The reason for my email is to protest the rate hike that LG&E has filed with the KY PSC. If I understand the facts, the reason they are requesting the rate hike is to install a system for reading meters remotely. The rate hike is to offset the cost of equipment and installation of the equipment.

My thinking is by doing this remotely with electronic equipment there should be a reduction in manpower requirements thus lowering their payroll and other benefits cost the company is currently paying and those savings should offset the cost of the equipment and installation.

If the equipment and installation doesn't save them money, then why would or should they bother with the remote meter reading.

Seems to me what was once a private utility and now a publicly traded company is double dipping into the customers pocket by asking the customer to pay for their new system to read the meters, allowing them to layoff the meter readers currently employed.

I'm in the insurance business so I can't relate this to another industry so I'm going to draw a comparison to my industry. My office needs a new computer system office management software and computers to make our office more efficient. Our insurance agency buys or leases computer hardware and software in order to achieve this new efficiency. By purchasing the new equipment that uploads insurance applications

electronically to the insurance companies I represent and the insurance company downloads the policy and its data, billing data and commission data back to our computerized management system. By doing business this way I have eliminated 2 people from our office staff and that reduction in staff covers the cost of the new office management system. Simple as that.

Why is LG&E any different.

I'd like to add my voice to those opposing the proposed rate increases by LGE-KU. A rate increase of nearly 12% seems inordinate, far outpacing wage growth or inflation, not to mention the difficulty many already have financially due to COVID. To compound this, they've asked for \$41.6 million in taxpayer money to cover the increase for year 1, and then in perpetuity residential customers will face increases of roughly \$10 to \$50 *a month* depending on time of year and level of use. Utilities are an essential public service, rates need to be kept as low as is reasonable for LGE-KU to provide adequate services, and a rate spike of this magnitude is a large jump. If it guaranteed rate stability for the next 8-12 years that might be another matter, but more likely it will simply create a new baseline for future rate increases as well.

It seems rate growth could be tied more equitably to median wage growth, or something similar, but that is perhaps not immediately at issue here.

I am writing to object in the loudest voice possible to LG&E's rate increase proposal.

LG&E has minimized the degree of its proposed increases for electricity and gas. It puts out info that it is proposing an 11.8% increase for electricity and a 9.37% increase for gas, but when you look at the actual rates, the increase is much later.

The proposed electricity rate of 52 cents a day to replace the current 45 cents a day rate **is a 15.6% increase.** The proposed gas rate of 78 cents a day to replace the current 65 cents a day **is a 20% increase.**

Even the announced increase, let alone the real increase, is beyond what people can handle in light of all the COVID hardships. The majority of people have no job, there are long lines at the food pantries, the school system ran out of food for needy students half way through the first day of the school break! The virus is circulating widely, only a small percentage of the population is eligible to receive the vaccine right now, the vaccine supply is limited, it will not be available to most people until close to the end of 2021 or even into 2022, a new, more contagious variant is likely to catch hold in the U.S.... and LG&E wants to increase its rates in the midst of this???

How cruel!

What does LG&E need the rate increase for? To build more solar farms (for which there is no evidence of need, if it weren't trying to eliminate the competition from those who are generating roof-top solar and feeding it back into the grid). I think you get the picture here -- a manufactured need. To put an electronic meter at every location to eliminate the expense of meter readers and other personnel, which will put more people out of a job? Again, a manufactured need. These so-called structural improvements ought not be financed now on the backs of hurting people.

And what return on investment does this proposal say it needs to deliver to its investors? 5%? 10% 15% I say that LG&E needs to deliver some compassion for all those who are suffering, yet have a basic need for electricity and gas in order to stay alive and healthy. And that means holding off on a rate increase now.

I sincerely hope that the members of the PSC will see beyond LG&E's greed for more in the face of the misfortune of those who day by day have less and less.

Dear PSC Officials:

This memo is to inform you that I vehemently oppose LG&E's electric and gas proposed increases, as outlined in Case# 2020-00350. In the document provided by LG&E, titled "Customer Notice of Rate Adjustment", LG&E proposed to raise the Basic Service Charge Per Day by 15.6%, and the Energy Charge per kwh by 13.0%, for an overall total Residential Service rate (RATE RS) increase of 40.41%. This amount of increase will crimple not only my family, but also thousands of other families who are dealing with Covid job losses, Covid reductions in pay to employees, by their employers, and in general, other family-related financial responsibilities like health insurance, car insurance, and the recent huge increase of prices for food at home from local grocers. I mean, it has become a real struggle, again, for thousands of families over the last year, and yet, LG&E is proposing such a massive rate increase.

On the Residential Gas Service rate service (Rate RGS), the Basic Service Charge proposed increase is 20%, and the charge per 100 cubic feet (ccf) of gas is 15.8%. The total increase for the Rate RGS is 45.17%. Again, a crimpling number for many families.

Overall, between the Residential Service for electric, Rate RS, and the Residential Gas Service for gas, Rate RGS, the total combined proposed increase is 85.58%. I honestly don't know how the Public Service Commission can allow for such an increase. This type of increase will put hundreds of families, who are currently on the edge of the Federal poverty line, over it, thereby putting more and more families on income assistance.

Even worse, is that in LG&E's "Other Charges" section, Electric Tariff sub-section, of the Rate Adjustment notice, LG&E wants to increase, by 14.3%, the Disconnect/Reconnect Service W/O Remote Switch fee. This increase will further bury, financially, those who have had their electric service turned off due to the inability to pay.

In sum, LG&E's cost, per kwh, is already above average when compared to the U.S. City Average category of data analytics sources from the U.S Department of Labor's Consumer Price Index report. On my December 2020 LG&E bill, I paid 18.8 cents per kwh. The U.S. City Average data, from 1978 to November 2020, shows the average cost, per kwh (including all fees, tariffs, and surcharges), across the U.S., is 9.7 cents per kwh. What's more is that the 3-year U.S. City Average cost is 13.5 cents per kwh, the 5-year average cost is 13.4 cents, and the 10-year average cost is 13.2 cents per kwh. Again, I paid 18.6 cents per kwh on my last bill. That's a huge difference. LG&E's natural gas proposed price increases paint a similar picture. I'll spare you the data to keep this memo short, but the above average prices LG&E is charging for natural gas is similar. On my last bill, the cost I paid for natural gas was \$2.16 per ccf.

I get it that LG&E is working harder to move their business revenue model to fee-based, versus usage-based, in order to secure and forecast a more consistent, and ever increasing, revenue stream year to year, but that model does nothing but constantly raise out of pocket energy costs for families, and de-emphasizes any focus on saving energy. LG&E bills are becoming all fee-based, instead of usage-based. That's great for LG&E, but financially crippling for Kentucky families.
