Kentucky RSA #3 Cellular General Partnership ("Kentucky RSA #3"), through counsel, pursuant to KRS 278.020 and 278.040, hereby submits this application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to construct a cell site to be known as the Wax cell site in and for rural service area ("RSA") #3 of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, namely the counties of Allen, Breckinridge, Butler, Edmonson, Grayson, Hancock, Logan, McLean, Meade, Muhlenberg, Ohio, Simpson, Todd and Warren, Kentucky.

Pursuant to the FCC Order, Docket No. 08-165, dated November 18, 2009, ¶ 32, pp. 11 & 12, the Commission has 150 days to process this application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to construct a cell tower facility.
