To whom it may concern;

I am writing in opposition to the proposal to have homeowners with solar to sell their excess power at wholesale rates and buy it back at retail rates.

I currently have solar on my home, and while these new rates would not affect me for 25 years, I am concerned for new customers that the proposal is extremely unfair, and that it will discourage solar energy installations in Kentucky that are needed to control global warming and the creation and retention of much needed jobs.

Before I had solar installed on my home, I paid \$832.91 for electricity for my home the previous year. Last year I generated all the electricity I used, but I still paid a total of \$206.64 for connection fees. That means I am still paying 25% of what I previously paid for all my electric for being connected to the grid and to help maintain it. I think this is fair. I do not think this harms the electric providers in any way other than the fact that they do not get to sell and make a profit on a very small portion of electricity that they would have normally sold me. This definitely does not harm any other customers that are attached to the grid. In fact, they are benefiting from my payment to help maintain the grid, as opposed to if I had a

battery system and was not connected to the grid at all.

I have just given you cost analysis for my home. Please require KPC to do a "cost-of-service study" to prove its claims against net-metering, before approving rate changes.

One other VERY IMPORTANT note: I am very concerned that power companies are being very short sighted and in fact are shooting themselves in the foot. If this new system is approved, new home solar installations will undoubtedly drop, due to not making as much financial sense to the homeowner. The homeowner will look into installing a battery system to compensate, but will likely decide that it is still too expensive. But beware!!! Battery prices have already been dropping fast, and will continue to do so. If you discourage customers from connecting to the grid for net metering, they will wait until prices for batteries drop until it makes financial sense to install a battery system instead, and not be connected to the grid at all. Battery prices WILL drop to this level sooner than you think. When this happens, customers may flock to this option in mass, and this could be devastating to the power grid, as those who cannot afford to make the investment in a solar installation will be the only ones connected to the grid and will be required to support it alone. The grid may become unsustainable in this scenario.
