I have patients who can't afford their medication because they have to pay their electric bill. The continued increases in rates for electricity is troubling and appalling. Kentucky power executives continue to take home millions of dollars in profit while people have to choose between food, water, clothing, medication, doctor visits, etc. I urge you to oppose any rate increase by Kentucky Power as they have continued to raise prices in the past few years that make it very difficult on the communities we are in. Please take a moment to consider this and what negative impact this

can have. 17% may not seem like a lot to some people. However; this is a significant increase for most everyone who has to deal with the bills.


