Dear Mr. Chairman:

I am an 81 year old widow who lives at 1802 Milburt Drive in Louisville's suburb of Lyndon. My husband and I had this house built in 1959. It is a brick house with a basement, 1200+ sq. ft. Over the years it has had replacement windows, added insulation and a new furnace in November, 2016. I keep the thermostat at 68 deg. at night and 70 deg. during the day. When I got my LG&E bill due 2/8/18, I nearly fainted. I was set to call the man who installed my furnace to make sure nothing was wrong there, no leaks or anything. Then my son told me his girlfriend, who is a struggling single mother, was in tears and panic mode because her bill was increased about on the same level as mine. Then I saw people on TV gasping about their bills, etc.

I am an old lady who keeps EVERYTHING. I got out my paper bills from 2013 on to the present to compare. I wrote the gas (ccf) usage for each month down in a notebook. I found the the highest readings were the one due 2/10/15 @ 156 ccf, one due 2/9/17 @ 150 ccf and this present one due 2/8/18 @ 271 ccf!!! All the rest were much less than 156 ccf. Last month the reading was 85 ccf. THIS MONTH WAS MORE THAN 3 TIMES LAST MONTH'S @ 271. That's not possible given the history of this house and the way I keep the thermostat. I called LG&E's customer service and spoke with a young lady who had pat answers of the ground being cold, temperatures down to 0, etc. That was for about a week. We had temps in the 40's, 50's and a 60 or two. That almost cancels out the very short cold snap we had. She said all they had to go on was the meter reading and that we could argue all day but it wouldn't change anything.

I normally add \$10 winter help to each check I write. I feel violated and hurt by this bill. I know some people at the top signed off on this form of added revenue for Jefferson County. I know and you know this is a bogus bill. There will be a lot of citizens who will have to borrow money, dip into their savings, or those on very tight budgets will not be able to pay it at all. If the company gets a \$100+ dollars from each citizen, they could build a new facility. I know they could always use more funds and I do appreciate all the work the workers do for us, especially during outages and things. But this is not fair. I will no longer add money to my check for winter help because I no longer trust the people at the top at LG&E or your commission to be fair in your business practices. I am a compassionate person who gives generously to God's work and the people services like The Healing Place, Food Bank, Salvation Army, etc. as I feel led. I am not a rich person, but I am blessed.

I doubt this letter will do any good, but I had to get this all off my chest to someone who matters as I have lost sleep and had blood pressure problems over this – not that I am alone.




