

RULES & REGULATIONS

FIRE DEPARTMENTS:

Any city, county, urban-county, charter county, fire protection district, or volunteer fire protection district ("User") may withdraw reasonable quantities of water from the utility's water distribution system for the purpose of fighting fires at any time, or for the purpose of training firefighters as long as the training does not occur during a peak demand time for which advance notice has been communicated verbally, electronically, or in writing by the utility to the User ("Peak Demand Time") or during a time when water usage has been restricted due to drought or other conditions ("Restricted Water Usage"). Such usage shall be at no charge on the condition that the User contacts the utility as soon as possible under the circumstances when each water withdrawal begins, maintains estimates of the amount of water used for fire protection and training during the calendar month, and reports the amount of this water usage to the utility no later than the 15th day of the following calendar month.

Any User that (1) withdraws unreasonable quantities of water from the utility's water distribution system for fire protection or training purposes, (2) withdraws any quantity of water for training purposes during a Peak Demand Time or during a time of Restricted Water Usage, or (3) withdraws any quantity of water at any time for either fighting fires or training firefighters and fails to either contact the utility as soon as possible under the circumstances when each water withdrawal begins or fails to submit the required report on water usage in a timely manner, shall pay the utility the cost of this water. An example of an unreasonable quantity of water for fire protection purposes is an amount which damages or causes contamination of the utility's water system.

A User which violates this rule shall be presumed to have used 0.3 percent of the utility's total water sales for the calendar month for each violation. A User may present evidence of its actual usage to rebut the presumed usage. The utility shall consider this evidence and may adjust the presumed usage amount accordingly. The User shall be billed for this usage at the lowest usage block rate that the utility charges regardless of customer classification. A User shall also be assessed a penalty of \$50.00 for each violation of this rule. Amounts due under this rule shall be due within 30 days after billing and the utility may collect its reasonable attorney's fees paid to collect any delinquent amounts. This tariff replaces the \$5.00 per month fire hydrant rental fee.

Any User which damages the utility's water distribution system shall reimburse the utility for the repair cost.
