



General

Breathitt County Water District (BCWD) is a Class "C" Water District organized in August 2003 by the Breathitt County Judge Executive. The County Judge Executive then appointed five commissioners to serve on the Water District's Board. These five commissioners then selected a Chairman from the appointed board.

Currently (November 2011), the BCWD has approximately 1,162 customers. The completion of the KY 476 Waterline Extension currently under construction could increase the District's customer base to over 1,377 customers.

Jackson, the county seat, operates an independent water system (Jackson Municipal Water Works), drawing water from the North Fork of the Kentucky River. The system currently serves approximately 2,000 households within the Jackson service area. The water treatment plant (WTP), capable of producing 2.5 MGD, is expected to supply the potable water product to the various county water line extensions. Daily production by Jackson Municipal Water Works is currently 800,000 gallons (33% of plant capacity) and their storage capacity is presently 925,000 gallons. This proposed project is a continuation of BCWD's efforts to deliver potable drinking water to all residents of Breathitt County outside Jackson's service area. Jackson's WTP is expected to have more than adequate capacity to supply the needed potable water for this proposed project.

Breathitt County, which encompasses the City of Jackson, is located in the eastern coalfields of Kentucky, approximately 85 miles south and east of Lexington on KY 15, and approximately 34 miles north of Hazard. Jackson, the county seat, is a fourth class city located near the center of Breathitt County. The County borders Wolfe, Lee, Owsley, Perry, Knott, and Magoffin Counties. (See Figure 1)

The 2000 US Census figure for Breathitt County is 16,100 persons. There are 6,170 occupied housing units in Breathitt County and therefore 2.61 persons per household.

Major highways passing through Jackson and/or Breathitt County are KY 15, KY 30, KY 52, KY 315, KY 1110, KY 476 and KY 205. Some of these listed areas are already provided potable water service by Breathitt County Water District (BCWD). The ultimate proposed project will bring potable water to the residents along KY 1098 to the area known a Press as well as other minor roads.

1. Project Planning Area

The project area for the proposed waterline extension project includes Duck Hollow, Copeland & River Caney along with all adjacent side roads. The majority of construction activities will occur within KTC ROW and/or county ROW. Where necessary, easements and property for installation of the main and ancillary facilities will be secured for the project as soon as funding is solidified.

a. Location – The location of the proposed project is as indicated on the sections of U.S.G.S. Topographical map included as **Attachment 1**.

- b. Environmental Resources Present This project is located within the boundaries of Breathitt County.
- c. Growth Areas & Population Trends According to figures obtained from the Kentucky State Data Center in Louisville, Breathitt County is projected to decrease in population. Thus, this project does not consider future growth as part of design.

2. Existing Facilities

- a. Location Map Location of the existing water distribution facilities as identified on **Attachment 2**.
- b. History The City of Jackson owns and operates the only water treatment plant in Breathitt County. Breathitt County Water District has multiple purchase points with master meters located at each purchase point throughout the BCWD's distribution system. All of BCWD distribution system has been constructed in the last 10 years.
- c. Condition of Facilities The district's existing water distribution system is in excellent condition with all of the system being less than 10 years old. Tanks have been constructed throughout the distribution system to provide adequate pressures and storage within the service area.
- d. Financial Status of any Existing Facilities The district operates all water infrastructure facilities in a financially solvent manner. Audits are performed on an annual basis and rates are reviewed as necessary by an outside consultant to insure adequate financial resources to operate and maintain the system.

3. Need for Project

- a. Health, Sanitation & Security This project intends to extend potable water to existing residents that currently have no access to public potable water. Most of the residents within the project area have well water for domestic use. Well water, in the project area, is extremely hard and contains noticeable amounts of iron. Salty water may be found from 50 feet to several hundred feet below the level of the principal valley bottoms. Where spring supply water, the yield is rarely more than 5 GPM. A more reliable and healthy source for water is needed for the residents.
- System O & M Operation and maintenance of the new water system improvements will be provided by the existing, certified and licensed staff of the Breathitt County Water District.
- c. Growth Growth is not considered a significant factor in the need for the proposed project.

4. Proposed Project-Project Cost-Rates


- a. Proposed Project The proposed Duck Hollow, Copeland & River Caney Waterline Extension project consists of two separate contracts: Contract 1 contains the waterlines, telemetry, booster station improvements and appurtenances. Contract 2 contains the ground storage tank and related items.
- b. Project Cost On February 23, 2012 the district received sealed bids for Contract 1 and Contract 2. Attachment 3 and Attachment 4 displays the certified bid tabulations for each contract, respectively. Attachment 5 details the project budget based upon these bids.
- c. Funding Funds have been secured from the Division of Abandoned Mine Lands (AML) of an amount in excess of the project budget. These funds are 100% grant and therefore no debt will be incurred by the BCWD. These grant agreements are included as **Attachment 6a & 6b**.
- d. Rates Rates have not been adjusted per this project.


5. State Approval – DOW



THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (the AGREEMENT) is made and entered of first day of July, 2010, by and between the Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Energy and Environment Cabinet, with an address of Capital Plaza Tower, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601, hereinafter known as "the Cabinet," and Breathitt Co Water District, with an address of 1137 Main Street, Jackson Ky. 41339, hereinafter known as "the District".

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, a groundwater contamination study performed by the Division of Abandoned Mine Lands (AML) found that groundwater well samples taken from homes in the Copeland, Duck Hollow, and River Caney Creek study area in Breathitt County, have been impacted by AML-eligible mining; and

WHEREAS, the study identified impacts from pre-law and interim coal mining as factors contributing to the reported groundwater problems; and

WHEREAS, approximately 105 residences located in the combined study areas described above are within the affected area, and a predominate number of those were found to be AML-eligible; and

WHEREAS, the Cabinet and the District wish to begin preparing design plans for an extension of water service into the study areas listed above, to provide relief to the AML-affected residents;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt, mutuality and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by the parties to this AGREEMENT, the Cabinet and the District hereby COVENANT AND AGREE as follows:

1. OBLIGATIONS OF THE CABINET



- 1.1 The Cabinet shall undertake the following obligations:
 - A. When requested to do so, the Cabinet shall forward the written report of any archaeological survey to the Kentucky Heritage Council and the Office of State Archaeology, University of Kentucky, for review.
 - B. The Cabinet shall review and concur, if acceptable, with proposed contracts for preparation of plans and specifications prepared by the District.
 - C. The Cabinet shall provide Request for Payment forms to the District.
 - D. The Cabinet shall review project, financial and status reports received from the City.
 - E. The Cabinet shall process payments to the District promptly after receipt of Requests for Payment and progress reports.
 - F. The Cabinet shall provide an affidavit form entitled, "Campaign Finance Law Compliance" to be included in the bid documents.
- 1.2 The Cabinet has been awarded a Federal grant to be used toward completion of the Project, and the following information pertains to that award:
 - A. Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) Number: 15.252,
 - B. CFDA Title: Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation (AMLR) Program,
 - C. Award Name and Grant Number: 2010 Abandoned Mine Lands Grant, S09AP1537

- D. Federal Awarding Agency: Office of Surface Mining Redimer Enforcement, Department of the Interior
- Red man Phy
- E. Applicable Compliance Requirements: Additional compliance requirements for this Project are contained in Circular A-133, a copy of which the Cabinet has provided to the City.

2. OBLIGATIONS OF THE DISTRICT


- 2.1 The District shall undertake the following obligations:
 - A. The District shall provide to the Cabinet completed design drawings, technical specifications and other construction-related documents, in electronic and paper format, as soon as they have been completed. The District shall submit a detailed hydraulic analysis/profile of the existing water supply system and the proposed expansion
 - B. The District may contract preparation of design drawings, technical specifications and other construction-related documents to other governmental agencies or to private sector companies. The District will procure engineering contracts in accordance with applicable state and federal laws and regulations. Specifically, the District agrees to act in accordance with KRS 45A, "Kentucky Model Procurement Code", and the Federal Office of Management and Budget Circular A-87, "Cost Principles for State and Local Governments". Contracts with other governmental agencies and/or private sector companies shall be submitted to the Cabinet's Division of Abandoned Mine Lands (DAML) for review and concurrence, prior to execution by the District.
 - C. The District shall comply with the provisions of Section 106 of the Natural Historical Preservation Act of 1966, as amended (16 U.S.C. §§ 470); Executive Order

No. 11593, which relates to the identification and protection of historic protection and the Archaeological and Historic Preservation Act of 1974 (16 U.S.C §§ 169(a)(1) et seq.)

In particular, an archaeological survey shall be performed for all areas, such as tank sites and pump stations, proposed for disturbance outside of highway rights-of-way, unless the site and the access thereto have previously been disturbed.

- D. The District shall submit preliminary design drawings and technical specifications to DAML for review and concurrence, to assure adherence to the defined project scope. The District shall submit the necessary contract documents to the Cabinet's Division of Water for their review and approval in accordance with Chapter 224 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes.
- E. Following review and concurrence by DAML and the Division of Water, the District shall submit two complete bid packages, including design drawings, technical specifications and other contract documents, and a construction cost estimate to DAML.
- F. The District shall submit, on a regular basis, a Project status report to DAML. The report is to be accompanied by a financial report during the portion of the performance period that design activities are occurring. The status and financial reports shall be submitted upon completion of significant sections of the design. The reports and requests for payments shall be submitted on a monthly basis if required in writing by DAML. A "Request for Payment" form with an itemization of eligible Project costs attached shall be submitted at scheduled intervals as design work progresses. The Request for Payment forms shall be provided by DAML. The Chairman or the Cahirman's designee must sign payment requests. The District shall provide written

notification to the Division of Abandoned Mine Lands of any designees will given signatory authority.




- G. The District shall establish a special Project identification code for all work performed under this Agreement and records shall be maintained of all related work, whether performed by the District, or other governmental agencies or private sector companies.
- H. The District shall establish a separate bank account that reflects federal receipts and shall furnish bank statements for months in which payments are received. These statements shall be submitted to the Cabinet to the attention of the Finance Branch, Division of Administrative Services, 4th Floor, Capitol Plaza Tower, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601.
- I. The District shall have an audit made, if required by funding levels, in accordance with OMB Circular A-133. "Audits of State and Local Governments", which is incorporated into this AGREEMENT by reference. A copy of the audit report shall be provided to the Cabinet within 30 days after completion of the audit, but no later than one year after the end of the audit period
- J. The District shall obtain prior approval for acquisition of equipment under this MOA. Requests for equipment acquisition authorization should be submitted to: Finance Branch, Division of Administrative Services, 4th Floor, Capital Plaza Tower, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601.
- K. The District shall require all consultants and/or contractors to carry Worker's Compensation and Public Liability Insurance: single limit coverage of at least \$1,000,000.00. Proof of insurance shall be submitted to the Cabinet upon request.

- L. 43CFR12 is incorporated by reference.
- M. The District shall require the Consultant to sign and submit to the Division of Abandoned Mine Lands a Campaign Finance Law Compliance affidavit in accordance with KRS 45A.110 and KRS 45A.115. Failure by the Consultant to provide the affidavit shall be grounds for disqualification.
- 2.2 The District shall retain all records relating to the Project until such records are audited by the Cabinet, or for three years after submitting the close-out report to the federal Office of Surface Mining, whichever first occurs. The District shall advise the Cabinet in writing if the Project is to be administered by another governmental entity on its behalf and the Project-related records will be maintained at an alternate site.
- 2.3 The District shall cooperate fully with the Cabinet in order to facilitate the obligations set out in this AGREEMENT including, but not limited to, allowing the Cabinet to inspect all records pertaining to the project at any time.
- 2.4 The District shall complete the Project no later than June 30, 2013, unless the Cabinet grants a written extension.

3. MUTUALITY OF OBLIGATIONS

3.1 The obligations imposed upon the parties to this AGREEMENT are for the benefit of the parties and the timely fulfillment of each and every obligation in accordance with this AGREEMENT is necessary. The failure of any party to fulfill any of its obligations under this AGREEMENT shall constitute a breach of this AGREEMENT, and shall entitle the other party to commence appropriate legal or equitable action to enforce its rights under this AGREEMENT, unless the fulfillment of such obligation is waived or modified by the affected party. All waivers

shall be in writing, signed by the affected party, and a waiver of one breach shall rewaiver of any other breach.



- 3.2 In the event of a material breach by either party to this AGREEMENT, the other party may terminate this AGREEMENT, as provided in paragraph 8 herein, without further obligation to the other party. The rights of the parties to this AGREEMENT to pursue remedies for breach of any of the provisions hereof shall survive the termination, expiration or cancellation of this AGREEMENT.
- 3.3 Except as otherwise provided in this AGREEMENT, the parties to this AGREEMENT shall be solely responsible for any costs incurred in fulfilling their obligations under this AGREEMENT.

4. <u>METHOD OF PAYMENT</u>

- 4.1 The maximum amount of compensation to the District from the Cabinet pursuant to this AGREEMENT is One-Hundred and Eight Thousand and Five Hundred Dollars (\$108,500.00) unless subsequently amended in writing. Any funds not expended pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall revert to or remain with the Cabinet. The District shall be reimbursed only for actual expenses incurred pursuant to this AGREEMENT. Payment shall be based on the percentage of the project that has been completed at the time that the request for payment is made.
- 4.2 Payments on this instrument shall not be authorized for services rendered after Government Contract Review Subcommittee disapproval of this instrument, unless the decision of the Committee is overridden by the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet or the agency head, if the agency has been granted delegation authority.

4.3 The parties agree that the Cabinet's funds are appropriated by the United States Congress from funds allocated to Kentucky pursuant to Section 402(g)(2) of Public II aw 95-87. The parties further agree and understand that this AGREEMENT will only become effective upon approval of the Project by the U. S. Office of Surface Mining (OSM). The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance number for this Project is CFDA #15-252.

5. TERM OF AGREEMENT


This AGREEMENT shall be effective on July 1, 2010 or upon approval by the Government Contract Review Subcommittee if that constitutes a different date, and shall expire on June 30, 2013 or upon the final completion of the Project as specified in Sections 1 and 2 of this AGREEMENT, whichever first occurs, unless extended in writing by the parties or terminated earlier in accordance with the terms hereof.

6. ASSURANCES

The parties shall comply with:

- 6.1 The Common Rule, which is incorporated by reference into this AGREEMENT.
- 6.2 The Anti-Drug Abuse Act (P.L. 100-690), which requires recipients of Federal funds to certify that they have met requirements designed to promote a drug-free workplace.

 - B. Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended (20 U.S.C. §§ 1681-1683 and 1685-1686), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex;

C. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U which prohibits discrimination on the basis of handicaps;



- D. The Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended (42 U.S.C. §§ 6101-6107), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of age;
- E. The Drug Abuse Prevention, Treatment and Rehabilitation Act of 1972 (P.L. 92-255), as amended, relating to nondiscrimination on the basis of drug abuse;
- F. The Comprehensive Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism Prevention, Treatment and Rehabilitation Act of 1970 (P.L. 91-616), as amended, relating to nondiscrimination on the basis of alcohol abuse or alcoholism;
- G. §§ 523 527 of the Public Health Service Act of 1912 (42 U.S.C. 290 dd-3 and 290 ee-3), as amended, relating to confidentiality of alcohol and drug abuse patient records;
- H. Any other nondiscrimination provisions in the specific statute(s) under which application for Federal assistance is being made or any other nondiscrimination statute(s) that apply to this AGREEMENT;
- Office of Management and Budget Circular A-102.
- 6.4 The Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. §§ 1501-1508 and 7324-7328), which limits the political activities of employees whose principal employment activities are funded in whole or in part with federal funds.
- 6.5 Where required by law, the parties to this AGREEMENT shall comply with the Executive Branch Code of Ethics (KRS Chapter 11A) and all applicable state and federal statutes relating to nondiscrimination.

6.6 The parties certify, by the signatures of duly authorized representatives bereinafter affixed, that they are legally entitled to enter into this AGREEMENT and that they shall not be violating, either directly or indirectly, any conflict of interest statute of the Commonwealth of Kentucky by performance of this AGREEMENT. Further, the parties promise that they presently have no conflict of interest, in any manner or degree, with the performance of services required to be performed under this AGREEMENT, and that no persons having any such conflict of interest shall be employed.

7. CHOICE OF LAW AND FORUM

- 7.1 All questions as to the execution, validity, interpretation, construction, and performance of this AGREEMENT or any of its terms shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
- 7.2 Any suit, action or other proceeding regarding the execution, validity, interpretation, construction, or performance of this AGREEMENT shall be filed in the Franklin Circuit Court of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

8. CANCELLATION

Either party has the right to terminate or cancel this AGREEMENT without cause upon thirty days prior written notice to the other party, or for cause at any time without prior written notice.

9. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

9.1 The headings set forth in this AGREEMENT are for convenience of reference only, and the words contained therein shall in no way be intended to explain, modify, amplify or aid in the interpretation, construction or meaning of the provisions of this AGREEMENT.

9.2 The terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their successors and assigns. This provision shall not be construed to permit assignment by any party of any of its rights or duties under this AGREEMENT, which assignment shall be prohibited except with the prior written consent of all parties hereto. Such consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

9.3 This AGREEMENT sets forth the entire understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, supersedes all existing agreements among them concerning the subject matter hereof, and may be modified only by a written instrument duly executed by each of the parties hereto.

9.4 Time is of the essence in the performance of each of the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT.

9.5 All notices, requests, demands, waivers, and other communications given as provided in this AGREEMENT shall be in writing, sent by First Class Mail, deemed effective upon mailing, and addressed as follows:

- 9.6 Either party to this AGREEMENT may change the address at which compared notices, requests, demands, waivers, and other communications, on the condition that party first provides written notice of that change of address to the other party.
- 9.7 Nothing in this AGREEMENT shall be interpreted as guaranteeing the rights of any person or governmental agency other than the parties to this AGREEMENT.
- 9.8 If a provision of this AGREEMENT or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be declared to be invalid or unenforceable to any extent, the remainder of this AGREEMENT and the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby and shall be enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- 9.9 This AGREEMENT may be executed simultaneously in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which together shall constitute but one and the same instrument. It shall not be necessary that any single counterpart hereof be executed by all parties hereto so long as at least one counterpart is executed by each party.
- 9.10 Except to the extent otherwise expressly specified in this AGREEMENT, all remedies specified herein are in addition to, and not in lieu of, other remedies available to the parties both at law and in equity.

10. ACCESS TO CONTRACTOR'S BOOKS, DOCUMENTS, PAPERS, RECORDS, OR OTHER EVIDENCE DIRECTLY PERTINENT TO THE CONTRACT

The Cabinet and the Finance and Administration Cabinet may audit or review all documentation and records pertaining to the Project pursuant to the provisions of KRS 45A.150, and may make other inspections pursuant to the provisions of KRS 45A.150. The Cabinet, the Finance and Administration Cabinet, the Auditor of Public Accounts, and the Legislative Research

Commission, or their duly authorized representatives, shall have access to any book papers, records, or other evidence which is directly pertinent to this AGREEMENT for the purpose of financial audit or program review. Furthermore, any books, documents papers, records, or other evidence provided to the Cabinet, the Finance and Administration Cabinet, the Auditor of Public Accounts, or the Legislative Research Commission that are directly pertinent to this AGREEMENT shall be subject to public disclosure regardless of the proprietary nature of the information, unless specific information is identified and exempted and agreed to by the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet as meeting the provisions of KRS 61.878(1) (c) prior to the execution of the AGREEMENT. The Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet shall not restrict the public release of any information that would otherwise be subject to public release if a state government agency was providing the services.





THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (the AGREEMENT) is made and first day of July, 2011, by and between the Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Energy and Environment Cabinet, with an address of Capital Plaza Tower, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601, hereinafter known as "the Cabinet," and "Breathitt County Water District", with an address of 1137 Main Street, Suite 305, Jackson, Ky. 41339, hereinafter known as "The District".

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, a groundwater contamination study known as the "Copeland, Duck Hollow, River Caney, Groundwater Contamination Study" performed by Kentucky Division of Abandoned Mine Lands (AML) personnel, Found that groundwater in an area known as Copeland, Duck Hollow, and River Caney in Breathitt County, Kentucky have been impacted by AML-eligible mining; and

WHEREAS, the study identified impacts from predominantly pre-law and interim coal mining as factors contributing to the reported groundwater problems; and

WHEREAS, approximately 105 residences located in the study area described above are within the affected area, and a vast majority of those were found to be AML-eligible; and

WHEREAS, the Cabinet and the District entered into a Master Agreement Order # PO2 128 1000005783 which provided funds for, among other things, the preparation of plans and specifications for an extension of water service into the affected area; and

WHEREAS, the Cabinet and the District wish to begin preparation of water service into the previously described area, to provide relief to the AML affected residents;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt, mutuality and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by the parties to this AGREEMENT, the Cabinet and the District hereby COVENANT AND AGREE as follows:

1. OBLIGATIONS OF THE CABINET

- 1.1 The Cabinet shall undertake the following obligations:
 - A. When requested to do so, the Cabinet shall forward the written report of any archaeological survey to the Kentucky Heritage Council and the Office of State Archaeology, University of Kentucky, for review.
 - B. The Cabinet shall review and concur, if acceptable, with proposed contracts for preparation of plans and specifications prepared by the District.
 - C. The Cabinet shall provide Request for Payment forms to the District.
 - D. The Cabinet shall participate in monthly progress meetings, as necessary, and review monthly project financial and status reports received from the District.
 - E. The Cabinet shall process payments to the District promptly after receipt of monthly Requests for Payment and progress reports.

- F. The Cabinet shall participate in the final inspection of the Project.

- G. The Cabinet shall provide an affidavit form entitled, "Campaign Finance Law Compliance" to be included in the bid documents.
- 1.2 The Cabinet has been awarded a Federal grant to be used toward completion of the Project, and the following information pertains to that award:
 - A. Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) Number: 15.252,
 - B. CFDA Title: Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation (AMLR) Program,
 - C. Award Name and Grant Number: 2011 Abandoned Mine Lands Grant, 30th
 Annual Grant Year.
 - D. Federal Awarding Agency: Office of Surface Mining Reclamation and Enforcement, Department of the Interior
 - E. Applicable Compliance Requirements: Additional compliance requirements for this Project are contained in Circular A-133, a copy of which the Cabinet has provided to the District.

2. OBLIGATIONS OF THE DISTRICT


- 2.1 The City shall undertake the following obligations:
 - A. The District has or shall provide to the Cabinet completed design drawings, technical specifications and other construction-related documents in both paper and electronic format.


- B. The District has or shall submit the necessary contract documents to the adjust's Division of Water for its review and approval in accordance with Chapter 224 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes. The District shall obtain all other required permits or certifications.
- C. The District shall comply with the provisions of Section 106 of the National Historical Preservation Act of 1966, as amended (16 U.S.C. § 470); Executive Order No. 11593, which relates to the identification and protection of historic properties; and the Archaeological and Historic Preservation Act of 1974 (16 U.S.C. §§ 469(a)(1) et. seq.). In particular, an archaeological survey shall be performed for all areas, such as tank sites and pump stations, proposed for disturbance outside of highway rights-of-way, unless the site and access thereto have previously been disturbed. Three copies of the written report resulting from such an archaeological survey shall be submitted to the Cabinet's Division of Abandoned Mine Lands.
- D. The District shall provide adequate construction supervision during the period of contract performance. The District shall provide a copy of any contract for construction supervision to the Cabinet's Division of Abandoned Mine Lands for review and approval prior to execution.
- E. The District shall submit, on a monthly basis, a Project status report to the Cabinet's Division of Abandoned Mine Lands. The report shall include a financial report prepared while construction activities are ongoing. A "Request for Payment" form with an itemization of eligible Project costs attached shall accompany monthly reports. The Mayor, District Chairman, or his designee shall sign the Request for Payment forms.

- F. The District shall establish a special Project identification code of all related work, performed under this AGREEMENT and records shall be maintained or all related work, whether performed by The District, other governmental agencies, or private companies.
- G. The District shall establish a separate bank account of Federal receipts, and shall mail monthly bank statements to the Cabinet as follows: Finance Branch, Office of Administrative and Information Support, 4th Floor, Capitol Plaza Tower, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601.
- H. The District has or shall submit Tabulation of Construction Bids and any Notices of Award to the Division of Abandoned Mine Lands.
- I. The District and any of its subcontractors shall maintain records in accordance with 30 C.F.R. 886.24, which is incorporated into this AGREEMENT by reference. Project-related records shall be available for inspection and audit by the Cabinet.
- J. The District shall submit copies of Resident Inspector Daily Reports and Progress

 Meeting Minutes to the Division of Abandoned Mine Lands.
- K. The District shall submit As-Built plans upon completion of the Project.
- L. The District shall submit a written "close-out" report for the Project citing any problems occurring during the performance period of the contract, and the resolution of any problems.
- M. The District shall schedule a "final" inspection with the Cabinet upon completion of Project construction work.

- N. The District shall procure all engineering or construction contract in a procure with applicable state and federal laws and regulations. Specifically, The District agrees to comply with all pertinent provisions of KRS 45A, "Kentucky Model Procurement Code".
- O. The District shall have an audit performed in accordance with OMB Circular A133, "Audits of State and Local Governments". A copy of the audit report shall be
 provided to the Cabinet within 30 days after completion of the audit, but no later than
 nine months after the end of the audit period.
- P. The District shall obtain prior Cabinet approval for acquisition of equipment under this MOA. Requests for equipment acquisition authorization, other than that implicit to the water supply project, shall be submitted to: Office of Administrative and Information Services, 4th Floor, Capital Plaza Tower, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601.
- Q. The District shall require all consultants and contractors to carry Workers Compensation and Public Liability Insurance, with single limit coverage of at least \$1,000,000.00. Proof of insurance shall be submitted to the Cabinet upon request.
- R. The District has or shall submit the names of the low bidder for the construction contract and all subcontracts to the Cabinet so that the Cabinet may conduct an Office of Surface Mining Applicant Violator System review. The Cabinet may reject the low bidder or any subcontractor if the review identifies the low bidder or subcontractor as a mining violator. The District shall provide the Cabinet with a copy of each contractor/subcontractor's federal ID#, mailing address and phone number.





- T. The District shall require each bidder to sign and submit to the Division of Abandoned Mine Lands a Campaign Finance Law Compliance affidavit in accordance with KRS 45A.110 and KRS 45A.115. Failure by the bidder to provide the affidavit shall be grounds for disqualification.
- 2.2 The District shall retain all records relating to the Project until such records are audited by the Cabinet, or for three years after submitting the close-out report to the federal Office of Surface Mining, whichever first occurs. The District shall advise the Cabinet in writing if the Project is to be administered by another governmental entity on its behalf and the Project-related records will be maintained at an alternate site.
- 2.3 The District shall cooperate fully with the Cabinet in order to facilitate the obligations set out in this AGREEMENT including, but not limited to, allowing the Cabinet to inspect all records pertaining to the project at any time.
- 2.4 The District shall complete the Project no later than June 30, 2014, unless the Cabinet grants a written extension.

3. MUTUALITY OF OBLIGATIONS

3.1 The obligations imposed upon the parties to this AGREEMENT are for the benefit of the parties and the timely fulfillment of each and every obligation in accordance with this AGREEMENT is necessary. The failure of any party to fulfill any of its obligations under this AGREEMENT shall constitute a breach of this AGREEMENT, and shall entitle the other party

- 3.2 In the event of a material breach by either party to this AGREEMENT, the other party may terminate this AGREEMENT, as provided in paragraph 8 herein, without further obligation to the other party. The rights of the parties to this AGREEMENT to pursue remedies for breach of any of the provisions hereof shall survive the termination, expiration or cancellation of this AGREEMENT.
- 3.3 Except as otherwise provided in this AGREEMENT, the parties to this AGREEMENT shall be solely responsible for any costs incurred in fulfilling their obligations under this AGREEMENT.

4. METHOD OF PAYMENT

4.1 The maximum amount of compensation to the City from the Cabinet pursuant to this AGREEMENT is One Million Seven Hundred and Fifty Thousand dollars (\$1,750,000.00), unless subsequently amended in writing. Any funds not expended pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall revert to or remain with the Cabinet. The District shall be reimbursed only for actual expenses incurred pursuant to this AGREEMENT. Payment shall be based on the percentage of the project that has been completed at the time that the request for payment is made.

- 4.2 Payments on this instrument shall not be authorized for services redden after Government Contract Review Subcommittee disapproval of this instrument, unless the decision of the Committee is overridden by the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet or the agency head, if the agency has been granted delegation authority.
- 4.3 The parties agree that the Cabinet's funds are appropriated by the United States Congress from funds allocated to Kentucky pursuant to Section 402(g)(2) of Public Law 95-87. The parties further agree and understand that this AGREEMENT will only become effective upon approval of the Project by the U. S. Office of Surface Mining (OSM). The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance number for this Project is CFDA #15-252.

5. TERM OF AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT shall be effective on July 1, 2011 or upon approval by the Government Contract Review Subcommittee if that constitutes a different date, and shall expire on June 30, 2014 or upon the final completion of the Project as specified in Sections 1 and 2 of this AGREEMENT, whichever first occurs, unless extended in writing by the parties or terminated earlier in accordance with the terms hereof.

6. ASSURANCES

The parties shall comply with:

- 6.1 The Common Rule, which is incorporated by reference into this AGREEMENT.
- 6.2 The Anti-Drug Abuse Act (P.L. 100-690), which requires recipients of Federal funds to certify that they have met requirements designed to promote a drug-free workplace.



- 6.5 The Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. §§ 1501-1508 and 7324-7328), which limits the political activities of employees whose principal employment activities are funded in whole or in part with federal funds.
- 6.6 The Copeland Act (40 U.S.C. § 276(c) and 18 U.S.C. § 874) and the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. §§ 327-333), regarding labor standards for federally-assisted construction sub-agreements.

- H. Comply with the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act of 1968 (16 U.S.C. §§ 1271 et seq).
- 6.9 The parties shall comply with the Executive Branch Code of Ethics (KRS Chapter 11A) and all state statutes relating to nondiscrimination.
- 6.10 The parties certify, by the signatures of duly authorized representatives hereinafter affixed, that they are legally entitled to enter into this AGREEMENT and that they shall not be violating, either directly or indirectly, any conflict of interest statute of the Commonwealth of Kentucky by performance of this AGREEMENT. Further, the parties promise that they presently have no conflict of interest, in any manner or degree, with the performance of services required to be performed under this AGREEMENT, and that no persons having any such conflict of interest shall be employed.

7. CHOICE OF LAW AND FORUM

7.1 All questions as to the execution, validity, interpretation, construction, and performance of this AGREEMENT or any of its terms shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

7.2 Any suit, action or other proceeding regarding the execution, validity in construction, or performance of this AGREEMENT shall be filed in the Franklin Circuit Court of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.


8. CANCELLATION

Furthermore, any books, documents papers, records, or other evidence provided to the Cabinet, the Finance and Administration Cabinet, the Auditor of Public Accounts, or the Legislative Research Commission that are directly pertinent to this AGREEMENT shall be subject to public disclosure regardless of the proprietary nature of the information, unless specific information is identified and exempted and agreed to by the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet as meeting the provisions of KRS 61.878(1) (c) prior to the execution of the AGREEMENT. Dear Mr. Thorpe:

We have reviewed the plans and specifications for the above referenced project. The plans include the construction of approximately 25,681 ft of 6-inch PVC waterline, 910 ft of 6-inch DI waterline, 734 ft of 4-inch DI waterline, 14,205 ft of 4-inch PVC waterline, 10,268 ft of 2-inch PVC waterline, a booster pump station with 2 pumps operating at 16 gpm and 300 ft TDH and a 44,000 gallon ground storage tank. This is to advise that plans and specifications for the above referenced project are APPROVED with respect to sanitary features of design, as of this date with the requirements contained in the attached construction permit.

For the purpose of review, DOW will not approve lines less than 3-inches for distribution. When 2-inch lines are proposed for distribution they are approved on a case-by-case basis with the stipulations that such cannot be extended. In areas where lines may be extended in the future, DOW reserves the right to approve 3-inch waterlines as a minimum diameter.

Based on the hydraulic analysis/data submitted, the areas served by the Upper River Caney, Lower River Caney, KY 1278 and Duck Hollow Road extensions are considered to be underserved. This designation indicates that without improvements to the existing infrastructure, future extensions may not be able to provide the required minimum pressure of 30 psi on the discharge side of customers' meters. Without improvements to the infrastructure, future extensions may be denied.

The plans include the construction of approximately 86 ft of 8-inch HDPE waterline, 2,795 ft of 6-inch DI waterline, 22,870 ft of 6-inch PVC waterline, 130 ft of 6-inch HDPE waterline, 8,169 ft of 4-inch PVC waterline, 36 ft of 4-inch HDPE waterline, 450 ft of 4-inch DI waterline, and 506 ft of 2-inch PVC waterline. Plans also include the construction of a booster pump station with two pumps at 80 gpm and 374 ft TDH with a booster chlorinator system and a 31,000 gallon ground storage tank.
