To Whom It May Concern:

I would like to speak to the proposed LG&E rate hike. As I understand it, the rate hike would not be based on actual usage, but instead would be an increase in the service charge.

I would like to voice my strong opposition to this proposed hike. I am almost 65 yrs old and am unable to work due to health reasons, and I literally have no income. I am on Section 8 and receive a utility check for which I am grateful, but it does not cover my monthly water and electric bills, so I'm already having to depend on Liheap and the local community ministry to help with my utility bills at least 2-3 times each year.

I try to keep my utilities as low as I possibly can, and it's the service charges that

are killing me. For example, before the water ever comes out of my tap, I already am being charged almost \$80.00 in service charges. (My actually water usage and drainage charges are only abt \$22.00).

If LG&E raise the service charge, it will place an even bigger burden on me to pay my utilities and keep them turned on. I currently live on less than \$170 per month, and I know what it means to go without, to be cold because I can't afford to turn the heat up, and to be so warm in the summer that I get sick because I can't afford to turn on the air-conditioning. I don't know how I would be able to compensate for this increase.

While LG&E might consider \$10.00-\$13.00 a month a "slight increase", to me it may as well be \$100.00. Even an \$8.00 increase would place a burden on my already precarious financial situation.

If I were in good financial shape I might not mind, but because this rate hike is based on service charges instead of actual usage, I believe it unduly affects people like me - a senior citizen on a very limited income - as well as disabled and other low-income individuals. It is far more difficult for those of us who are already vulnerable to come up with this extra money, than it would be for someone who is more financially able and might not miss those extra dollars.

For people like me, there are no "extra dollars". If LG&E wants a rate hike, then I believe it should be based on usage. I try to keep my usage low, and I do not think it is fair to ask me and those in a similar situation, to pay more when there are people who are less thrifty with their electricity and gas usage, and use so much more of both these utilities.

I realize that an agreement has been negotiated at the local level over the objections of people like myself and several non-profit agencies who advocate on behalf of the poor, elderly, and disabled. But the final decision to grant or deny this hike will be made by the KY PSC.

I am asking, literally begging, you to say, "NO." If rates need adjusting, let it be on usage, which is a far more fair and equitable and reasonable solution.
