Dear Sir,

I would like to make my opposition to the proposed revenue increase (rate and fee hike) by Kentucky Utilities. I just looked at the bill I received today for 1393 kwhrs of electricity for a total charge of \$131.14. With the new rate and basic service charge considered, the new bill would be AT LEAST \$141.74, and that does not factor in the taxes charged. I just reviewed the oldest bill I have on file. In January of 2005 I used 1717 kwhrs of electricity for a total charge of \$91.52. What matters to the end user is the final amount of the bill. The new rate would have boiled down to an average rate of \$.1017 per kwhr. The bill from 2005 would boil down to \$.0533 per kwhr. This is nearly doubled. I think the rate hike is one too many and would like it to be rejected.

What I would like to see is giving the customer some control. Have a variable rate based on when the electricity is used; have a cheaper rate at low demand times and a higher rate at peak demand times. Surely leveling off the demand would be to the advantage of KU and the customer can make some choices. I can do laundry and some cooking at low demand / cheap times and avoid high power use during peak times. I have read something about *Residential Time of Day Energy Service* but have had no success at finding any details explaining this rate.

Can you provide any details on the RTOD service?

Once again, as a KU customer I want to register my opposition to the proposed rate hike and would like written confirmation of receipt of this letter. ( I have sent a copy of this letter to KU as well at: 220 West Main Street, P. O. Box 32010, Louisville, Kentucky 40232)
