COMMISSION STAFF'S THIRD REQUEST FOR INFORMATION
TO KENTUCKY POWER COMPANY

Kentucky Power Company (Kentucky Power), pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, is to file with the Commission an electronic version of the following information. The information requested herein is due within seven days of the date of this request. The Commission directs Kentucky Power to the Commission's March 16, 2020 and March 24, 2020 Orders in Case No. 2020-00085¹ regarding filings with the Commission. The Commission expects the original documents to be filed with the Commission within 30 days of the lifting of the current state of emergency. All responses in paper medium shall be appropriately bound, tabbed, and indexed. Electronic documents shall be in portable document format (PDF), shall be searchable, and shall be appropriately bookmarked.

Each response shall include the name of the witness responsible for responding to the questions related to the information provided. Each response shall be answered under oath or, for representatives of a public or private corporation or a partnership or association or a governmental agency, be accompanied by a signed certification of the

preparer or the person supervising the preparation of the response on behalf of the entity that the response is true and accurate to the best of that person's knowledge, information, and belief formed after a reasonable inquiry.

Kentucky Power shall make timely amendment to any prior response if it obtains information that indicates the response was incorrect when made or, though correct when made, is now incorrect in any material respect. For any request to which Kentucky Power fails or refuses to furnish all or part of the requested information, it shall provide a written explanation of the specific grounds for its failure to completely and precisely respond.

Careful attention shall be given to copied material to ensure that it is legible. When the requested information has been previously provided in this proceeding in the requested format, reference may be made to the specific location of that information in responding to this request. When applicable, the requested information shall be separately provided for total company operations and jurisdictional operations. When filing a paper containing personal information, Kentucky Power shall, in accordance with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 4(10), encrypt or redact the paper so that personal information cannot be read.

On August 31, 2020, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued the prepublication final Steam Electric Power Generating Effluent Guidelines and Standards (40 CFR Part 423) (Steam Electric Reconsideration Rule).² In 2015, the EPA promulgated a regulation that established effluent limitations guidelines and pretreatment standards (ELG) for wastewater discharges into surface waters and wastewater treatment

plants for steam electric power plants. The Steam Electric Reconsideration Rule revises ELG limits for existing facilities and establishes new compliance dates, among other things.

a. Explain whether the Steam Electric Reconsideration Rule will materially change or impact the analyses, forecasts, or conclusions in Kentucky Power's 2019 Integrated Resource Plan (IRP).

b. If there is a material change or impact to the analyses, forecasts, or conclusions in Kentucky Power's 2019 IRP, explain what decisions must be made regarding the material change to the IRP and when decisions underlying the changes will be made, including but not limited to, filing compliance plans related to the material changes.
