Boss buzzing you after hours? NYC might let you say buzz of

NEW YORK — Technology that once promised freedom from the confines of an office has, for many workers, become a ball and chain, blurring the lines between work hours and, well, any other hours. A New York City Council member wants to put a stop to that.

The proposal would bar employers from requiring employees to respond to non-emergency emails, texts and other digital communications outside regular work hours. It would also outlaw retaliating against workers who choose to unplug.

The recently introduced legislation is only in the beginning stages, with initial committee hearings expected sometime in June, and doubters wonder how it could work, especially in always-buzzing New York City.

But bill sponsor Rafael Espinal, a Democrat who represents parts of Brooklyn, said the legislation is needed because the city that never sleeps isn't supposed to be the city that never stops working.

"Work has spilled into our personal lives," he said. "We're always connected to our phones or to a computer once we leave the office."

It's important, he said, for people to be "able to draw a clear line between the workplace and their personal lives, to give them time to connect with their family, friends, reduce their stress levels, and be able to go back to work and perform at their optimal level."

The legislation would cover private companies with more than 10 employees. There would be exemptions for certain types of jobs that require people to be on call. Barring emergencies, bosses wouldn't be able to demand that workers check work emails or messages in of hours.

Companies that violated the rule would face fines of at least \$250 per incident.

Espinal said he was inspired by a French law that took effect this year that gave employees the right to ignore off-hour communications.

Employers who wanted to return a communication could do so.

"If you love your job, and you love what you're doing, I highly doubt that you will stop working," Espinal said.

The bill would be intended to make life better for people like Arlene Pitterson, a marketing and event planning consultant in Brooklyn, who recalled one boss routinely pestering her with late-night emails and then getting upset when she didn't reply.

It was among the conditions that led her to working for herself, and she now sets her own boundaries about when she'll respond to people.

"The fact that we have to get to a point where we

have a law about it is unfortunate, but it's necessary," said Pitterson, 40.

"Technology has allowed us to work from anywhere at any time," she said. "It's now about being able to control the instruments so that we can still have a life."

The reality, though, is that the world has become a 24/7 place, and adhering to a policy like the one Espinal is proposing would be detrimental to a company's competitiveness, said labor lawyer Louis DiLorenzo of Bond, Schoeneck & King, who has spent years representing management and employers.

"The problems are going to be tremendous," DiLorenzo said. "I just don't think you can legislate against progress."

He also questioned how it would be enforced and how an emergency would be defined.

"I can't think of a business that we represent that there aren't times where a lot of people wouldn't think of them as emergencies, but the client does," he said. David Weinman, president of Fabbco Shoes, a chain of more than 40 stores in New York City and New Jersey that employs 190 people, sees the proposal as government overreach.

"I think the city needs to get out of everyone's hair," said Weinman. "Regulations are great when they don't make everything you do more complicated."

He said he sends emails to employees on their days or outside of work hours, but usually to make sure he doesn't forget to send it at a later time, and he's not looking for responses when they're not working.

"I don't know anyone who retaliates against employees because they don't answer emails," he said.

their populations. (In fairness, the Apostle Paul was an advocate for celibacy as well, although he allowed that if people "can't control themselves, they should get married because it's better to marry than to burn with passion." Paul himself didn't get married.)

Koresh Teed, although already a father himself, urged celibacy as well.

Years passed. Teed burned with passion to build a vast city of believers, whom he called Koreshans. (He referred to his overall belief system as Koreshanity.) He and a handful of core followers found their way to a site in modern-day Lee County, Florida, some miles south of Fort Myers.

There, they established the colony known

as the Koreshan Unity at the village called Estero.

Teed envisioned that his New Jerusalem would grow to a population of 10 million. It fell somewhat short of that, peaking at about 250 people in the very early 1900s.

But you have to hand it to the Koreshans: They overcame what would seem to be natural disadvantages.

For one, to join the sect and the community, believers had to surrender all of their possessions.

This was, before the term was fashionably disdained, a communist society. You joined, you turned everything over to the group and you worked, for which you were assured a lifetime of bed and board in the dormitories of the communi-

ty.

This turned out to be appealing to a certain segment of late-19th century America: Civil War widows and their children, who comprised approximately three-fourths of the population of the Koreshan Unity in southwestern Florida, according to our guide. Dr. Teed's small society provided a safety net for some families of dead soldiers.

The Koreshans found themselves in a political dispute with fellow Lee County natives that turned violent one day in 1906 and Teed suffered a beating from which he never quite recovered. He died two unhappy years later.

Among other things, Teed believed in reincarnation, and his followers

kept his corpse around for a few days, awaiting resurrection. When none emerged, and a persnickety public health physician from Fort Myers demanded burial of the decaying body, Teed's remains were taken out to Estero Island for entombment.

Two years after that, his tomb was washed out to sea by a hurricane, and Teed was not seen again, resurrected or otherwise.

But hand it to the Koreshans. They were industrious.

They established and staffed a bakery that baked enough bread to serve their own needs and sell to others.

They operated a concrete works, boat works, sawmill and an electric generation plant. The Ko-

reshans manned two machine shops and a printing plant that produced a newspaper, *The Flaming Sword*.

They created sunken gardens and raised mounds, and raised exotic plants.

Their general store was for years the only one between Fort Myers and Naples on what became the Tamiami Trail.

And not only did any aging society of believers manage to survive for decades in the hurricane-swept subtropical palmetto scrub of Southwest Florida, but their community was one that ofered education and culture, both for themselves and their neighbors.

Remarkable for its time, the settlement for years was a matriarchal

society, managed for years by a group known as The Seven Sisters who lived in separate bedrooms in a building called The Planetary Court.

The final leader of the society — Hedwig Michel, a Jewish woman who fled Nazi Germany — oversaw the transfer of 305 acres to the state of Florida, which now operates the site as the Koreshan State Park, providing guided tours of what is left of the Koreshan Unity.

Whether it exists on the exterior of Earth — or on the interior shell — remains a matter of interpretation.
