Re. having a "smart meter" installed on my home

I demand/request that all Kentucky utility customers be given a penalty-free opt-out to having any kind of a smart meter installed on our homes that transmits data wirelessly AND/OR gives time of usage reports to an electric utility. Meters that transmit any time of usage -- including daily usage -- are not acceptable. A meter that transmits electronically (over electrical wires) a monthly usage figure is acceptable.

Analog meters work just fine with no health or privacy concerns.
