ORDER

On April 16, 2020, Kentucky Power Company, pursuant to the procedures established in this docket, requested a one-month extension of time, from May 1, 2020, until June 1, 2020, in which to file its reliability report required by the Commission's April 1, 2014 Order in Case No. 2011-00450.¹ As grounds for its motion, Kentucky Power states that Executive Order 2020-215 and subsequent executive orders have limited the ability of Kentucky Power's personnel necessary to compile the reliability report in a timely fashion in order to file it with the Commission by May 1, 2020. Kentucky Power also states that many of the same personnel are providing support for service restoration efforts associated with outages caused on April 12, 2020, by several severe storms. The storms left more than 62,000 Kentucky Power customers without power. As of the filing of Kentucky Power's motion, approximately 15,000 customers have not had service restored. Kentucky Power asserts that the extension will allow Kentucky Power the necessary time to compile and complete the report.

The Commission finds that Kentucky Power's motion for an extension of time should be granted. Granting the motion will allow Kentucky Power's personnel to focus

on restoration efforts and provide adequate time for preparing and filing the reliability report.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Kentucky Power's motion for an extension of time in which to file its reliability report is granted.

2. Kentucky Power shall file its reliability report required by Case No. 2011-00450 no later than June 1, 2020.
