customer is located within KU service territory, however due to tree-clearing and configuration of the existing KU electric utility facilities in the area, Blue Grass Energy can readily extend its electrical service at a lower cost than KU. Therefore, KU agrees to transfer the territory in parcel #257-00-006.000 to Blue Grass Energy to provide service to the customer. See **Exhibit 3**.

Parcel #'s 257-00-006.001, 256-00-009.000, 256-00-014.000, 256-00-015.000 and 257-00-001.000

At the same time, the companies propose to follow parcel boundaries and correct split territories in this immediate area. Currently, the service territory line arbitrarily splits parcel #'s 257-00-006.001, 256-00-009.000, 256-00-014.000, 256-00-015.000 and 257-00-001.000. Any structures within those parcels are currently in Blue Grass Energy territory and are served by Blue Grass Energy. KU does not have any structures receiving service in its service territory within those parcels. Therefore, KU agrees to transfer its service territory located in parcel #'s 257-00-

006.001, 256-00-009.000, 256-00-014.000, 256-00-015.000 and 257-00-001.000. Such an arrangement will permit Blue Grass Energy to provide electrical service to any future structures in the aforementioned parcels.

Therefore, it would be in the best interest of both utilities, and of the existing customers and potential future customers, to change the current service area boundaries.

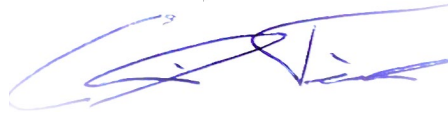
6. Agreement and Maps:

Agreement

Kentucky Utilities Company (“KU”) and Blue Grass Energy Cooperative (“Blue Grass Energy”) hereby agree to a territorial boundary change. The change allows Blue Grass Energy to provide electric service to a home on South Taylor Lane (parcel 257-00-006.000) that has been self-served via a solar system.

The change also corrects split territories in parcel #'s 257-00-006.001, 256-00-009.000, 256-00-014.000, 256-00-015.000 and 257-00-001.000 whereby said parcels become wholly served by Blue Grass Energy.

Blue Grass Energy has existing facilities in the immediate area and is able to easily extend electrical service, which avoids wasteful duplication of facilities, unnecessary encumbering of the landscape and minimizes disputes between retail electric providers.

No existing customers will change providers.
