Mr. Dutton advised that Leanna Wilkerson told him that she would no longer be representing the City of Clinton. No one participated in the informal conference on behalf of the City of Clinton.1

Ms. Morris advised that Hickman County Judge Executive Greg Pruitt and Allen Poole, City of Clinton Administrator, intend to make public comments at the hearing.

Mr. Dutton identified Andrea Crane as the witness for the Office of the Attorney General.

Mr. Osterloh indicated that Mr. Neyzelman would replace Lowell Yap as a witness. Mr. Dutton, Ms. Goad, Ms. Morris, and Ms. Ramser all expressed opposition to Mr. Neyzelman replacing Mr. Yap as a witness. Mr. Yap is the person who submitted prepared testimony and responded to data requests. Mr. Osterloh indicated that Mr. Neyzelman would adopt Mr. Yap's testimony and responses.

Mr. Dutton advised that all of Water Service Corporation of Kentucky's witnesses should be prepared for cross-examination.

Ms. Ramser advised that Ms. Lupton will be able to testify telephonically should technical issues prevent her from testifying via video conference.

Mr. Frost advised that Water Service Corporation of Kentucky should be prepared to provide additional information regarding: the breakdown of the \$153,000 Clinton Sewer expenses; depreciation regarding computers and transportation; and clarification of contradictions between the rebuttal testimony and rebuttal spreadsheets.

Ms. Ramser stated that the amount of revenue increase sought by Water Service Corporation of Kentucky was not consistent. Mr. Osterloh inquired about the inclusion of rates from the purchase water agreement as a result in Fern Lake Company's increase in rates.

Water Service Corporation of Kentucky needs to provide rate case expense as of the date of the hearing.

The informal conference then adjourned.
