I am in favor of the overlay option for the area code region of 270 and 364. I agree with the notion that the overlay option will consume less economic resources to implement, for both consumers and providers. I have experienced the area code overlay while living in Dallas, TX and after the initial learning curve that requires 10-digit dialing, little problems remained. In fact, with speed dial and automatic dial on both landline and mobile phones, I don't think it would be too difficult to use a 10-digit dialing system.

My only concern with the overlay system, is reaching the more rural parts of the 270 area code. Public hearings and advertisements in the larger metro cities is warranted, but I hope that the word and any training needed will reach the more rural parts of the area.
