

7	Response) Based on the unspent annual weatherization funding mentioned in Big
8	Rivers' response to Item 2, and Big Rivers' discussions with Community Action
9	Agency ("CAA") staff, the limitation on additional weatherization is available housing
10	stock, <u>not</u> federal funding for weatherization measures. Big Rivers' proposal to
11	provide additional funding to overcome health and safety deferments would expand
12	the available housing stock. Without this expansion in the available housing stock
13	federal weatherization funds would be left unspent.

9	Response) The four CAAs in Big Rivers' service area all expressed the opinion that
10	spending \$150 on health and safety measures would move no deferred projects
11	forward, i.e., allow the project to be considered for weatherization; therefore, no
12	spending would occur on additional weatherization measures for which federal
13	funding is readily available.
