Informal Conference of May 18, 2018

Pursuant to an Order entered on May 9, 2018, an informal conference was conducted on May 18, 2018. The IC was held at the request of Kentucky Utilities, Inc. ("KU") to discuss procedural matters related to the upcoming hearing in this matter. A copy of the attendance roster is attached hereto.

KU provided an overview of the proposed project and amendment to its Environmental Compliance Plan and provided Commission staff with the attached PowerPoint summarizing information in the record of this matter. Commission Staff inquired about the Main Ash Pond Closure Plan referenced in the Division of Waste Management permit, and KU indicated it would file the referenced document into the record.

KU and Commission Staff discussed the procedures that might be followed at the hearing and which witnesses, if any, KU might be required to produce at the hearing. KU posed options should the Commission decide it did not need to conduct a formal hearing, including the option for KU to present a panel discussion of the proposed project that is similar to a fuel adjustment clause hearing. Staff will discuss with the Commissioners and respond to KU at a future date.



Application January 26, 2018

- Request for Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CPCN") for:
 - (1) construction of an amended Phase II of the landfill at the E.W. Brown Generating Station ("Brown" or "Brown Station") and
 - (2) capping and closing of any remaining surface area of the Brown Main Ash Pond.
- Approval of the amendment to Project 36 in KU's 2016 ECR Plan for recovery through the ECR mechanism
- Approval of modifications to ES Form 2.01



Status of Proceeding

- Application and Testimony filed on January 26, 2018
- No Intervention from any other party
- Two rounds of discovery from the Commission have occurred
- Hearing is scheduled for June 21, 2018



Background of Brown Main Ash Pond

- In KU's 2009 ECR Plan, the KPSC approved Project 29 for the Brown Main Ash Pond Expansion.
- In KU's 2011 ECR Plan, the KPSC approved an amendment to Project 29 to allow for the conversion of the Brown Main Ash Pond to a Dry Landfill (Phase I only).
- In KU's 2016 ECR Plan, KPSC approved construction of Phase II of the Brown landfill as Project 36.
- Construction of Phase II was delayed as KU continued to evaluate long-term generation needs. CPCN authority for Phase II of the Brown landfill expired in August 2017.




Background of Brown Main Ash Pond

- Due to the decision to retire Brown Units 1 and 2 and decreased CCR production from the Brown generating units, KU is proposing to amend Project 36.
- Amendment to Project 36
 - Constructing smaller than originally approved Phase II Landfill
 - Capping and closing the remaining surface area of the Brown Main Ash Pond
- KU anticipates construction to commence in August 2018.



E.W. Brown Generation Station Aerial






E.W. Brown Landfill - Engineering Plan View

- approving the proposed environmental surcharge tariff effective for bills rendered on and after August 30, 2018;
- approving the recovery of the requested overall rate of return; and
- approving the modification of ES Form 2.01.
