CAK'S FIRST DATA REQUESTS TO KENTUCKY POWER COMPANY

Pursuant to the Commission's Procedural Order, Community Action Kentucky, Inc. (CAK) hereby submits the following Data Requests to be answered by a duly authorized representative of Kentucky Power Company within the time and in the manner established by the Commission's Procedural Order in this case. Each response shall be accompanied by the name of the witness responding to such Data Request and shall be verified by said witness as true and accurate to the best of the witness' knowledge and belief.

If an objection is made to any of the Data Requests, a full explanation of the grounds for the objection should be provided. If less than a full answer is provided for any Data Request, a full explanation for the reason that less than a full answer has been provided shall be given. Kentucky Power Company shall be under a continuing obligation to provide the information sought or to correct answers previously given if new information is obtained making the prior answer less than completely accurate.

DATA REQUESTS


1. For residential customers of Kentucky Power Company, please provide the following information:
 - a) The total number of residential customers whose service has been disconnected in each of the years 2007, 2008, and 2009, broken down by county;
 - b) The total number of residential customers for each of the years 2007, 2008, and 2009, broken down by county;
 - c) The total number of disconnections of service of residential customers (some customers' service may have been disconnected multiple times) for each of the years 2007, 2008, and 2009, broken down by county;
 - d) The rate of disconnection of service of residential customers for each of the years 2007, 2008, and 2009, broken down by county.

2. Does the company plan to expand its Home Energy Assistance (HEA) program as part of this rate increase request, either by:
 - a) Proposing to increase the residential low income energy assistance surcharge from ten cents (\$.10) per meter per month to a higher charge; or
 - b) Reinstating its prior program of matching shareholder dollars to total dollars collected from residential customers, as existed in the first two years of the energy assistance program; or
 - c) Doing both?

If your answer to any of the three questions posed by 2(a)(b) or (c) is Yes, please provide a full explanation of the proposal to be presented by Kentucky Power Company as part of

this case. If your answer to any of the three questions posed by 2(a)(b) or (c) is No, please provide a full explanation as to why Kentucky Power Company is taking the position that expansion of the HEA program is not warranted, given the size of the residential rate increase requested by the Company.

3. Please explain in laymen's terms why Kentucky Power Company is seeking a Thirty Five Percent (35%) residential rate increase just four years after it sought a Thirty Five Percent (35%) residential rate increase?

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
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
