ALLEGED VIOLATION OF UNDERGROUND FACILITY DAMAGE PREVENTION ACT CASE NO. 2019-00332

ORDER

Pursuant to KRS 278.495(2), the Kentucky Public Service Commission (Commission) has jurisdiction to regulate the safety of natural gas facilities in Kentucky and to enforce minimum federal pipeline safety standards. Under the Kentucky Underground Facility Damage Prevention Act (Act), KRS 367.4901 through KRS 367.4917, the Commission has authority to investigate and assess civil penalties for any violation of the Act that results in excavation damage to an underground facility used to transport natural gas or hazardous liquid subject to federal pipeline safety laws, 49 U.S.C. § 60101, *et seq.* Any person who violates any provision of the Act is subject to assessment of a civil penalty in the amount of \$250 for the first offense, no more than \$1,000 for the second offense within one year, and no more than \$3,000 for the third and any subsequent offense. Additionally, any person whose violation of the Act results in damage to an underground facility containing any flammable, toxic, corrosive, or hazardous material or results in the release of any flammable, toxic, corrosive, or hazardous material is subject to an additional penalty of up to \$1,000.

Following receipt of a report of excavation damage to its underground gas pipeline from an operator, Commission Staff (Staff) conducted an investigation and prepared an Incident Report, a copy of which is attached to this Order as an Appendix. In its Incident Report, Staff cites B & C Construction, LLC (B & C), for violation of the following provision of the Act:

> KRS 367.4911(1)(a) – Each excavator, or person responsible for an excavation, planning excavation or demolition work shall, not less than two (2) full working days nor more than ten (10) full working days prior to commencing work, notify each affected operator of the excavator's intended work and work schedule. Contacting the applicable protection notification centers shall satisfy this requirement.

Based on its review of the Incident Report and being otherwise sufficiently advised,

the Commission finds *prima facie* evidence that B & C violated the Underground Facility Damage Prevention Act. The Commission further finds that a formal investigation into the excavation damage incident should be conducted.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. B & C shall submit to the Commission a written response to the allegations

contained in the Staff Incident Report on or before October 21, 2019.

2. B & C shall appear on November 22, 2019, at 9 a.m., Eastern Standard Time, in Hearing Room 1 of the Commission's offices at 211 Sower Boulevard in Frankfort, Kentucky, for the purpose of presenting evidence concerning the alleged violation of the Underground Facility Damage Prevention Act, and showing cause why it should not be subject to the penalties prescribed in KRS 367.4917(1) and (4) for this alleged violation.

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3. A person shall not file a paper or appear at a hearing on behalf of, or otherwise represent, a partnership, corporation, or business entity (including a limited liability company) or other person unless the person is an attorney licensed to practice law in Kentucky.

4. The November 22, 2019 hearing shall be recorded by videotape only.

5. The Staff Incident Report in the Appendix to this Order is made a part of the record in this case.

6. This Order shall be served upon B & C by the Barren County Sheriff through: Registered Agent, Ryan Brooking, at 5053 Old Lexington Road, Cave City, Kentucky 42127, and Member, Jason Christy, at 413 North 2nd Street, Cave City, Kentucky 42127, and 113 Dugantown Estate, Glasgow, Kentucky 42141.

On 07/10/19 K&O Solutions' Macy Grubbs (270-498-5310) was contacted and stated that B&C Construction, Jason Christy (270-799-9937), was the contract company conducting the work for K&O Solution and no excavation was conducted by K&O Solution.

On 07/10/19 the Excavator, B&C Construction's Jason Christy, stated that no call to 811 was made by B&C Construction. Mr. Christy was receptive to attending the Damage Prevention course and paying the \$250.00 penalty.
