I request that the PSC grant a hearing for the public pertaining to Case no. 2019-00389.

Because:

- ① The Rockport (UPA) agreement was approved without protecting the rights of Ky. power customers from unfair charges, expense, and unfair practices.
- ② AEP, Ky. power, Indiana - Michigan power wrote the Rockport (UPA) agreement to cover both Unit 1 producing 1300 MW and Unit 2 producing 1300 MW to benefit themselves (AEP) not to protect the Ky. Power Customers. This way Ky. Power Customers would have to help maintain both units at Rockport.

- ③ one unit at Rockport such as unit 1 producing 1300 MW will more than meet the 393 (UPA) agreement. Why should Ky. power customers be forced to maintain both units 1 and units 2 at Rockport.
- ④ PSC granted \$3,903,065 for selective Catalytic Reduction technology for unit 1 at last rate increase in case 2017-00179. To grant \$11,877,340 for selective Catalytic Reduction system for unit 2 would be unfair to the Ky power customer.
- ⑤ Ky. Power company does not own Rockport power plant. Michigan-Indiana power receives \$5,000,000 a year lease payment for Rockport.
