To the Public Information Officer;

I am writing the Kentucky Public Service Commission to strongly support approval of Kenergy's waiver request in order to create Kenect as an internet service provider.

As a rural Daviess county resident, farmer, business owner, and full-time associate professor at Owensboro Community and Technical College; we have very limited access to reliable broadband internet service. Our current service provider **tries** to provide broadband service to us at a download speed of 6 Mb. On a good day, outside of peak usage times, we typically receive 4 to 5 Mb of download speed. During peak usage by other customers, we may only receive 1 to 2 Mb; which is wholly inadequate to work remotely from our residence, run our business, or instruct students online.

During the COVID-19 shutdown, when we were forced to complete the spring 2020 semester with

only online courses, many of our rural community college students were unable to faithfully attend “live” online sessions due to inadequate internet service. Many of those students were unable to complete their coursework and had to finish the course requirements during the summer term. Cellphone “hotspots” were also unreliable due to various circumstances; weather, distance to cell tower, interference, etc. This delayed many students graduating on time and entering the workforce.

Even before the COVID-19 crisis, rural Kentucky residents, farmers, businesses, and students were lagging behind our urban and suburban citizens with regard to internet service. We must have a minimum of 25 Mb of download speed in order to complete the tasks now required for farming, business, and education in our technology driven environment.

I strongly believe Kenergy, with its infrastructure, personnel, and experience, is uniquely positioned to provide this essential internet service to the rural customers in its (14) county service area.
