AARP COMMENTS ON LG&E-KU RATE CASE Dockets 2016-00370-/2016-00371

April 18, 2017

On behalf of our 470,000 members in the Commonwealth, AARP Kentucky appreciates the opportunity to comment on the LG&E-KU rate cases.

Many of our members are on fixed and low incomes and already have trouble making ends meet. Accordingly, we have numerous concerns with the filing which would be especially hard on this group.

AARP recommendations are as follows:

- -There should be no increase to the monthly customer charge.
- -The plan to give every customer a new meter should be rejected.
- -The proposed rate increase is too high.

Kentucky Utilities should not be allowed to raise its fixed basic service charge for residential customers from \$10.75 per month to \$22 per month — a more than 100 percent increase.

As we have successfully argued in many other states, the customer charge should not be expanded beyond its traditional role of collecting metering and billing costs. Simply stated, other costs should not be shifted for recovery from the customer charge.

The proposed rate hike means that even if you turned off all the electric and natural gas appliances in your home, you would still owe KU \$22 per month independent of energy consumption.

Increasing the monthly service charge is unfair and disproportionately burdens low-income and older Kentuckians, many of whom are living on fixed incomes and struggling to pay for food, rent, medicine, and utility bills. This rate hike will make it impossible for low-income people to manage utility costs and will be an unnecessary burden to all families. Many of such customers are low use customers as well.

Increasing the fixed monthly charge to \$22 per month also discourages conservation and energy efficiency (because the per kwh and per therm rate is reduced).

The PSC should follow the lead of other state commissions including Oklahoma, Minnesota, and Arizona to name a few and keep the customer charge where it is so customers can continue to control their energy spending.

Real Possibilities

In addition to concerns about the hike in the monthly customer charge, AARP agrees with the Attorney General that the revenue increase is too high. (The AG proposes a reduction of \$142 million dollars of the \$210 million increase requested.)

AARP also agrees with the Kentucky Attorney General that LG&E/KU's proposal to install so-called smart meters should be rejected.

As the Attorney General points out, it would cost consumers \$350 million over 10 years without providing them any benefits. Customers already have a meter. LG&E/KU should continue their pilot test to see if customers want and can respond to a smart meter before being allowed to replace every customer's meter with a smart meter. Customers already have a meter. They do not need a new one.

We also thank the PSC for delaying the technical hearings due to the discovery of errors in the company's cost of service study. AARP has seen a nation-wide utility push to re-do rate design and cost allocation based on such studies which in general seemed designed to shift more costs to residential customers. Certainly parties should be allowed sufficient time to review the corrected materials from the utility.
