
The Public Service Commission has received the Confidentiality Petition you filed on March 30, 2009 on behalf of Duke Energy Kentucky, Inc. to protect certain information filed with the Commission as confidential pursuant to Section 7 of 807 KAR 5:001 and KRS 61.870. The information you seek to have treated as confidential is identified as information contained in Duke's Response to Commission's Order in Administrative Case No. 387. The information is specifically contained in Exhibit H to Duke's 2008 Annual Report on non-regulated activities, and more particularly described as Exhibit H, No. 6, consisting of base case demand and energy forecast for the years 2009-2013; and Exhibit H, No. 11, consisting of a schedule of planned outages for generating capacity in the years 2009-2013. Your justification for having the Commission handle this material as confidential is that the public disclosure of the information would compromise Duke's competitive position in the industry and result in an unfair commercial advantage to its competitors.

Based on a review of the information and pursuant to KRS 61.878 and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 7, the Commission has determined that the information you seek to keep confidential is of a proprietary nature, which if publicly disclosed would permit an unfair commercial advantage to Duke's competitors. Therefore, the information requested to be treated as confidential **meets the criteria for confidential protection** and will be maintained as a nonpublic part of the Commission's file in this case. The procedure for usage of confidential materials during formal proceedings may be found at Section 7(8) of 807 KAR 5:001.

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If the information becomes publicly available or no longer warrants confidential treatment, Duke is required by Section 8(9)(a) of 807 KAR 5:001 to inform the Commission so that the information may be placed in the public record.
