To the PSC:

I am not an accountant, but I did study economics and business. I also have over a decade of experience in the business world. And this Kentucky-American Water Company request for a Qualified Infrastructure Programs strikes me as quite odd.

The QIP sounds like it is designed to replace infrastructure items, what most businesses consider "capital goods." Form 2.0 in the application exhibits seems to confirm this, as the qualifying infrastructure is such items as hydrants and water mains. If this is to finance capital, that raises the very serious question about "double-dipping." KAWC and its parent company's capital expenditures qualify for an offsetting depreciation expenses to account for items that need to be replaced. As of June 30, 2016, the parent company claimed depreciation and amortization that amounted to \$250 million (http://pr.amwater.com/PressReleases/releasedetail.cfm?ReleaseID=1035784). Not only does this \$250 million corporate-wide expense reduce the company's taxable income, but this amount is added to its cash flow. Why? So that the company is encouraged to use this money to replace capital goods as they reach the end of their lives.

Now KAWC wants to add another fee to help it rebuild its infrastructure. If you award this fee, KAWC and its parent will pay less taxes and generate more cash...but never have to answer to what they are already doing with the half-BILLION annually they are getting from depreciation expenses. That money is supposed to be replacing capital goods, or "qualified infrastructure."

Sometimes companies have to make hard decisions; don't let KAWC avoid difficult choices and just plant another fee on the backs of helpless users.
