Commercial Propane Service LLC (CPS, LLC) supplies Propane gas service to approximately 60 customers in Old Bridge Subdivision in Danville, Kentucky

CPS, LLC acquired this business from AmeriGas who acquired it from Heritage Propane who acquired it from Brights Bottled Gas over the years

Evidently the rate structure currently used was established by the PSC as much as 30 years ago. The rate structure provides for a specified margin above the cost of propane to the supplier. The rate may be adjusted quarterly based on calculations which reflect the suppliers acquisition cost from the wholesale market.

CPS, LLC maintains that these rates are not sufficient to allow them to provide service to Old Bridge customers and to realize sufficient (or any) operating profit. I received my latest bill today and I am being billed \$183.45 for 4,030 cubic feet of gas which works out to \$1.642 per gallon.

I understand that this is well below the retail price of propane and, due to the small customer base, is not adequate to provide a fair rate of return for CPS, LLC.

It seems to me that our alternatives for us here in Old Bridge are to allow CPS, LLC to make a rate of return adequate to allow them to continue to provide service, or to be faced with an abandonment of service at some future date.

I therefore request that the PSC work with CPS, LLC to establish a fair and equitable rate structure both for the utility and the Old Bridge Customer base.

I further request that the PLS accomplish this task under the auspices of 807 KAR 5:076 which authorizes the Commission to direct Commission Staff to prepare a report containing its findings and recommendations regarding the rates contained in an application for for rate adjustment using alternative rate filing procedures filed under that regulation. I realize that the Commission decided earlier not to follow that procedure and <u>I hereby request that the Commission reconsider that decision</u>. This is a small "mom & pop utility" and the PSC should make this process as easy and painless as possible.

Given the reality of the situation and the fact that CPS, LLC is located some 55 miles from Old Bridge it seems to me that we here in Old Bridge should do everything in our power to reduce the expense associated with providing service to to our subdivision. For example we used to read our own meters and mail the results into Brights when they provided service. I think we should be willing to resume doing that if it would save CPS, LLC a trip or two per month to Danville.
