You have no obligation to meet the utilities request. The KY Public Service Commission must allow public interest groups to intervene in this case Stop acting in favor of the monopoly utilities.

On top of that the LG&E and KU's proposed rate increase is bad for consumers, harmful to people on low and fixed incomes, and damaging to energy efficiency and rooftop solar.

Shifting more of the monthly bill to the fixed monthly service fee is also a deliberate strategy by utilities to discourage customers from conserving energy or investing in rooftop solar. We must find better business models that allow the utilities to survive but don't get in the way of where energy needs to go in the future.

These models are out there, other states are starting to implement them. Let's not get left behind the rest of the country.

If the Kentucky Public Service Commission wants to open an administrative case to determine a fair "Value of Solar," you should do so. That would allow for a broad range of stakeholders to intervene, a full and fair hearing of evidence, and a careful consideration of the costs and benefits of distributed renewable generation to the grid and

non-participating customers. But you should not allow yourselves or this rate case to be used by monopoly utilities to justify their claims without consideration of evidence or an open process.

I am writing to object to the many changes being proposed by KU. I am a 50 year customer and have always championed KU as being a fair dispenser of utilities. But these changes will be very hurtful to many people who can least afford them. I am currently championing a 65 year old, single lady with chronic illness and doctor's bills who is living on a disability check of \$680 per month. With rent at \$550, she absolutely cannot afford any more utility increase. We are currently helping her by subsidizing her larder with free food from our church (when it is available), but with an electric bill of \$150, she cannot afford any more. Please think about people like this when you consider raising residential rates and lowering corporate rates.

So I object to the proposed changes in rate structures, increase in the basic service charge, lower rates for commercial accounts, and removing community groups from the review process (especially removing that voice from the discussions)

. All of these changes discourage energy savings, discourage

roof-top solar, and kill small businesses and jobs in solar and energy efficiency. Limiting the scope of participants in the PSC hearings does not allow for adequate representation of important groups of stakeholders.
