SUBJECT: February 20, 2013 Informal Conference

A telephonic informal conference was held on February 20, 2013 at the request of Commission Staff. The attendance sheet is attached to this memorandum. The purpose of the informal conference was to discuss, among other things, Duke Energy Kentucky, Inc.'s ("Duke Kentucky") Energy Management and Information System ("EMIS") limited pilot program.

In response to Commission Staff's inquiry, Duke Kentucky stated the EMIS program has not been implemented and that the program was a few months away from a roll-out. Duke Kentucky is currently in the process of identifying potential participants as well as assessing vendor selection.

Duke Kentucky indicated that the vendor would be responsible for the following tasks: (1) deployment of the EMIS software; (2) provide the energy analysis; (3) acquisition of the EMIS licensing fee; (3) provide a quarterly check-in with participants to discuss any usage aberration that the EMIS software would record; and (4) provide training to the customers on how to use the software and understand usage patterns.

Duke Kentucky further indicated that the EMIS Program would be implemented on a limited pilot basis for two or three years.

Commission Staff asked whether Duke Kentucky was requesting Commission approval, in this proceeding, regarding including renters as part of the Refrigerator Replacement portion of the Low Income Services Program, and the response was no. Duke Kentucky is still reviewing the inclusion of renters in this program. The company's intent was to keep the Commission informed as to this consideration.

There being no further discussions, the conference was adjourned.
