RESPONSE OF BIG RIVERS ELECTRIC CORPORATION TO PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 5(2), Big Rivers Electric Corporation ("Big Rivers") submits this Response to the proposed procedural schedule submitted by the City of Henderson, Kentucky and the Henderson Utility Commission, d/b/a Henderson Municipal Power & Light (collectively, "Henderson") on March 13, 2020.¹ Given that Commission Staff's Memorandum summarizing the March 5, 2020 Informal Conference did not outline Big Rivers' proposed procedural schedule, to which Henderson has now responded, it is necessary for Big Rivers to formally outline its proposal for the Commission.

As Big Rivers explained at the Informal Conference, several reasons support the expeditious resolution of this matter. Most critically, Big Rivers must begin remediating the asbestos associated with Station Two's operations as soon as possible in order to mitigate safety and health hazards to its employees and to citizens living or working nearby. Additionally, timely resolution of this matter will allow for the sale of the degrading Station Two equipment that is no longer being used, thus maximizing the value of that equipment by selling during a period of higher demand and helping to minimize decommissioning costs.

¹ While not formally styled as a Motion pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 5(1), Big Rivers has decided to treat the March 13, 2020 as such since it contains requested relief from the Commission.

Certainty regarding the issues raised in this proceeding will allow Big Rivers to complete the Station Two ash pond closure within a five-year period, as the Company is required to do by law. Finally, because multiple civil lawsuits involving the Station Two Contracts are currently pending, including a Henderson Circuit Court Action (No. 19-CI-00504) which involves issues being addressed here, timely Commission resolution will give the courts guidance as primary jurisdiction over the rate agreements rests with the Commission.

The elongated procedural schedule proposed by Henderson would run counter to these purposes. It would also be unreasonable in light of the fact that this case has been pending since July 31, 2019. Finally, a drawn-out procedural schedule is unnecessary because the methodology to calculate Excess Henderson Energy, which is the starting point for many of the other calculations in this case, was decided by the Commission more than two years ago (Case No. 2016-00278, Order January 5, 2018). Accordingly, Big Rivers submits the following alternative schedule:

- Intervention Deadline: 5 days after Commission order establishing procedural schedule
- Data Requests to Big Rivers 7 days after intervention deadline
- Big Rivers' Responses to Data Requests no longer than 14 days after Data Requests filed
- Intervenor Testimony Deadline 14 days after Big Rivers' Responses to Data Requests filed
- Data Requests to Intervenors no longer than **7 days** after Intervenor Testimony filed
- Intervenor Responses to Data Requests 14 days after Data Requests filed
- Big Rivers' Rebuttal Testimony no longer than 14 days after Intervenor Responses to Data Requests filed
- Hearing 14 days after Rebuttal Testimony filed

WHEREFORE, Big Rivers respectfully requests that the Commission adopt the Company's proposed schedule.
