I am a resident of Russell County (KY) where the development and/or proposal of an industrial solar facility, case #2020-00226, is underway. I strongly believe that technologically challenging "public hearings" via Zoom are inadequate and do not address the community's questions or concerns regarding this project. The county government failed to provide adequate information regarding this meeting and no one was able to actually attend. Not everyone in Russell County has access to high-speed internet, much less, computers to attend a Zoom meeting.

Given that the COVID virus is on the decline as more residents become vaccinated and build immunity, I am requesting that our locally elected officials and/or Solar Company hold a well-advertised, in person meeting and/or town hall prior to consideration for approval. The residents of Russell County have been completely left in the dark regarding the decision about solar energy panels being installed on farm land. The two people appointed by Governor Beshear will not even answer questions or take calls regarding this case, Jeff Hoover and Gary Robertson.
